

This has taken a long time to get through all the bureaucracy involved, but we are finally there. We do hope that many people and businesses will be able to benefit from this system.

Christmas Rocky Road

250g dark chocolate, chopped	200g amoretti biscuits
150g milk chocolate, chopped	150g shelled Brazil nuts
175g butter, softened, plus extra	150g red glacé cherries
for greasing	125g mini marshmallows
4 tbsp golden syrup	1 tbsp icing sugar

1. Place the dark and milk chocolate pieces into a heavy-based pan. Add the butter and golden syrup and cook over a low heat to melt and combine.

2. Place the amoretti biscuits into a freezer bag and bash with a rolling pin to make crumbs of various sizes. Place the Brazil nuts into another freezer bag and bash in the same way.

3. Take the pan of melted chocolate mixture off the heat and add the crushed biscuits and nuts. Add the glacé cherries and mini marshmallows. Fold the mixture carefully to coat all of the solid ingredients with the syrupy chocolate mixture.

4. Pour the mixture into a 25cm/10in x 30cm/12in greased and lined baking tray and smooth the surface as much as possible (although it will look bumpy). Refrigerate for two hours, or until firm enough to cut. Dust with icing sugar, then sprinkle with edible glitter if you wish. Remove the block of rocky road from the tray and cut into 24 rectangles.

Christian Message - December 2014

He became man

Brian Cox has recently said on his "Human Universe" TV programme that it seems unlikely that there are any other life forms in the whole of the universe: the Earth is unique. That's quite a disappointment for some people who have liked to think that there are aliens out there, that we're not alone in the cosmos, that eventually there might be contact made.... Without that hope, it feels lonely.

Each year we celebrate the Christmas story – a story of contact between the creator of the universe and his creation. We remember the events and are reminded that in fact we are not alone, that there is purpose and meaning to our lives. The strange thing, though, is that while we celebrate Christmas, we tend not to want much interaction with this creator, this God-become-man. We'd rather hold on to the distant hope of aliens. Perhaps we think that he'll want to intrude on our freedoms, spoil our fun.

Actually, it's quite the opposite.
