Whereas a Representation duly made to Her Majesty in Council by the Secretary of State for the Environment that burials should be discontinued as hereinafter directed in the new section of St. Giles Churchyard, Balderton, in the County of Nottinghamshire, which is shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto, has in pursuance of an Order in Council made the 30th day of July 1976, and duly published, been taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section 1 of the Burial Act 1853(a) and of all other powers Her enabling, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

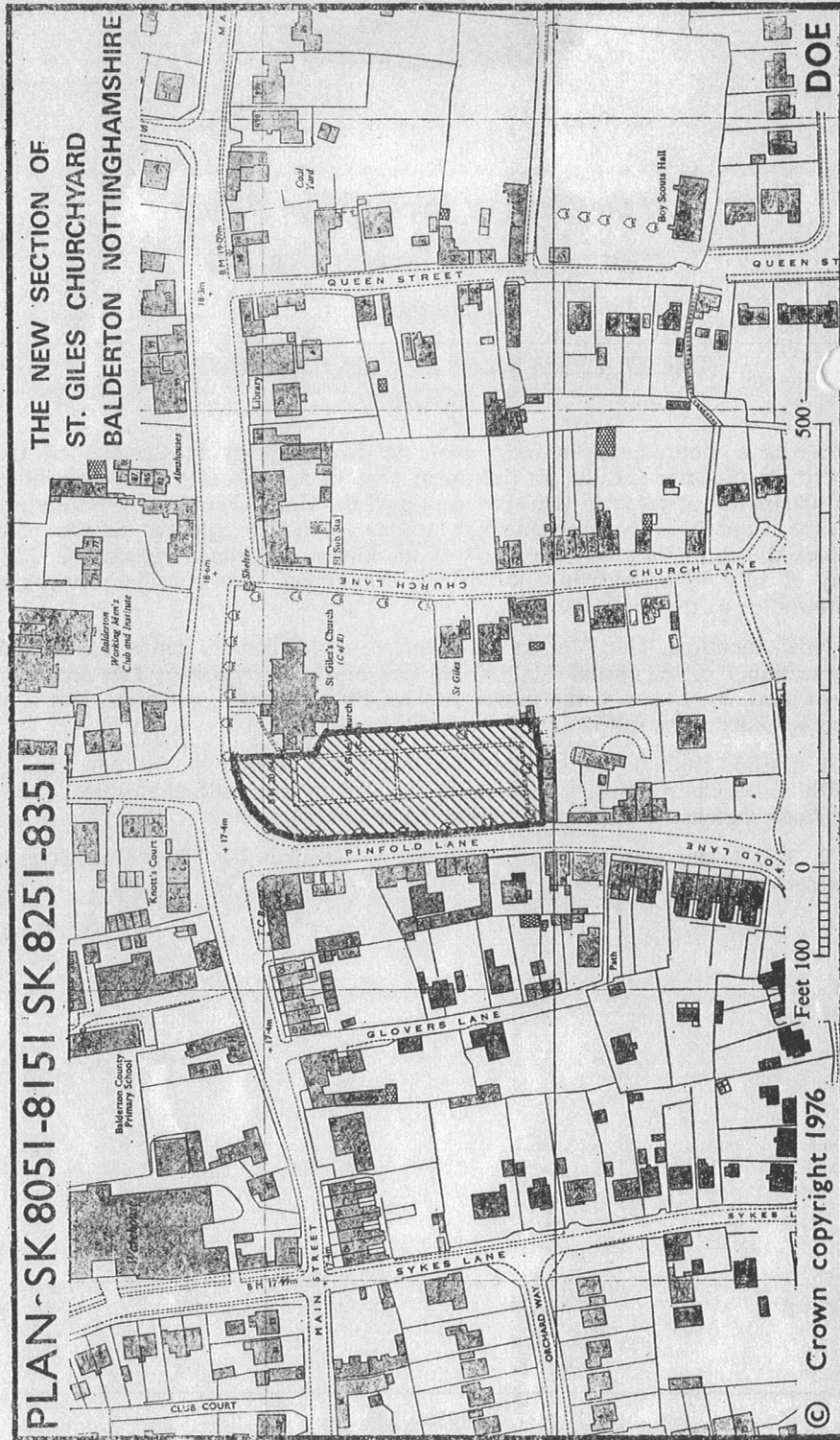
1. Burials shall be discontinued forthwith and entirely in the new section of St. Giles Churchyard, Balderton, in the County of Nottinghamshire, which is shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto.

2. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (St. Giles Churchyard, Balderton, Nottinghamshire) Order 1976.
