7437 Minutes

7438 18/0558/FULL Side extension

128 Wyre Hill

It was agreed to recommend approval

7439 18/0594/FULL Extensions and alterations of existing property including

the increase of ridge height of provision, dormers and two

storey front extensions

Culver House, Dowles Road, Greenacres Lane

It was agreed to recommend **refusal** as it was considered the proposed ridge height will adversely affect the visual amenity as well as enabling

overlooking of neighbouring properties. In addition, the previous application was refused due to the same concerns as well as it being contrary to Local Plan policy.

7440 18/0596/FULL Change of use from Old Bakehouse to residential

(amendments to Application 17/0702/FULL). The Old Bakehouse, r/o 66 High Street

It was agreed to recommend approval

7441 18/0600/FULL Two storey side extension

33 Gloucester Way

It was agreed to recommend **approval** subject to the information request made by the Highways Department satisfying their concerns in relation to car parking spaces outside the property

7442 18/0604/TREE Reduce two willow trees by 15%

Millside Court (riverbank area)

It was agreed to recommend **refusal** supporting the comments of the Arboricultural Officer and the Town Council's aim to preserve the treescape of Bewdley, in particular within the Conservation Area. These riverside willows soften the sharp edges of the built form and assist with riverbank stability. Work which would have an effect on the long-term amenity of the two trees is discouraged.

7443 Old Workhouse site, 64 High Street

Comments made at Public Question Time and information known by Members present were discussed.

It was **agreed** to refer this matter to the next Town Council meeting and, in the meantime, to establish from Wyre Forest District Council the current status of the building, in order that full facts are available for the consideration of full Council.

7445 Representations

It was decided that no representations would be made to the next Planning (Development Control) Committee of Wyre Forest District Council in relation to the planning applications considered above.

7356 Planning Decisions Update

Prior to closure of the meeting, the following matters were raised:

- the wish for future Planning Committee meetings to be held in the meeting room at the Guildhall.
- that Kidderminster Foreign PC has been notified of an application (ref. 18/0520) from Crocky Valley Ltd, a Cheshire-based company. The application is for a family adventure trail and ancillary development of the former Habberley Golf Club, Low Habberley, Kidderminster. The impact of additional traffic on local roads in and around Wribbenhall and Bewdley is likely to be significant. Councillor Harrison was asked to liaise with the Office Administrator to formulate an objection letter to the Planning Department, Wyre Forest District Council.
