


#### A note on Covid

The pandemic resulted in significant and frequent changes to the operation of public buildings

- 30-40 pages of statutory measures what you <u>must</u> do. Eg) Track & Trace, and guidance Indicating what you <u>should</u> do
- Challenges for PMC
  - > Interpreting the guidance
  - Covid planning
  - "hibernating" the building
  - > Signage, sanitation
  - Documentation of actions
  - Cleaning regimes
  - Health and safety
  - Risk Assessments
  - Bookings, cancellations and refunds
  - > Financial management Costs, deposits, grant applications, etc

Through 2020 and 2021 the Committee members (with the Cleaning Team) addressed all the necessary tasks to ensure that when allowed, the Pavilion was available for use
