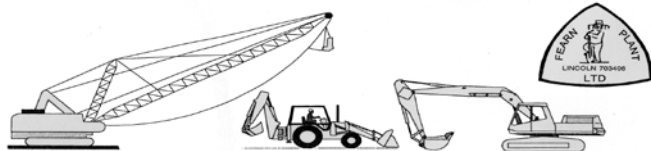

Look two, one's going, one's gone

Having rung for morning services on March 3rd and 17th, we then had the pleasure of ringing for the Easter Sunday Service, which was a virtual 'sell out'. It was nice to see All Saints so well patronised, with the star turn being the Queen Eleanor Primary School choir making a welcome visit to All Saints again, and also from a bell ringing point of view, 'gratifying'. Again All Saints Church was florally decorated with the usual excellence.

Following a further service on April 7th we rang for the special service to welcome Rev'd D. Yabbacome on 21st April, for his first service at All Saints. We in the Belfry wish him all the best wishes in his new position, in the East Trent Group of Churches. I also had the pleasure of ringing for his Induction and Installation Service held the day before at St. John the Baptist Church at South Collingham. The ¼ peal ringing team for this service were from different parishes within the East Trent Group. By all accounts this was a very ceremonial service, a little complex to describe.

Pat Hazel has, since the last News Letter, received a further grant towards the bell restoration project, (thank you again Pat) which is due to start on 10th June. Preparation work by ourselves has just begun as I write. We have to remove sufficient floor and ceiling boarding to enable the bells to be removed, this has to be mainly completed after Laura Hudson and Jamie Diggin's wedding to be held on 31st May at 12-30 p.m. and the commencement of the bell restoration. (Laura and Jamie could well be Mr. and Mrs. Diggin by the time you read this News Letter). Also we have to install a self-imposed safety rail on the clock platform.

At the time of writing, a working party has been arranged by the P.C.C. to clean out the base of the tower on Monday 3rd June at 10-30a.m. to make way for the bell's outward journey. 'Thanks!' more for Colin's shed.

I understand from Pat that the new wheels and bearing plates, have been manufactured, the headstock castings are presently being machined, "Good News". It sounds like we have been fortunate in as much that, the Whitechapel bell hanger is Peter Scott, some days in the belfry, it's like being in the Antarctic.

Following the preparation work and the bells are away, a certain amount of cleaning up will take place, whilst looking forward to the re-fit and the sound of All Saints Bells again.

Our next Wedding is on 21st Sept, when we hope the bells will be up and ringing by then? The wedding is that of John Rouston and Julie Davidson, keep your fingers crossed John and Julie.

- The drain at 5 Lane Ends has been unblocked by the County Council.
- Lincolnshire Road Safety Partnership declined a meeting invitation to discuss concerns regarding 5 Lane Ends.
- The Saturday Swap event was well received with another event planned for later in the year.
- Play equipment is to have an official opening BBQ in the summer dates to follow.

- Richard Croft was re-elected as Chairman and Caroline Nolan as Vice-Chairman.

When? August Bank Holiday weekend (23-26 August 2013)

Where? begins in Harby on Friday 23 August. Cyclists will need to make their own way to Newark Northgate station (75 mins from London Kings X). Finishes at Westminster Abbey followed by a short celebration at St Martin-in-the-Fields in London on Monday 26 August 2013 which ends at around 6pm. Overnight stops are in Grantham (Lincs), Geddington (Northants) and Dunstable (Beds). Day cyclists also welcome.

What is provided? Food, luggage transport, accommodation in church and village halls, maps. Each group of 8-10 will each be led by an experienced cyclist.

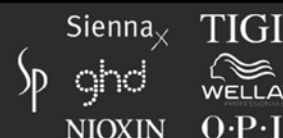

Gainsborough - Capital of England

Hard to imagine now, but Gainsborough's place in history was defined a thousand years ago this July when it was briefly the capital of England. In 1003 Danish Prince Svein Otto Haraldsson began conquering territory in England, defeating the armies of the English King Ethelred 'The Unready' who fled the country in 1013. The Anglo-Saxon English nobility acknowledged Svein as King and he established his high office and Capital of England at Gainsborough Castle, on the site of the Old Hall, whilst his army encamped at 'Castle Hills' at Thonock. So briefly, in late July 1013, Gainsborough became the capital of England.



Svein was popularly known as *Tiugeskaeg*, meaning 'Forkbeard' after his long cleft beard and there's a pub in Gainsborough today called *Sweyn Forkbeard*. Despite his military successes and marvellous name, his reign was cut short as Svein was accidentally killed in February 1014 when he was thrown from his horse. He was succeeded by his son King Canute who famously tried to turn back the tide.
