She noted that there has been huge support for Ukrainian refugees but that this has highlighted the need to support all refugees. HCC are currently consulting on Community Transport (until 24 th July). The consultation can be found on the 'Have your say' area of the HCC website. CIIr Price asked about the water supply during the current dry weather. HCCIIr Porter advised that there are no restrictions as yet. Two water schemes are being implemented, in Candover and Havent, to improve water resources but these are both long term projects.		
	2.3	Report from WCCIIr Stephen Godfrey: Cllr Godfrey noted that the timetable for the Local Plan has been revised (See also 2062.5 below). The inert recycling centre application for Three Maids Hill has been approved on appeal and a planning application has been received for an anaerobic digester on the site next to this. The cumulative effect of four applications on this site could be of real concern. Winchester City Council are reviving the Station Approach proposals and will be considering conducting a consultation on the way forward. Some clearance work has taken place at Bogmoor Sump but a tree is now a potential issue. HCCIIr Porter will chase HCC in respect of the sump. Pigeon House Yard residents have contacted WCCIIr Godfrey about the issues relating to the failed soakaway. The Clerk will contact Dave Ingram, WCC Environmental Health.
