From the Vicar

I hope that you are well and enjoying the warmer weather?

Did you enjoy the Coronation weekend? I certainly did! I took part in an enactment of the Coronation in Horspath C of E Primary School. I thoroughly enjoyed dressing up as the Archbishop of Canterbury, and had a lovely time crowning and enthroning 'King Charles' and 'Queen Camilla'. I enjoyed the privilege of being Archbishop for an hour, without any of the many responsibilities and challenges which must surely go with the job. I also enjoyed the lighting of the large beacon, or fire, here in Cuddesdon, with drinks in the Village Hall beforehand – thanks to Chris and the Parish Council for the drinks, and to Salt for the fire! I ate lots of cake over the weekend – with St Giles' Church, in Horspath, transformed into Highgrove Gardens; and an afternoon tea in the Horspath Hub. In Garsington, I really enjoyed a Coronation Songs of Praise, followed by prosecco and cake, in St Mary's Church.

In last month's newsletter I wrote a little about the oil of Chrism which would be used to anoint King Charles at his Coronation and, watching the Coronation on TV, the anointing was – for me - one of the highlights, as we saw King Charles, standing humbly and vulnerable, stripped of all his finery, wearing a simple linen tunic and trousers, after the special anointing screen had been removed. Another highlight, and reminder for me of Charles' humanity, was seeing William, Prince of Wales, giving his father a tender kiss on the cheek, after swearing an oath of allegiance to him as King.

Shortly after the Coronation, we celebrated Ascension Day with a Eucharist in All Saints' Church, on 18 May, when the risen Jesus was taken up into heaven to be seated on his heavenly throne. I couldn't help reflecting upon the similarities and differences between Charles' coronation, and Jesus' enthronement. Her late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II spoke often of her desire to imitate the servant ministry of Jesus Christ, the Servant King; and Charles' coronation had a strong theme of servant leadership, service and volunteering.

I know that many villagers already volunteer: at the monthly coffee morning; in church and in the churchyard; on the Parish Council; on the fete committee (many thanks to all who helped at, and supported this year's fete); on the village hall committee; and in many other voluntary roles around the village and local area – but let's all try to learn from King Charles, and from Jesus Christ, the art of humility and humble service. Let's seek not to be served, but to serve.

Protecting The Pub

Let's begin with the important bit:

There's a survey loose in this newsletter which asks you about the pub. Please fill it in. Better still please fill it in on-line if you can at tinyurl.com/bat-ball or use your smart phone to access the survey, via this QR code.



The more people who respond, the more it will show how much we value the pub.

The Parish Council has decided to register the Bat and Ball as an Asset of Community Value (ACV). To do this we need to provide evidence of the ways in which the pub is important to the life of our community. We're looking for evidence that the pub is at the heart of social life in the village.



ACVs and other ways of protecting the pub were on the agenda at a recent meeting in the village hall. Fifty people turned out to hear David Cooper from CAMRA (Campaign for Real Ale) talk about protecting the Bat and Ball as a pub. To

say the least, he was nicely surprised. He'd been expecting a quiet talk with perhaps three people from the Parish Council but rose to the occasion.

Of course, it's Admiral, the new owner of the pub, who will have the final say in what happens to it. But, there are some things the village can do to influence Admiral's decision.

Top of the list is registering the pub as an Asset of Community

Value with South Oxfordshire District Council. Being realistic, not all applications are approved. In fact, South Oxfordshire is notorious for its low rate of approval – only 20% compared to the national average of 60%.

If approved and were Admiral to decide to put the pub up for sale, then the village would have six months to raise the money to buy it. Admiral are not bound to accept any offer – ours or anybody else. If successful, the village would then run the pub as a community enterprise. (More about this possibility for another day.)

Perhaps more importantly, the other benefit of registering the pub is that it strengthens the case against redeveloping the pub for housing should Admiral ask for planning permission to do that.

Other suggestions at the meeting included approaching Admiral directly and approaching our MP. So, please open the survey and fill it in, preferably on line. Send paper versions to 12 The Green, Cuddesdon, OX44 9JZ (just downhill from the church and across the road). And, many thanks to Nicola Swift who has much improved the survey and put it in-line.

Parish Council

Not enough people decided to stand to be parish councillors, so Robin Baylie, David Keene and Richard Palmer have been co-opted onto the Council. They join Stuart Flockton, Chris Luke, Paddy McGuinness and Arthur Smith-Fitchett to make up the new Parish Council.

Chris Luke has been elected Chairman for his ninth year.

The beacon burned particularly well at the coronation celebration, despite there having been heavy rain before the event. In no small part this was because of the preparation work and expert lighting by Salt Sellar and Graeme Sellar. Pallets were included at the bottom of the beacon which made it burn better and it is hoped to use the same plan for the bonfire in November so it burns more readily.

The general view is that the screen of trees and shrubs along the back of Cuddesdon Green should be retained. The occupants of Church Road are particularly keen for them to stay. Following the previous tidying done by some of the parish councillors, there may be a small amount of more work done, but none of the trees and shrubs will be removed.

There was a public meeting in the village hall in May to discuss registration of the pub as an asset of community value. An informative talk was given by David Cooper of CAMRA explaining the registration process. It was clear at the meeting that there is a great deal of enthusiasm to keep the pub. Nicko King has put together a group of individuals who are going to pursue the project.

The planning application for a hobby/garden room at The Forge at Denton Green (P23/S0679/HH) has been granted by the District Council. The application for the Dove House Farm conversion of the tithe barn into two dwellings (P22/S2074/FUL) has been withdrawn.

It is good news that the bridge at the mill has been repaired, although it took about 18 months for the work to be done.

From The Parish Council Chairman June 2023

Dear Parishioners,

As I write this message we are heading into a third May Bank Holiday, amazing weather and the prospect of a wonderful summer ahead. Successful village events including the Fete, the Coronation Beacon, the Cuddesdon Ball (back after 13 years) and the Celebration of JP Drinks have all shown our community at its best.

However, I have spent much of May worrying about the new Parish Council ever since I saw that only 4 people had stood for election for the 7 positions, in a Parish of almost 500. If you read the Newsletter regularly, you'll have seen that our Parish Clerk, Mike Mount, and I were encouraging you to put your hand up, get your papers into the SODC at Abingdon and allow us to have an election. Very sadly this didn't happen and the uncontested newly-elected councillors were given the unenviable task of co-opting 3 more at our very first meeting.

Though I've fielded some criticism over the last couple of weeks, we do have a really good team on the PC. We have 5 Cuddesdon Councillors representing the High Street, Parkside and the farming community and two from Denton. It is my personal hope that we also achieve representation from the new Dove House development, Chippinghurst and most obviously women back on the PC in the future. But this isn't to diminish the hard work and free time that all your Councillors have given to our community and will continue to offer as they serve over the next term.

It's likely there will be vacancies on the PC, whether in a week's time or a year or two and so I'm incredibly grateful that there is renewed interest in joining the team.

Please join us at any or all PC meetings, as input from the community is very valuable. Everybody gets the chance to speak and help shape our parish. We meet on the first Tuesday of the month and the agenda is always on the Parish Notice Board in good time.

Away from the PC, so many parishioners do amazing work on other important community bodies like the PCC and Village Hall Committee to name just two.

But I'd like to finish by thanking Nicko King and everyone who has begun work trying to save The Bat & Ball! We have amazing expertise and enthusiasm on Nicko's working group – Nicola, Fiona, Dee, Amy, Ron, Mike, Jon, Peter, and Richard, to name a few. A lot of skill and hard work (and a little luck) will be required to save our pub - or as Nicola calls it our 'third space'.

It's well worth a try and I encourage everyone to fill in the survey either online or on paper. We need a space to meet and be a community that's neither home nor work. The village hall cannot fulfil this need alone without the pub but the proximity of the two makes them very effective bedfellows. The team are beginning to create a vision for a thriving village with the pub at its heart again, so please help them.

John Howell MP writes...

May 2023

This month with the local elections we have seen people come and people go as councillors. Firstly my thanks to all those who have worked as local councillors, at parish and district in the last four years or more. Having been a councillor myself I know very well the work that is involved and that sometimes it can be a thankless task. You can never please everyone and there are always more people ready to complain than to compliment. Welcome too to new councillors. I look forward to working with you in the future.

Turnout figures for local elections are generally low. I think this may be that they do not appreciate the work that is done at a local level. Issues are often raised with me that I have to defer to local councils as the councils are fully autonomous and responsible for their own decisions. So perhaps it is timely to remind people what the different councils do and how elected representatives can help on the relevant issues.

Let me start with the most local level of democracy, the parish council. This the elected body closest to the community. Probably the most common topics that parish councils get involved with are planning matters and working for better services and facilities for the community. As a formal body parish councils have the ability to influence other organisations that make decisions affecting the community such as the district and county councils, health authorities, police. As such parish councils have an important role in local democracy and can be a great resource to support a thriving community. Some smaller communities do not have a parish council but instead have a parish meeting. These have fewer powers and are not required to meet as frequently as a parish council. However they are still formal bodies with a representative role for the community and can often help with relevant issues in the same way that a parish council can.

The next tier of local government in this area is the district council. The constituency is served by two district councils, Cherwell District Council and South Oxfordshire District Council. They are responsible for local services, including planning, housing and associated benefits, rubbish collection, environmental services, leisure services, some car parks and council tax collection.

Finally we have the County Council. This is a much larger council which is responsible for services across the whole of a county including education, social services, transport, roads (except trunk roads and motorways), public rights of way, libraries, the fire service, culture, trading standards, bus subsidies, minerals, waste and recycling (disposal) and the environment.

Each of these council has elected representatives who take decisions on the relevant issues and are there to help residents in the areas of their responsibility. These people should be the first port of call to raise concerns with as they have direct access to information and, in the case of the larger councils, the officers employed to assist. From my own experience as a local councillor, and working alongside many other councillors, I know that most people who put themselves forward for these roles do it because they want to help and support their community. I would therefore encourage residents to take an interest in what they do and seek their support if necessary. Just as I can sometimes help with issues relating to central government departments, so local councillors can help with issues relating to their councils' areas of responsibility.

Morland House Surgery News - May 2023

In April the Surgery began to offer further booster vaccinations to those most at risk from COVID. Eligible people include those aged 75 and over (by June 30); those aged 5 and over with weakened immune systems; and residents of care homes for older adults. Eligible people can also book boosters on the National Booking Service or the NHS App or visit a walk-in COVID-19 vaccination site. For more information, please visit Morland House website: www.morland-house.co.uk

Also, the website provides a wealth of information and guidance on managing a vast number of health conditions, symptoms, and treatment e.g.1. Up-to-date information about surgery opening hours and the wide range of services provided, including new dispensary hours.

2. Morland House Surgery is part of a Primary Care Network involving three other neighbouring GP practices. The PCN now offers patients enhanced access to GPs and nurses later in the evening and on Saturdays.

3. A link to the electronic consulting service eConsult. Use eConsult to ask about your health symptoms, conditions, or treatment. You can even request things like sick notes and GP letters. From the home page click on 'Contact your GP practice Online'.

4. A link to the NHS App. Download the App, or open the NHS website in a web browser, to set up and log in to your NHS Account. Owned and run by the NHS, your NHS Account is a simple and secure way to access a range of NHS services online.

5. Up to date information on current news items including:

- Oxford Community Diagnostic Centre – X-Rays, blood tests, ultrasounds, CTs and more
- Infor on the NHS 111 online service which is available 24/7
- Advice on how to stay healthy and well
- COVID-19 and flu vaccine updates
- Looking after your mental health
- Electronic Prescribing Service (EPS)
- Group A strep and scarlet fever, advice for parents / guardians
- Discontinuation of blister pack recycling
- 24/7 breastfeeding support
- Expansion of bowel cancer screening programme.



Butt Bridge

A great exercise for strengthening the lower back and firming the buttocks is the butt bridge. This exercise targets the Hamstring, Glute and lower back muscles. It can be adjusted to suit your ability, can be done anywhere and does not require any equipment.

Start position is lying on your back, with your knees bent and feet flat on the floor (image 1). I would recommend arms by the side to start and then if you wished to make the exercise more challenging move the arms to above the head.



Pushing through the heels, slowly and under control lift the hips off the floor and squeeze the buttocks together until the shoulders, hips and knees are in a straight line (image 2), pause and then over the same time as it took to raise the hips, lower them until the buttocks lightly touch the floor (do not fully relax) and then repeat for the required number of reps. To begin take two seconds to raise the hips, pause for one second and then two seconds to lower. I would recommend 2 sets of 12 reps for beginners, 3 sets of 15 reps for intermediate exercisers and 3 sets of 12 reps on each leg for experienced exercisers.






