Mayor and Deputy Mayor Elect

At the March meeting Councillors agreed to nominate Councillor Michael Burton as Mayor Elect and Councillor Ian West as Deputy Mayor Elect for the forthcoming civic year. The appointments will be confirmed at the Annual Meeting in May.

Neighbourhood Plan Update

A Neighbourhood Plan sets out where new homes, shops and offices might be built, and allows a community a say on what those new buildings should look like and what infrastructure should be provided. A successful Plan would be a legal planning document; setting out the development needs for the area, and offering real planning protection against unwanted and unsuitable development in our neighbourhood. An advisory group consisting of Town Councillors and members of the public has been looking into the idea of a plan since November of last year.

At public meetings in January and February people had an opportunity to meet advisory group members and look at maps of the area. The meetings were well attended and many people left useful feedback.

The first decision is about the Plan boundary. The advisory group recommended that the Plan area should include Benthall, which is inside the Barrow Parish Council area, because this would give Benthall residents the same protection against unwanted development, and the same opportunity to shape the area's amenities, as Broseley residents will enjoy. However, this proposal has now been rejected by Barrow Parish Council, so the Neighbourhood Plan boundary will be the Broseley Town boundary.

If Shropshire Council approves this proposal, the next step will be to set up working groups to look into specific areas the Plan needs to address. These might include: housing, environment, business, infrastructure, education leisure and health. At that stage the advisory group will be looking for interested individuals to contribute to the future of their community. Nothing is currently decided. The successful Plan, if it proceeds, will be led by the community.

Multi-Use Games Area

The Broseley MUGA Group, a small, longstanding voluntary organisation that runs the multi-use games area sited in the grounds of Broseley Church of England School in Dark Lane, is looking for two community minded residents to act as chair and secretary for the Group.

The vacancies arise because the existing officers wish to retire after many years of service. The Group has a manager for the facility and Broseley Town Council has overall responsibility, so commitment is not onerous. The Group meets every two months and the existing committee and user groups are very supportive.

Public Participation at Council Meetings

At the beginning of full Council and Planning Committee meetings 10 minutes are set aside for members of the public to raise matters with the Council. Councillors have recently agreed to change the way the public participation session is managed. Members of the public may make representations, answer questions and give evidence without prior notice on matters which are on the agenda of that meeting. If members of the public wish to speak on matters which are not on the agenda, they must give notice in writing to the Town Clerk at least three clear days in advance of the meeting, with details of the subject on which they wish to speak.

Members of the public are not allowed to present or circulate documents at Town Council meetings. Any documents which members of the public wish to present at a Town Council meeting must be submitted to the Town Clerk at least three clear days in advance of the meeting, to ensure that they comply with the Council's policies and legal obligations. Where appropriate, the Town Clerk will ensure that copies of such documents are provided for the meeting.

Memorial Garden

We realise that some people like to take their dogs with them into the Memorial Garden when they visit. However, we have been shocked to find that some dog owners are deliberately taking their dogs into the Garden to allow them to use the area as a toilet. Please stop this! Dog faeces can cause the infection toxocariasis, which can lead to a variety of health problems, particularly in children, including permanent loss of vision. The Memorial Garden is an attractive spot for relaxation and remembrance – not a pooch privy.

Many people in Broseley are great at finding words of comfort or encouragement when they meet friends and neighbours in town.
