## **Exhibition News**

#### Exhibition Friday June 16<sup>th</sup> – Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> June 2023 In partnership with Friel Homes

Friel Homes is interested in their company being associated with Lichfield Society of Artists. They are working on some of Lichfield's Historic Buildings in a most imaginative and sympathetic manner. (You may have notice 3 buildings on Beacon Street are currently being restored?) This partnership has enabled the Society to stage a longer show in the Guildroom on the dates above. There are indications that this friendship between Friel and LSA might well have longer term benefits to both parties.

- We would like as many artists as possible to submit at least one work based on Lichfield's Historic Buildings. (This is not a condition of entry)
- In order to have a balanced exhibition and to enable as many members as possible to exhibit, other subjects can be submitted as in previous LSA exhibitions.
- All work for the exhibition in June must be recent and not have been exhibited in any previous LSA exhibitions.
- The Lichfield Society of Artists is undergoing some big changes, to improve the quality of our work and our image in the eyes of the residence of Lichfield. An improved profile may well encourage new members, who in turn will help pay the bills.
- We remain an inclusive society for people of **all** abilities encouraging all members to participate in exhibitions. We will require **everyone** to present their work mounted and framed to a high standard. If you are new to exhibiting, please do ask if you need help or advice on presenting your work.

### Exhibiting 3D Work

At the time of writing, we are still unable to find a group insurance for 3D work. Those members who would like to show 3D work will need to have their own Public Liability cover. Planning is in progress for a slightly different approach for the exhibiting of 3D work and we hope to be able to give you details soon. At the February Meeting there was some discussion as to where this could be found at a reasonable cost. If you are looking for **Public Liability Cover**, you might like to try: -

- The Craft Potters Association
- The A-N at <u>www.a-n.co.uk</u> There are criteria you have to meet to be

There are criteria you have to meet to be eligible, so read the list carefully. This is more for the Semi-professional / professional artist or someone involved in "arts" practice.

- You can take your own policy out with the SAA but do check your individual policy covers the type of 3D work you do. Looking at the web site it can be a bit misleading! They are not offering cover to societies for 3D work as it is deemed too risky by the insurers.
- G M Imber and Sons: <u>www.gmisl.co.uk</u> The company are brokers. You can get a Craft Insure policy through them for about £55 p.a. There are some exclusions relating to the types of art / craft businesses they will cover so do check the List. This is a basic cover and one that will be accepted by craft fair / exhibition organisers cover is £5million.
- Or you can google craft worker insurance and get quotes from providers listed. You need to look for cover of £5million for the Public Liability section of a policy. This is the amount of cover usually required by craft / art event organisers.
