

A successful landing at Sparrows Bridge

VERY year we take it in turns to lead the monthly walk and this month it came round to Jean again.

Each year she has tried to take us over Sparrows Bridge but has been thwarted by the weather – not today.

Route: from the back of Wye Church across the fields to Wye Court Farm and onto Sparrows Bridge which crosses the Great Stour and leads to a footpath across the railway.


After safely crossing the railway we crossed a field where we had to negotiate a tractor spreading fertiliser! After crossing a small tributary of the Stour we came to the site of an airfield used during the First World War. Opened in 1916 as a training base for the Royal Flying Corps, the No 20 Reserve Squadron moved there from Dover and were later joined by No 51 and No 66 Reserve Squadrons, mainly flying biplanes – Avro 504 and RE 8s.

Training carried on after the war until 1919 when the land was returned to agricultural use.

We then returned to the village via Bramble Lane, admiring the pretty houses in Havillands and noticing the rather plain new ones on the site next to Pointers.

Jean treated us to her delicious scones and cake with that all important cup of tea.

Hastingleigh Parish Council

THE Clerk had been in contact with the landscape gardener who will be undertaking the maintenance of the pond.

Unfortunately, due to the vegetation having been cut back by a parishioner, the maintenance is unable to be undertaken until the vegetation has grown back sufficiently for the aquatic friendly weed killer to be effective.

The whole project is, therefore, on hold until the spring when the spraying, digging out and laying to seed can be completed.

- Cllr Gardener is to look into duckweed removal.
- Cllr Gardener is to fit a turn screw to the village notice-board.
- The Clerk had circulated all correspondence.
- The Councillors had been circulated with information about registering assets of community value.
- An articulated lorry had driven down Tamley Lane earlier in the week.
- What would happen to the telephone box now that the telephone has been removed? The Clerk will contact BT to ask.

- The Clerk was asked to communicate with Elmsted Parish Council to ask if they would be prepared to take on the maintenance of the war memorial on alternative years.
- The next meeting will be held on Tuesday November 14th 2017.

THE replacement noticeboard in Bodsham has been erected The District Councillors have offered to pay for this.

The car park upgrade at the Village Hall has been completed. Cllr Carey suggested that the Village Hall could use some sensor lights for when the hall is in darkness, Cllr Carey offered to assist with this project financially.

Planning Applications - The Parish Council discussed 2 Planning applications:

Y17/1030 – new vehicular access at Evington Park, other comments had been received with regard to the visibility and the archaeological nature of this site.

Cllr Burge is to respond on behalf of the Council accordingly.

Y17/1018 – Car barn at Orchard Cottage, the Parish Council has no objections to raise regarding this application.

District/City Councillors - Cllr Carey reported that because of the planned Garden Town at Otterpool, Shepway is one of the only areas in Kent that do not have to find additional land for building on.

The Government has a "Housing infrastructure fund". Shepway has applied to this fund for a grant of £250million towards the infrastructure at Otterpool, meaning the surgeries and schools etc could be built ahead of the housing. The Government is after 10 projects over the country as a whole. Traffic notices have now been made for the 50mph restriction on Stone Street to enable turning in to Thorn Lane and Curtis lane.

Over 50% of residents' Council Tax is spent on Social Services, this is an increase of over 15% in

just over a decade. The number of elderly people in Kent is due to increase further in the future.

The health service and County Council are both under pressure because of this and are working towards establishing a transfer of care package to enable the hospital patients to return home as soon as they are able.

Cllr Carey suggested that potholes need to be reported as the number of problems reported is data that is used when prioritising work.

If pot holes are reported, white -lined and not filled then contact Pauline Rockett with the report number.

The next meeting is on December 14th at 7.30pm.

More pews news

THE following has been prompted by *History*Enthusiast's column concerning the installation of pews in Elmsted

Church (September Issue). You may wish to include the following in the next issue.

Church records reveal that the present pews were installed in 1877 as part of the major restoration of St James' Elmsted to replace the box pews.

Guttering was also included; indeed a great deal more was done, and the congregation worshipped in

the school room at Bodsham until completion. It was a re-ordering of the furnishings as well as vital repairs, the former influenced by the 19th Catholic Revival of the Victorian era.

St James the Great, giving it its full title, was reopened for worship on Friday 31st May 1878 by the Bishop of Dover.

The estimated cost of the restoration was £1,236. A more detailed report of the work is in Elmsted's Church Guide.







Memories of Dolly's penny post

T was a chance remark by Jennie Denny of High Lodge (formerly Helchin) in Elmsted that started things off. She recalled the late Harry Archer of Elmsted saying that his wife Dorothy when a child, used to collect pennies from people wanting to pass through the gate at Helchin which she opened and closed.

Dorothy Archer nee Lucas was born in 1908 and from the 1911 census lived at Helchin with her father Alfred. So this dates her experiences from about 1914 onwards.

The 1840 tithe map shows a proper road from Elmsted church ending at Helchin. Thereafter the map just shows a dotted line down to Evington crossroads.

The OS map of 1907 still shows no proper road down to the cross-roads but the 1930 map does.

Yvonne Helmer of Hastingleigh confirms her mother Dorothy Archer was known as a child as "Dolly" Lucas. And she did collect pennies from people wishing to travel down the hill from Elchin Lodge to Evington.

There was a gate across the road below the house and she re-

ferred to it as a "toll gate". At that time the hill was known as Elchin Hill, the house was Elchin Lodge and the nearby wood was known as Elchin Wood. This is marked on the 1916 Estate Map.

This map also shows the route down to Evington as a proper road passing through high banks around the sharp bend. After discussing this with John Argar of Elmsted, he says that there were quite a few gated roads in those days, not necessarily toll gates or toll roads.

He remembered one in Maxted Street. It was just on the north side of Upper Maxted Street Farm and the gate post was on the corner of its garden.

If a child was to open the gate for a pony and trap and then close it again then he or she would most likely be given a coin. The gates were there so that livestock could be prevented from straying too far.

He didn't have any knowledge of a toll gate [at Helchin] but that's not to say there wasn't one, so Yvonne is probably right.

Until 1909 the Honywood family owned the land surrounding Helchin down to their home at Evington and beyond.

Enquiries were made with Sir Filmer Honywood. He has intimate knowledge of Elmsted from his father's recollections and is also keeper of his family's records.

For personal attention And free estimates (01227) 709376 (07973) 480241 remember seeing white painted fencing on either side of the western end of the road from Hastingleigh close to the old Evington gate lodge; and my late father told me that the road ran through the park.

"It would certainly have been necessary to have access by trap or carriage between Evington, Helchin, and Elmsted Church during the many years when Helchin was used as the Dower House [by the Honywood family]; but Highway Law is complicated, and for however long the roads and tracks may have been used by local people and the general public, they could only be dedicated for such use by absolute owners of the land.

"This could not have occurred until after my Grandfather and uncle Courtenay broke the entail - before which there would only have been a life tenancy. Presumably Lord Ashburton [who bought the Honywood estate in 1909] or his agent decided to impose a small charge to show that there was no dedication and to persuade the County to adopt the maintenance of the roads."

Fortunately there are two photos dated 1929 taken from at the top of the bank in the garden of the Helchin dwelling. The road seems newish as does the fencing. There are no trees and in one there are two or three horses or ponies. It shows the high banks and sharp bend mentioned by Yvonne. Yvonne

further comments, "On an old map a dotted line could mean it was an unfenced road, which would make sense of there being gates at certain points, where there were fenced sections.

"Looking at the first photograph it would appear that the top section of Elchin Hill was fenced, whereas further down towards Evington Corner no fence is visible.

"This also ties in with what my mother used to say about 'running down the road to open the gate', she indicated this was beyond the sweeping right-hand bend. The more I think about it, the more I think John is right about the gate on Elchin Hill being a stock gate, rather than an official toll."

So Yvonne's mother Dolly being at a vantage on the hill could have spotted a horse rider, pony and trap or a horse and cart coming up from the crossroads and ran down the hill in the hope of getting a few pennies for opening the gate.

There is also another undated photo with a pencil note saying, "Mrs Eley, Up Park, Hastingleigh". In it is a woman with a baby by a gate across the road with pedestrian access at today's Evington Lodge. So perhaps "Up Park" was its name then, and it is Mrs Eley and her baby in the picture.



Pilgrim Matt has tale to tell

Matt Lamburn, a frequent visitor to Elmsted and Hastingleigh, is a keen walker and 'pilgrim' who walked the North Downs Way last summer.

N summer 2016, I walked the Pilgrims Way from Winchester to Canterbury as a personal journey of spiritual reflection and physical endurance; a journey that has had a profound impact on my life.

Undertaking a pilgrimage has been revived somewhat in recent years, with the renowned Camino de the "spiritual" side of life, I was sur-Santiago hosting nearly 280,000 pilgrims in 2016 alone! The reasons are varied, be they spiritual, cultural or simply because one enjoys a long walk.

But the purpose of pilgrimage has remained the same; it is a time to put aside the daily cares of our lives and to truly feel that we are part of something greater... something special.

The Pilgrims Way follows ancient tracks from the Winchester

Cathedral across Hampshire, through Surrey and over the beautiful landscape of Kent to arrive at the Christ-Church Gate of Canterbury Cathedral almost 130 miles later.

After the death of Thomas Beckett in 1170AD, Canterbury became one of the most important pilgrim destinations in North Western Europe.

Previously, the city was known as being the starting point of the Via Francigena, the overland route to Rome, which successive archbishops took to receive their mantle of office from the Pope.

But following the death of Thomas Beckett, Canterbury now had a shrine and, perhaps more importantly, spiritual status of its own with which to draw good pilgrims in.

My journey was made alone during a full and glorious English summer. Having always had a learning to prised at how quickly I became accustomed to life on the road and appreciative of the opportunity I had given myself to simple walk, enjoy the countryside in all its glory and to quietly and steadily contemplate the greater mysteries that surround us: who are we? Why are we here? And what's it all about?

Following the route, which takes one through open fields, old oak forest, high downlands and charming villages, I embraced the

Taking a pilgrimage changes a person; the challenge, toil, endurance and strength of character that is developed through walking long distances enriches our spirits with a sense of accomplishment and perhaps allows us to take back to our everyday lives a greater sense of patience and forbearance... knowing that we will get there through simple perseverance.

It wasn't long before 'pilgrim fever' took over again and I found myself boarding a plane for Italy to walk from La Sanctuaria della Verna to the holy city of Assisi.

This trip was inspired by a new-found love and respect for that most vagabond of saints, Saint Francis; perhaps that is a tale for another time.

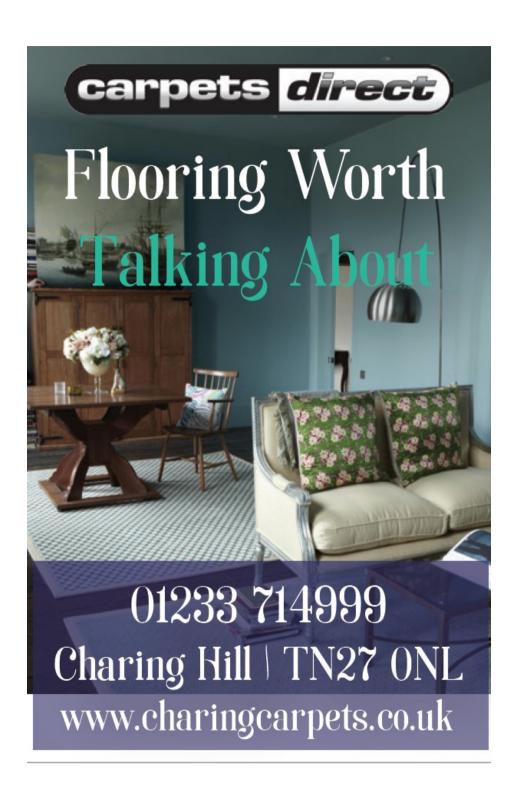
