Ivinghoe Lawn Hire Terms and Conditions

MINIMUM 7 DAYS NOTICE REQUIRE FOR LAWN BOOKINGS.

Ivinghoe Parish Council have set the following terms and conditions to protect Ivinghoe Lawn as a public space for the enjoyment of the whole community:

All hirers are required to give the council details of the start and end times for hire, the details of the purpose of the Lawn Hire.

Lawn Hire Terms and Conditions

1 Hours of use:

Friday and Saturday nights: until midnight

Monday to Friday and Sunday & Bank Holiday's until 11pm.

The playing of music must cease 15 minutes prior to the above times.

2 Vehicles/Marquee's:

No person shall without the consent of the Council leave or cause or permit to be left any motor cycle, motor vehicle or trailer in the ground between the hours of [12 midnight and 6 a.m.].

Vehicles with prior permission may be parked overnight (empty), but not occupied overnight.

Marquee erection – you must have your own public liability insurance – a copy of evidence to be supplied to the Parish Clerk.

Parking - areas on The Lawn to be used for parking will be assessed by the Parish Council prior to opening, based on the condition of The Lawn at the time and where necessary will be advised to the person making the booking. In some cases, the Parish Council reserve the right to terminate the booking if conditions prevail which would make the area unsafe to park or would cause damage to the Lawn.

The playground area of The Lawn must be kept free from vehicles.

3 General

Only 'non-breakable' drinking vessels allowed (to prevent broken glass on the Lawn).

You must take your litter home with you.

If playing music, the hirer must obtain a Public Right Society licence – evidence to be provided to the Clerk.

No sale of alcohol without proof of a licence.

4 Cost – please contact the Clerk for price which is subject to review annually.

£30 - £100 per 6 hours, depending on usage.

For marquees more than 24hours hire £500 deposit, cheque to be held on file.

Exclusive use cannot be guaranteed because Ivinghoe Lawn is a public open space.
