<u>NEIGHBOURHOOD PLANNING MEETING – 6TH</u> JULY

Those who attended the Annual Parish Meeting in May will remember that the Parish Council agreed to organise and hold a public meeting in respect of Neighbourhood Planning, to explain the process and gauge an interest/appetite for NH planning in the village. A Neighbourhood Plan would enable the parish to put in place a vision and policies for its future development. Unlike a parish plan, a NH plan becomes a statutory document and can be used to help determine planning applications in the neighbourhood area, alongside the Borough Council's Local Plan and other statutory documents. Having said that, it cannot be used to restrict or diminish planning. Instead it may be used to determine where the best places for more development are, or what sort and size of development would be preferred. The preparation and process of writing and developing a NH plan has to follow a fairly rigorous process and it can therefore take a long time and require a great deal of input from parishioners and volunteers in the community as well as financial resources to pay for the services of professionals to aid the process. Its possible advantages therefore have to be weighed up against the financial and other costs involved to see if the parish believes this to be a worthwhile exercise.

Any NH plan written must fall in line with and agree with the policies and plans outlined in TWBC's Local Plan which is now partly developed, as well as agreeing with current legislation and government policies.

If you are interested in hearing more, wish to offer your services as a potential volunteer or simply wish to voice an opinion on whether you feel the parish should go ahead with developing a NH Plan or not, please attend the meeting arranged for 6^{th} July at 7pm in the Village hall.

The meeting will include information from Kelvin Hinton (TWBC Officer) and those chairing the NH planning groups at Hawkhurst and Goudhurst. Refreshments will also be provided.
