The funding, which will run over this financial year and into 2023-24 is tohelp the Council to acquire 30 additional homes. These will initially be used toaccommodate refugees from Ukraine and Afghanistan, but when they are no longerneeded for this purpose the homes will be available through the housing waiting list (as					
	Cambridge and South Cambridgeshire households can now conveniently recycle used,					

	small batteries weekly, thanks to changes to waste collections. Adjustments to bin lorries						
	mean that small plastic bags containing used batteries can now simply be left on top of						
	green, black or blue bins for collection by crews on their usual rounds.						
	New funding for defibrillators The Department of Health and Social Care (DHSC) has announced £1 million of funding to						
	increase the number of automated external defibrillators in communities – providing an						
	estimated 1,000 new defibrillators in community spaces in England						
	Homes for Ukraine: Hosts still needed for guests already in South Cambridgeshire						
	Hosts are still desperately needed across South Cambridgeshire to support families who						
	have already arrived from Ukraine, with hosts eligible to receive up to £500 a month as a						
	thank you payment. Around 770 people from Ukraine have already arrived in South						
	Cambridgeshire and with the war continuing - and it not being safe for many families to						
	return - there is an ongoing demand to provide them with a safe place to stay.						
	New "Energy Bills Discount Scheme" for businesses announced						
	On 9 January the government announced a new energy scheme for businesses, charities,						
	and the public sector, ahead of the current scheme ending in March. The scheme will						
	mean that all eligible UK businesses and other non-domestic energy users will receive a						
	discount on high energy bills until 31 March 2024.						
	Bus Services & Precept						
	At the Combined Authority Board meeting on 25 January the Board approved the Mayor's						
	draft budget for 2023/24 incorporating a Mayoral General Precept to support buses across						
	our region. The Mayoral General Precept, will be an annual charge of £12 for a band D						
	property and, based on forecasts from collection authorities would raise £3.6m in 2023-24.						
	The precept is in response to the financial pressure facing the Combined Authority across						
	its supported bus services. Stagecoach withdrew from 18 bus routes and reduced a further						
	5 citing that declining bus travel compounded by the pandemic made these routes						
	financially unsustainable.						
	Households to get new cost-of-living payments from spring 2023						
	The Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) has announced more detail on the						
	payment schedule for the next round of cost-of-living support unveiled in the Chancellor's						
	Autumn Statement on 17 November. The £900 payment for over eight million eligible						
	means-tested benefits claimants (including those on Universal Credit, Pension Credit and						
	tax credits) starts in spring. Payments will go directly to bank accounts in three payments						
	over the course of the financial year. There will also be a separate £150 for over six million						
	disabled people and £300 for over eight million pensioners on top of their winter fuel						
	payment. Payments will be made automatically if individuals are eligible and there will be no						
	need to apply.

	Potholes- comment from County Council:						
	Potholes have worsened dramatically following the December freeze and continuing						
	wet weather, unsurprisingly given the effects of freezing temperatures and water on long						
	neglected infrastructure resulting from decades of underfunding and a policy of 'managed						
	decline.' Last summer's drought has had an additional impact on soil beneath road						
	structures, causing further problems.						
	We have been working closely with our Local Highways Officer to log potholes for action and						
	we would encourage everyone to please check on the 'Cambridgeshire Report a Fault'						
	webpage https://highwaysreporting.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/						
	to find out whether potholes you are concerned about have already been logged. If not,						
	please do log the pothole and note the reference number. If there is a problem with the						
	reporting page do let us know. Please note that currently, when the subcontractors go out						
	to fill potholes, they can only address what has been logged on the system, though the						
	council is looking at whether this can be changed.						
	You'll be interested to know that in one week in January 5586 potholes were reported – 2.5						
	times the normal. The dragon patchers (of which there are two) can do 100 every day, with						
	manned teams able to do only 20 a day. We fixed more than 45,000 last year. Over 500						
	claims are made for compensation for vehicle damage every year of which the County						
	Council settle approximately 85.
