- 1. Apologies for absence received from Eileen Riden, Mark Lordon
- 2. BA updated AS on the history up to date of the NP
- AS no sign of a lesser commitment from future governments
  Basic pitfalls: -
  - Consultation period incorrect, NP areas not kept to.
- 4. AS confirmed that there are aspects of road & transport that could be included as policies. e.g. development around junctions that are of major concern.
  - JD reported on A274 strategic route and junctions on this, 5 significant road junctions, traffic speeds AS these do not fall in to the remit of planning policy but can be put in to the plan separately as a community aspiration numbered.
  - Planning policy which deals with new development impact on roads and transport should be satisfactory.
  - Policy on encouraging footpath & cycle ways with new developments linking in to existing.
  - HGV's, speeding CIL money available. Priorities in plan on what this spending should be.
- 5. AS went through the process of the examination. Including which existing & emerging Local Plan policies are changing. Should be locally distinctive policies but generally conformative. If there's a degree of conflict but it is right for Sutton Valence then that is acceptable.
- 6. Several policies from other NPs were looked at and discussed.

## 7. AS initial impression of draft policies.

Comprehensive in coverage but ensure not a lot of description & analysis in front pages.

Chapter 6 beginning of community aspirations.

Goals and objectives but no overarching vision, which should be up front. Policy 1 Housing - too long, different policies, could be 3 or 4 policies with different issues. Snappier titles. Very firm & clear.

Try to separate out the issues and have different policies for each. Local green space ensure criteria in NPPF is hit. Pictures, surveys, comments.
