The Clerk has requested that BCC cut the grass on the verges, but it was considered that the situation needs close monitoring and an early review.

d. Parish Plan

e. Chepping Wye Cluster Group

Mrs. Wallis and Mr. Banfield gave a report on this recent meeting. The Sheepridge Lane footpath has been approved and work should take place during this summer. The issue of weight restrictions on local roads was raised, but as various criteria need to be met, these would not apply to the roads in question.

It was agreed at this meeting that sign cleaning can be devolved the parish council.
