Our Skanska colleagues in Hampshire Highways are also committed to using one day a year to support their local communities and charities.

So far, they have used these 'Lend a Hand' days to renovate part of a playground for students with learning disabilities at Hook-with-Warsash CofE Primary School, clear space at Wicor Primary School in Waterlooville for planting in their ecological area, and re-bed an area for plant growth at Furzey Gardens in the New Forest for the Minstead Trust.
