"Call for Sites" - Linton Crossroads remains an issue with a significant shortfall in developers' monies to pay for it. The only way to fill the funding gap will be via new large developments. Failure to have the Crossroads modified in timely fashion will mean those developers who have been obligated to allocate funds monies will have their returned....those are the rules.

Fridays Ltd have acquired Reed Court Farm in Hunton for "free range" chicken egg production on a huge scale with plans for 192,000 chickens in 3 large houses. This is on our Parish doorstep, just on the other side of the River Buelt opposite Wares Farm Berry Gardens' site.. You can view the Linton Parish Council letter sent on your behalf to Maidstone Borough Council on our website. (Planning consultation 20/505751/EIFUL Reed Court Farm Hunton Road Marden.)

Maidstone Borough Council have advertised their Action Plan to enhance **Biodiversity** and (significantly) address climate change. The latter deals with the fact that we have warmer and wetter winters, incidence of which will no doubt not have escaped your attention. Details can be found on their website by searching "Biodiversity and climate change emergency". Pastoral Letter from the Rev Peter Callway You don't need me to tell you that we are in the midst of a global pandemic at the moment. It's everywhere you look, all the conversations with friends. pervades everything. Probably rightly so. It really is important that we do all we can to stay safe and keep others safe. Yet, there are those who deny that the pandemic is real, or it is a plot by the communists/right wing politicians/liberal elite/big tech to infect the world with a virus/microchip/fake news in order to supress/repress/remove the rights of/control the world's population. Getting accurate information is more challenging than ever in a world of instant online social platforms and 24/7 news channels. Who do we believe? Do we trust our governments? The scientists? The newspapers? The BBC?

One thing we can trust is our own experience. I've had COVID-19 and it is most unpleasant. As an overweight, asthmatic, 65-year-old I was at risk of serious illness, but I am grateful that I am over it and working off the after effects. I am still struggling with shortness of breath and my thinking capacity is diminished. (Insert your own

joke here (3) Seriously, it is not be recommended, and my father died from it. He had a weak heart and other underlying conditions, but it was the COVID which finally ended his life. One exchange I had with a chap who described himself as an "Apostolic Pentecostal Christian" had him saying that it was a severe lack of faith to wear a face covering and asked the question WWJD? (What Would Jesus Do?) My response to that was that it was not a particularly helpful question because he was God, and we're not, but that Jesus taught us that the greatest commandments are to love your God with all your heart and soul and mind and strength, and to love your neighbour as yourself. Wearing a face covering, washing hands, staying home, keeping distance when out are not showing a lack of faith. They are

showing a love of neighbour. Isn't that what Jesus would want us to do? Stay safe and well. Peter

Do you remember the winter of 1962-3? It started snowing on Boxing day 1962 and lasted to the end of March 1963. Heath Road was blocked for several weeks by drifting snow from Linton . At the entrance to Clock House Farm a Maidstone & District double decker bus was stuck for a week or two. The snow fences did not help.
