## <u>Hampden Fields proposed development for 3,000</u> <u>homes in Weston Turville</u>

We now have the long awaited outcome of the Hampden Fields enquiry, and many will be relieved to know that the developers have lost their appeal. It finally hinged upon the impact the vehicles generated from an extra 3000 homes would have had on the traffic in Aylesbury and in particular on the Walton Street gyratory system and the uncertainty of gaining approval for its improvement. Other planning applications now awaiting approval include the development of 70 homes adjacent to Calibre in New Road, a further 9 houses at the village end of New Road, and 4 houses in Marroway. Last year an application for 137 homes at the A41 end of New Road was approved by the District Council.

## VILLAGE HALL CAR PARK AND PLAY AREA

The Parish Council is proposing some big changes in the area surrounding the village hall. One project involves moving the present children's play park to behind the hall and school. It will cover an area larger than the present one, and will contain new and exciting equipment for the children and youth of Weston Turville. The other project is to enlarge the village hall car park to include the area presently occupied by the children's play area. The cost of the two projects will be just over £120,000, which will be funded by a grant from the Aylesbury Vale District Council New Homes Bonus Fund. We are anxious to know your views on this proposal, and have included a consultation form in this magazine, for you return to us. We should be grateful if you would please take time to complete it.



## MOVABLE EXCESSIVE SPEED SIGN INDICATOR

In the next few weeks a new speed sign will appear in the village. It is a mobile unit which has been jointly acquired with Stoke Mandeville Parish Council, and has been purchased with funds from Bucks County Council. Its first siting will be in either Worlds End Lane or Marroway. The equipment looks very similar to the permanent signs in New Road and Brook End, which remind drivers that there is a speed limit and to slow down if necessary. However, the new sign will also record



the speed of each vehicle approaching from the direction in which the sign is facing. The sign can be swivelled round to face traffic approaching from the other direction. The data recorded will be regularly downloaded into a computer, and if necessary will be passed on to the police. This should inform us of the volume of traffic and its speed at different times of the day and night, thus enabling the police to target the most critical times for speed offences. The equipment will be managed by teams of volunteers from both parishes.

## PARISH COUNCIL WEB SITE

Our Parish Council web site has been in existence for several years now. We have taken the decision to completely update it in the next few weeks. Not only will it look very different, it will have links to further useful web sites and allow the opportunity for feedback. ### 2015 ELECTIONS

In May, elections are being held for three levels of government: Parliament (MP); Local: Aylesbury Vale District Council (District councillors) and Weston Turville Parish Council (Parish councillors) The latter provides an opportunity not only for you to elect 10 parish councillors, but to become one of them yourself. It is an excellent way of being directly involved in the way the community affairs of the Weston Turville are run, and can be very fulfilling work. Contact Aylesbury Vale District Council in early March, and ask for the requisite candidate forms.

## <u>Query from last edition, Letter to Weston Turville from</u> <u>Elizabeth Taylor Burton</u>

Dear Mr. and Mrs. Hind: I want to take this opportunity to thank you for your thoughtful letter and words of kindness. It was good of you to take the time and trouble to write as you did. with all my best wishes. Yours truly, Elizabert Dayles Burton

Recently a letter came up for auction on ebay. Sent to a Mr. and Mrs. Hind at 260 Wendover Road by Mrs. Richard Burton in April 1965. Can anyone elaborate?

#### Roll up of comments received, with thanks to Janet and Frances.

Postcodes probably arrived in Weston Turville in 1971, so we shouldn't have expected one on the envelope.

The couple who lived at 260 Wendover Road were actually Mr. & Mrs. Nind (not Hind).

The letter that prompted the reply looks to have been commiserations rather than of congratulations.

Theories and conjecture on the original topic and how the Nind's could have known the Burtons:-

1) Could they have met at the Bell Inn (and Pavillion) at Aston Clinton which Elizabeth Taylor & Richard Burton visited and was less than 3 miles from the Nind's home in Weston Turville. It is likely that The Bell would also have been frequented by Nora Swinborne and Esmond Knight who lived in Weston Turville (as did David Attenborough, Guy and Dianna Mannering) and Vivien Leigh and Laurence Olivier who lived in Long Crendon. **2**) Original subject could have related to a collision in Dublin on March 3rd 1965. Her chauffeur hit a Mrs. Bryan who died. There are accounts of Elizabeth Taylor "jumping from her Rolls Royce and pillowing the dying Irish widow on a mink coat". Mr. and Mrs. Nind would have felt a great deal of sympathy for anyone involved in a motoring accident, their son had been killed by a car - in Buckland village, where they were living at the time.

**3**) Mrs. Nind was a midwife, and Elizabeth Taylor had a miscarriage while married to Nicky Hilton (1950-1952)

## **Easter Biscuits**

8oz Plain flour

4oz Butter

4oz Caster sugar

1 Egg

Lemon zest

Milk

2oz Currants

Glaze-egg white and caster sugar



#### Method

Cream butter and sugar

Add egg yolk and combine

Sieve in flour and add the lemon zest

Add fruit and enough milk to make a stiff dough

Roll out evenly and cut into rounds or shapes (Easter bunnies?)

Bake at 200 (180 fan) for 10 minutes

Remove from oven and glaze with egg white, then sprinkle with caster sugar

Cook for a further 5-10 minutes

## Hampden Hall Estate

This is our first Weston Turville Times update and I hope that this will become a regular feature in future editions.

Dog Waste Bin on The Green – The bureaucratic cogs have been turning and at long last a dog waste bin should be installed by the time you read this. There were various reasons for the delay but the main one was that as we've ordered a green not red coloured bin, it took 3 months to come from Germany. It will be sited on the far side of the green at the rear of the estate and emptied every fortnight.



Traffic Flow and Parking – The parking and traffic flow have been of concern for many residents on the Hampden Hall estate. In particular, hindrance of parked vehicles and the access for emergency vehicles have been highlighted to the Parish Council. A meeting was held with County and District Councillors, Thames Valley Police (Traffic), Bucks CC Highways Dept, Bucks County Council Locality Officer and Bucks Fire and Rescue Dept where a site visit was conducted and our concerns discussed.

It was recognised that any changes to the road layout would be very costly; however, the additional traffic that the new houses on the estate will generate, will require changes for safety reasons. It was suggested that:

- 1. Double yellow lines are put at the main entrance and exit of the estate.
- 2. The post box roundabout, at the entrance of the estate be marked up properly as a roundabout.
- 3. The one way system be re-installed (as was in place when the estate was being built).
- 4. The speed limit on the estate be reduced to 20mph.

Bucks Fire and Rescue Services will be undertaking "accessibility tests" at various times of the day/ evening and will report back to the Parish Council their findings.

At the Local Area Forum meeting on 21st January, it was agreed that £12,000 be allocated from the local area priorities budget for 2015-16 towards the installation of double yellow lines at the junction of Silver Birch Way and the Wendover Road, and for a report on the other traffic issues listed above

including any potential solutions. Please note the funding allocation does not include the cost of implementing all of the above, only the first point of the double yellow lines. Any other works will be decided upon after a consultation with all residents.

Sometimes, (thankfully very rarely on this estate) not all persons see eye to eye and it is not the job of the Parish Council to mediate on neighbourly disputes. If you have any issues with parking, noise etc that cannot be resolved, please contact the following agencies:-

## **Speaking the American Way**

The intrusion of American English into our own ways of telling and writing is both alarming and confusing. Which form of English should I be using? Well, I do know. But various forms of media seem to be less certain. American English, at its best, is admirable and commanding. English, in whatever form we use it, changes; new words appear, others are lost or acquire a new resonance. Things American, overwhelmed by an unashamed drive to succeed, infiltrates our culture, not least in newspapers, radio and television. I was reading a novel translated for American readers when I came across the word 'get go' or 'get-go', quite acceptable to them. I heard it more recently on a very British programme hosted in very Queen's English. That did jar and awoke me from my natural lethargy and innocence. The phrase is a corruption of get-up-andgo, an attitude for which the Americans are justly famous. We use this latter phrase too as in 'he really has get-up-and-go,' referring to his boundless energy. 'Get-go' on the other hand means from the beginning for which we have the admirable vernacular phrase 'from the off'. Scholarly English might use the Latin tag ab initio. The online Oxford English Dictionary tells me that 'get-go' is informal and mainly North American, but concedes that it is used in the UK.

While Americanisms feature in our language, there are significant differences between the two. The passive form (what happens to you) has limited currency in American English. Does this underscore the very 'getup-and-go' nature of Americans, an extremely active people who are always doing things to other people including themselves? Across the water they seem to prefer a plainer English, if the computer syntax checker is to be believed.

On occasion, I write to an Italian friend who is a translator. Nominally an email, my letter uses a personal style from the 'get-go' and in full, for I know he enjoys that richness, freedom and variety typical of written English. Once I sent him two versions, the original and a version of it subjected to the computer syntax checker. There, I found few of my sentences acceptable; the passive was vigorously and rigorously discouraged, active forms being preferred. The result was a very dull

version. What was my friend's reaction to the treated version? "By line three", he wrote back to me, "life was no longer worth living."

Webster first produced his American dictionary in 1826 thinking his English had deviated sufficiently to warrant it. Today there are many differences not least spelling viz. woollen (GB), woolen (US), verbs which end in –orise (UK) and -orize (US) an older form they have retained. Vocabulary too differs: lorry/truck, pavement/sidewalk, lift/elevator, car/auto and many others. American English prefers a preposition where we would use a direct object. I meet Fred while my American friend meets with him. There are past forms which differ. I pleaded in court; Americans pled. The most notorious difference is creeping too fast into our usage; 'I lay down' for both past and present. We use 'I lie down' and 'I lay down'.

Different forms of English are enriching and life-affirming, provided we know which are which and when to use them. Don't get me started on fun-filled Australian English!






Whilst I am in no doubt we have won a "battle" not the war, at least we should celebrate what is without doubt a massive community effort.




