Royal British Legion Compton, Ilsleys & Norreys Branch - Update GP90

We hope that readers will remember us writing about an event called GP 90 in our previous update. Ten years after the end of

WW1 a Grand Pilgrimage to the battlefields of Flanders took place. Led by the then Prince of Wales representing the United Kingdom, thousands attended consisting of several European heads of state, dignitaries, military leaders, veterans, widows & families. The pilgrimage held its main act of Remembrance around the Menin Gate in Ypres. Now, between 5th and 9th August this year, the event is being re-enacted ninety years on - called **GP90**. At the last count, more than 1,200 Royal British Legion branches from around the country will represent their communities at this event. Our Branch has registered its intention to attend with the two official representatives permitted - in our case, our Chairman Steve Allison and Standard Bearer, Mick Crockford. At the Menin Gate, they will carry the branch's standard and a commemorative wreath containing a message from our community of Downland villages.

If readers of this newsletter feel able to support this project, helping us with the cost of our attendance, we would very much welcome their contributions. The Branch has registered with The Good Exchange, part of The Greenham Trust.
