This is a great comforting dish for these cold Winter nights. A wonderful spicy meal in one pot. Chicken is simmered with onions, green peppers, tomatoes, smoked sausage, rice and seasonings.

Spicy Winter Chicken & Smoked Sausage Jambalaya

Serves 4

600g of boned chicken thighs 225g of smoked sausage, sliced 2 green peppers, diced 1 onion, diced 2 large cloves of garlic, finely chopped 1 400g tin of chopped tomatoes 1/2 tablespoon of chilli powder 1/4 teaspoon of hot pepper sauce 1/4 teaspoon of ground cayenne pepper 1 teaspoon of Worcestershire sauce 2 bay leaves 90g of tomato puree 90g of uncooked white rice

1. Place the chicken and sausage in a large saucepan and cover with water. Bring to the boil, then reduce heat and simmer until chicken is cooked and falls from the bone, (approx. 45 minutes). Remove chicken and sausage, reserving the stock. Then shred the chicken using two forks.

2. In a large saucepan over a medium heat,

cook the peppers, onions and garlic until onion is translucent, adding a little reserved chicken stock if necessary. Stir in the tomatoes, chilli powder, hot pepper sauce, cayenne, Worcestershire sauce and bay leaves. Reduce heat and simmer for 15 minutes.

3. Stir the shredded chicken, sausage and tomato puree into the spiced vegetables. Continue to simmer until flavour is as spicy as you like, adding reserved liquid as needed to thin.

4. Stir in 125ml reserved liquid with the rice. Simmer 20 minutes, until rice is tender

BUS SERVICE 59 – Big Changes Are Coming!

In last month's Malherbe Monthly I outlined the proposed changes to the 59 route and service level following KCC's decision to select the 59 as one of five pilot schemes in the county as it "explores innovative and sustainable ways of providing transport to rural communities in Kent". The indicative timetable is now available and is shown on the opposite page.

The public consultation on the detailed proposals started on 22nd January and ends on 19th February. Copies of the consultation document and questionnaire are available online at <u>www.kent.gov.uk/maidstonebuspilot</u> and at local libraries, and I am attempting to get some copies so that they can be available at Grafty Green Post Office. The questionnaire can be completed online or a completed paper form sent to FREEPOST: BIG CONVERSATION.

As pointed out last month but worth repeating, the proposed changes to the 59 service only affect Mondays to Fridays off-peak and Saturdays. The existing Monday to Friday schools services, ie the 06.45 from Grafty Green and the return 16.12 from Maidstone will be unchanged, although efforts continue to achieve a later departure and a shorter journey time for the morning service. The service 14 to and from Cornwallis Academy is also not affected by the proposed changes.

The indicative timetable confirms that the intention of the changes to the off-peak service is to replace the current infrequent services which operate to and from Maidstone Town Centre with a more frequent feeder service terminating at Park Wood Morrisons which will connect with the high frequency services from there (at least every 10 minutes) to and from the Town Centre.

Connections will also be possible to Headcorn and Tenterden as well as Maidstone. It will be possible to change buses at Warmlake Crossroads and KCC is investigating whether improvements can be made to the bus stops and crossings there. However, Park Wood Morrisons is the transfer point in the indicative timetable where buses are timed to make good connections and the change of buses should be as easy as getting off one bus and getting on another at the same stop.

The revised service is due to start on 1^{st} June and run for a year, and will be under continuous review. The public consultation is your opportunity to have your say on what is proposed. If you have any questions by all means contact me – I would also be pleased to hear your views to help with the Parish Council's response.

As ever, the message is:-USE IT OR YOU ALMOST CERTAINLY WILL LOSE IT!

2-Step Authentication – adding further password security

Still worried about securing information that you have on the internet. There is an additional step you can take. I recently heard about this and thought I'd share my research with you. It can be especially important to you if you are someone who uses LinkedIn, Twitter, Microsoft, Apple, and Google, or any of the available online storage services to keep personal information and data.

Two-factor authentication, or 2FA as it's commonly abbreviated, adds an extra **step** to your basic log-in procedure. Without 2FA, you enter in your username and password, and then you're done. The password is your single **factor** of authentication. The second **factor** makes your account more secure, in theory.

All the big players offer this two factor authentication, sometimes called two step verification, you can find the instructions on how to set this up online or within the applications help, but here's an example from Microsoft to give you an idea of what is needed.

Step 1: Go to the Account Settings page, and look for both an email address and phone number under the section titled "Security info helps keep your account secure." If either piece of information is missing, click on the **Add security info** link and follow the prompts.

The SMS functionality of 2FA relies on your phone number being connected to your account, so don't skip it. Otherwise you'll need access to your email account to receive your secondary log-in code.

Step 2: Click on the "Set up two-step verification" link.

Step 3: Follow the setup process until you reach the end, then click "Done." You may be asked to provide a verification code, sent to either your phone via SMS or to your alternate email address, before you can complete the two-step setup. Once it's complete, you should receive an email confirmation from Microsoft sent to your alternate email address.



Christian Message February 2019 by Pamela Cuerden

When my children were little I took them on holiday to the Lake District with my mother. They had so much fun without a care in the world until one evening when I thought it would be a treat to phone their Daddy so they could tell him all about their holiday. This totally back-fired and before I knew it my mother and I had three wailing, homesick children on our hands because they 'wanted their Daddy!'

Nearly 30 years later the roles were reversed. My son and his fiancée went away on an extended holiday just as my mother became ill so my attention was diverted and I was preoccupied with visits to her in hospital – until after a few days my son sent home an email to reassure us about what a lovely time they were having. It just reminded me how far away they were, what a long time a month is and how concerned I was for their safety. Parting is such sweet sorrow! God tells us quite directly not to worry. I am not very good at heeding this but here it is in black and white:

Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothes? Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not more valuable than they? Can any one of you by worrying add a single hour to your life? (Matthew 6: 25-27).

My son and his girlfriend arrived home safely a month later, full of beans and keen to share all the photographs and news from their trip. I praise God for this. Philippians 4:6-7 reassures us: *Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation by prayer and petition , with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.*

With the continuing cuts in the public sector and the uncertainty of Brexit here in Britain, and war, famine, and the balance of nature being upset through waste products and global warming throughout the world, never was it more important to pray and trust in our Lord
