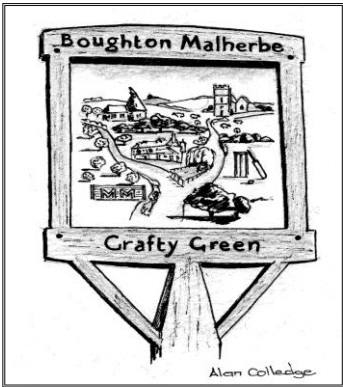

Important Information From Boughton Malherbe Parish Council

Government Help for the most medically vulnerable residents who have been advised to self isolate at home for a period of 3 months and do not have support from family and friends to help with shopping, collecting prescriptions etc.

In response to Government requests, Maidstone Borough Council (MBC) has set up a Community Hub to assist vulnerable residents within the Borough during the **Coronavirus** emergency.

The Hub aims to provide similar assistance to that set up by the Boughton Malherbe Parish Community Emergency Plan, which you can read about elsewhere in this magazine and on the Parish Council website.

It is understood that the Hub can provide the added benefit of free Grocery parcels which is something that our own Emergency Plan could not do on a regular basis.

We hope to co-operate with the Hub to ensure that its supplies and services get to the needy within our Parish, as and when required.

The news of the MBC Hub came after our own Community Emergency Plan was set up, and too late for us to establish and publish in this magazine the full details of exactly how the Hub will work, and how our Community Emergency Plan can work alongside it.

Neighbourhood Watch - Covid 19 Advice

Covid 19 Scam Prevention Advice

Scammers and criminals are already looking for opportunities to scam people as a result of the Coronavirus / COVID-19 pandemic. Happily, there are many more stories of kindness and generosity but we want to make people aware of the scams as they emerge – which they seem to be on a daily basis.

There have been reports received by Kent Police of people door-knocking and claiming to be from the Health Authority.

What happens:

- The criminal knocks on your door.
- They claim to be from the Health Authority.
- They offer to do COVID-19 testing on residents.
- There are also reports of the criminal offering to take the residents temperature.

THIS IS A SCAM!

What to do:

- Do not let them in.
- Do not allow them to take any money or details from you
- Report to Kent Police on 101.
- If you ask them to leave and they don't, contact the police on 999.

Please warn vulnerable family members, friends and neighbours.

Report

There has been a report of an elderly Kent resident who lost money when they gave their bank card to someone who offered to do some shopping for them. They received one of these cards through their door and an individual offered to help, however, they actually stole money from the resident and were not seen again.

Payment

Don't ever give your bank or card details to anyone, even if you think you know them

very well. You could either agree to pay in cash after they have delivered the shopping or pay them online if you have the facility to do so. Or maybe you could agree another method of payment - **but never give your bank or card details.**

Grafty Green Gardening Club - update

The Plant Sale is postponed for the moment until we have news following this further 3-week shutdown period. In the meantime, members will be emailed and those members without email will be advised as and when plants are ready and can be collected (at a safe distance) from other members. As it happens the majority of plants for sale still have some growing to do, so, continue to look out for emails as to when they are ready for sale and collection.

The Garden in May - As gardeners we can continue to enjoy ourselves outside and without interruption, my garden has never been so well tended! But the water butts are already empty and there is need for some watering of new or newly separated plants. We can sow chard now and beans and plant leeks, marrows and courgettes in the veg patch and healthy lawns will need more frequent cutting. Early flowering shrubs such as Keria and Spirea will finish flowering about now and flowering shoots can be cut down to young side shoots lower down the stem, the same with Spirea, in addition on established plants one in three of stems can be cut right down to the ground.

SOHL ("Save Our Heath Lands")

Dear Residents

We hoping you are keeping safe and well in these extraordinary times.

In our newsletter last month, we told you we were pausing our social media and public campaign to allow efforts to be rightly focused on helping the most vulnerable in our community during this worrying time.

We wish to sincerely apologise as we now have to restart our campaign due to Maidstone Borough Council (MBC) continuing to work away in the background on their garden community plans east of Lenham.

The Council have set up a virtual meeting of the Policy & Resources Committee next **Wednesday 29 April at 2pm** to agree the next steps on the garden community proposal. Today, they have published a report which can be viewed [here](#) with the following headlines:

- Council officers want agreement to **proceed to the next stage in their plans** and undertake further work to develop a revised masterplan
- The Council are **dropping their plans to build a motorway junction or High-Speed rail station** as they have now realised these are unachievable to deliver
- The Council are **progressing with less principal landowners** following three of the principal landowners refusing to be part of further negotiations
- With a smaller number of landowners, there is **less developable land and less homes** can be built
- The Council want to continue **spending half a million pounds of council taxpayer's money** to carry on investigating the scheme.

Even MBC's own councillors are complaining about the secretive nature of the Council's virtual meeting next week accusing MBC of trying to "quietly" hold key committee meetings away from public scrutiny under the cover of the Coronavirus crisis. See more from Downsmail [here](#).

We will be putting questions to members of that Committee via a dial-in option next Wednesday. We'll also be issuing a rebuttal to many of the inaccuracies and untruths in the officer's report. We will share this with you in coming days.

Please take time to read the [garden community report](#) yourself and let us know your thoughts by replying to this email.

We apologise again for having to restart the campaign so soon in the middle of the national lockdown but we have a small window of opportunity to make our voices heard (virtually). We need to ensure MBC do not inappropriately push through these proposals which are extremely risky, uneconomic and detrimental to our future generations.

Music Notes for May 2020

As all readers will be aware, every one of the concerts I listed in my April notes was either cancelled or postponed indefinitely. There are no live concerts scheduled for May – and that's nationally of course, not just locally. It gives us all the chance to dig out our CDs, records, and perhaps even tapes if we still have the equipment to play them.

As I write Radio 3 has just published its schedule for May, so I can make some recommendations of best listening there. Also, the BBC offers a weekly free download of a concert via its classical music website www.classical-music.com. They only release details of that a week in advance, so no recommendations there, but well worth checking. TV does not yet promise any recorded programmes, now live concerts are not available, though BBC4 did broadcast the remarkable virtual choir performance by Tenebrae on Easter Sunday and I'm sure you will be able to find a view of that on the internet.

Radio:

I have often mentioned in the past and would continue to recommend tuning to radio 3 (digital or 90.2-92.4 MHz FM) on Sunday at 3.00pm and Thursday at 3.30pm for Choral Evensong. 6th May is scheduled to be from Salisbury Cathedral, and should be of the best. Then there is the Beethoven Roots Festival, radio 3 in concert, 18th-21st May daily at 7.30pm. As well as the full

cycle of symphonies there will be key contemporary music to illustrate the development. That is something special.

A number of national orchestras are offering recorded concerts through the internet and I give suggestions below.

Internet:

London Symphony Orchestra-The LSO has launched 'Always Playing', a series of full-length concerts from its archive, which will be streamed live at the orchestra's usual performance times: 7.30pm on Thursdays and 7pm on Sundays. Find it on <https://www.youtube.com/user/Lso>

Bergen Philharmonic Orchestra- The Nordic orchestra has an online streaming service, which features concerts from the past year, including a performance of Britten's Peter Grimes, which the orchestra performed at the Royal Festival Hall in 2019. Find it via <https://www.bergenphilive.no/>

Metropolitan Opera - The Met has launched 'Nightly Met Opera Streams', a free series of operas streamed on the Met Opera's website during the coronavirus closure. Find details on <https://www.metopera.org/calendar/#/on-stage?year=2020&month=4>

Having said all that, those who have internet access can check daily on what programmes are available, and those who still have a newspaper can do the same. In fact, if you can use the internet, you can find and listen to any particular piece of music you choose. It is the way music listening is going. Sounds wonderful, but you tend to miss out on that amazing piece that you didn't know existed!

Christian Message – May 2020 by Joan Drury

Whatever happens in the next few weeks – and the future does appear to be misty – I am sure that May 8 will not come and go without celebrations of some sort. Many, including HM the Queen, will remember VE DAY. It was a great celebration of the allied victory over NAZI Germany. There were special events throughout the United Kingdom – dancing in Piccadilly and street parties in towns and villages. These events were followed a few months later, on 15th July 1945, by another great celebration when the war with Japan came to an end.

Victory celebrations are part of our history. Almost all Remembrance services include the repetition of statements such as, “They shall grow not old as we that are left grow old.” These words remind worshippers of Armistice Day, 11th November 1918. Sadly, many past victories as, for example over Napoleon or in the Crimea, have failed to achieve lasting peace. There have been more wars, more tragic loss of life.

There is, however, one lasting victory which Christians rejoice in and which can transform life and bring lasting peace to a person. It is the victory of Jesus over sin and death and this victory was achieved by his painful death on the Cross at Calvary.

The Bible proclaims confidently, **“Thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ”**. (I Corinthians 15:27)

Victories recorded in history books have little relevance to our lives today. By contrast Jesus death on the Cross has disabled the power of death over us and provided the solution to the sin which besets our lives. 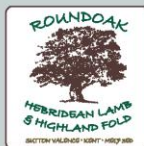
