Road Safety and Church Path.

ROAD SAFETY – Godshill has a key message to get over to Police, IoW Council and Island Roads – help us to persuade drivers to **SLOW DOWN NOW!**

Godshill Matters will be launching a campaign to engage all of us in a variety of ways to encourage drivers to respect our community by driving at safe and sensible speeds throughout the village.

Godshill Parish Council have submitted 2 TROs (Traffic Regulation Order).

These were regarding moving the 30mph signs on Newport road to the other side of the bridge and installing a more effective speed indicator on the eastern approach to the village.

We are now involving our Ward Councillor in getting some action underway.

Godshill Parish Council has come up with a possible way of breaking the stalemate on Church Path, but we are still at the mercy of Island Roads.

We want to install scaffolding ASAP around the damaged walling so that pedestrians can pass safely. The property owner is happy for us to do that, but we still need Island Roads permission!



Central Mead Defibrillator

Another defibrillator has arrived in Godshill as a result of the success of the PlayFest event.



We are so pleased to report that, with the support of IW Defibrillators, there is now a defib in the play park!

The optimum time to get access to a defibrillator, also known as an Automated External Defibrillator (AED), is within the first 3 minutes of a person collapsing from sudden cardiac arrest. So to have one on site is a really big deal.

Very many thanks to the PlayFest team for raising the money and we hope never to have to use it

Plans are under way to run some open sessions to enable members of our community to learn how to use a defibrillator should they ever need to.

There are numerous churches with bells on the island and we often welcome visiting ringers. Practice is normally held at the Church on Tuesday nights between 7.30-9pm. The bells at the church are also rung on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month from 10.30-11am.

The Tower Captain for many years has been Michael Marlow. Besides his ringing duties, Michael is very happy to give private tours of the bell towers for interested parties as well as welcome you on the Tuesday practice nights.

Did you know that the 6 bells have been in place for quite some time. The current bells were re-cast by Llewellin and James of Bristol in 1887 and are the only ring of bells by this founder on the Island. The re-cast was from the old ring which had themselves been recast in 1815. A sixth bell, a new tenor, was added by casting the 1543 Godshill village gun!

The *Greening Godshill* campaign is pleased to announce its expansion to cover the **entire Central Rural Ward**, encompassing Godshill, Arreton, Rookley and Chillerton & Gatcombe. This marks a bold step forward in our collective journey towards a greener, healthier, and more resilient landscape. The campaign also signals the first of hopefully many projects where all the parishes in Central Rural work together.

To launch this expanded phase, we're hosting a **community workshop** on **Thursday**, **25th September at 6.30pm**, inviting residents from **all five parishes** to share their ideas, passions, and local knowledge about how we live with and care for our landscape.

Each parish will have **20 places** available. If there's strong demand, additional sessions will be arranged to ensure everyone who wants to can take part.

Our campaign stands on five core pillars—key areas we'll collaborate on to foster lasting, positive change:

- Space for Nature creating habitats, enhancing biodiversity, and encouraging wildlife to thrive in our local landscapes.
- 2. **Health Impacts of Climate Change** raising awareness and responding to how a changing climate affects our wellbeing, with tailored community support and resilience-building.
- 3. **Energy Efficient, Warmer Homes** galvanising households to make their homes kinder to the environment, more energy-efficient, and cosier.
- 4. **Waste Prevention** shifting behaviours and raising awareness to reduce, reuse, and prevent waste across our communities.
- Cycle of the Seed promoting food security, encouraging people to grow their own produce, and deepening

connections with how food feeds both body and community.

Isle of Wight Army Cadet Force – Annual Camp Adventures. 17 Godshill cadets and 2 adult supporters have spent the past week on maneuvers on Dartmoor.



Saturday 2nd August 2025 marked the exciting start of Annual Camp 2025, as 487 Army Cadets from across Hampshire and the Isle of Wight travelled to Dorset for a week of military training, fun activities and building new friendships.

Cadets were welcomed by over 100 Cadet Force Adult Volunteers ready to deliver a safe, engaging and unforgettable week of activities. From the moment the coaches rolled in, the camp buzzed with energy as old friends reunited and new recruits experienced their very first taste of Annual Camp.

Day 2 brought the first full day of structured training with the Junior Cadets taking part in a variety of high-energy adventurous training activities including high ropes, mountain biking, climbing, axe throwing and gorge walking — all designed to develop confidence, teamwork and personal resilience in a thrilling outdoor setting.

Elsewhere more senior Cadets were underpinning their First Aid, shooting and navigation knowledge to reinforce discipline, readiness and confidence in preparation for a night time exercise in the field.



No rest for the Cadets though as, after dinner each evening, the group move straight to Command Tasks, expertly delivered by the Island's very own Gallipoli Company.



Command tasks are a bit like the Krypton Factor (for those of us old to remember the show!) with practical leadership and problem-solving activities from communication drills to physical team challenges, designed to test Cadets thinking and teamwork in a fun and supportive environment — perfect for building trust and leadership skills.

Day 3 saw senior Cadets out on the Dartmoor training area for an overnight fieldcraft exercise, putting classroom knowledge into practice focusing on tactical awareness, patrolling and living in the field — an experience many look forward to all year.

At the time of writing, the Cadets are less than half way through their week away and this author wonders what else might be in store for these young people. Whatever it might be I am sure, on their return home, they will be exhausted, but also exhilarated with a real sense of pride and achievement on what they have accomplished.
