In order for this magazine to exist, we have to thank the advertisers who provide the finance in the form of advertising revenue. From this income the magazine has to cover all its costs in terms of paper and LaserJet Ink toner. Additionally we needed to purchase new printers as they get a lot of usage each month. Any excess revenue is held in a bank account to be used as and when new printing equipment is required and to hold a reasonable surplus in case of lower advertising income in the future.

In the early days of the magazine, when advertising revenue was low, we were in the very fortunate position of having the magazine printed by a printing firm that was owned by Eddie Brooke and he very kindly did not charge for the printing. In that period we accumulated a reasonable surplus.

Since July 2007 the printing of the magazine has been done in-house and subsequently we have had to bear the cost of printing in terms of paper, ink, printers and folding/stapling equipment. Unfortunately night flying is always a sensitive issue, but an essential part of a pilot's training. Whilst we are fully aware of the environmental impact of aircraft operations, we endeavour to minimise nuisance to our neighbours in the local community as much as possible. However, squadron pilots must remain current on night flying techniques, and operational and training requirements will necessitate some flying through the night period.

You can be assured that the crews conduct their sorties within the prescribed regulations, and that all flights are pre-authorised. Each sortie is thoroughly planned by the crew and must be approved by the Duty Authorising Officer. We do not conduct flights unnecessarily, or with disregard for the public. We only carry out the minimum training to meet our training requirements. We are acutely aware of the disturbance caused by the Chinook, and we continually strive to balance this with our mandate to provide the British Army with the safest means of transport for our troops in high threat ground zones. Care is always taken in choosing the clearest and safest routes and we do routinely avoid over-flight of towns and large villages. In our continued efforts to minimise nuisance to the local populace existing procedures and routes are continually monitored and reviewed with regard to noise abatement and the sensitivities of the community in which we work and live.

As you are no doubt aware, there is a continuing presence in the Gulf region and we have crews out in Afghanistan where they are operating in dangerous and volatile environments. It is therefore essential that they practice in the UK, so the ability to operate under threat is second nature.

#### **NEWS FROM ULCOMBE'S VILLAGE SCHOOL**

#### In the News

After the last month's Village Newsletter went to print, on Saturday 24<sup>th</sup> April, the school's football team took part in the annual Lenham tournament. We played six games winning one, drawing four and losing one. With several Ulcombe shots hitting the post during the morning the team were really very unlucky not to progress through to the semi-finals. Well done to the team for playing and representing the school so well!

Owlets have started swimming this term, and they are thoroughly enjoying their weekly trip to Mote Park. Tawny Owls had a great trip to the Canterbury Environmental Education Centre on Tuesday 27<sup>th</sup> April. The trip included taking a walk along the River Stour. The children learnt that the Stour has its source near to Ulcombe, in a back garden in Lenham, and meanders its way through Ashford, Canterbury and Sandwich, then finally to its mouth at Pegwell Bay. They also completed a variety of activities on the topic of water and rivers. This was also the first educational visit for which we have been able to use the local schools' minibus. The rules and regulations on who can drive it are very strict, so it is great that Mr Sheehan and Mrs Sharp have recently been able to complete the necessary training.

SATs are very much in the news at the moment. We carried out these tests for children in Year 6 in the middle of May, despite the boycott that has affected schools across the country.

Unfortunately Cricket Club has not been possible as planned, because Leeds and Broomfield Cricket Club have been unable to get a coach to run this. #### **The Grafty Gourmet**

This recipe comprises of Chicken marinated in spices, served with a traditional yoghurt sauce. They can be grilled or for an even more authentic taste, put them on the BBQ.

#### **Authentic Turkish Chicken Shish Kebab**

Makes up to 20 kebabs

4-6 chicken breasts 20 Cherry Tomatoes 2 Red Peppers

#### For the yoghurt sauce:-

150g plain Greek yoghurt 1 clove of garlic, peeled and grated 1 tablespoon chopped flat-leaf parsley A squeeze of lemon juice A pinch of Salt

#### For the marinade:-

1 cup plain Greek yoghurt

1 tablespoon paprika
1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
1 tablespoon ground cumin
1/4 teaspoon cayenne pepper
4 garlic cloves, minced
Juice of 1 lemon
6 tablespoons olive oil
1/2 teaspoon fresh ground black pepper
1/2 cup grated onion

- **1**. Combine all marinade ingredients in a bowl. Dice chicken into 2cm cubes and add. Cover & marinate in fridge for 6 hours or overnight.
- **2**. De-seed Peppers and chop into 2cm squares. Thread the chicken, tomatoes, and peppers onto wooden skewers.
- **3**. Cook for 7-8 minutes each side or until the chicken is thoroughly cooked and golden brown. Turn the kebabs frequently and baste with the marinade from time to time until evenly cooked.
- **4**. For the yoghurt sauce, simply mix the yoghurt, grated garlic, parsley, lemon juice and salt in a bowl. Serve with the kebabs.

We have again seen an increase in the theft of plant pots and other garden ornaments, particularly in front gardens. This is a usually crime trend for this time of the year and we would like to warning you to secure any desirable objects in the hope that we can prevent any further crime. If you can secure them to an object that cannot be move, such as a wall or a fence then do so. There have also been incidents in previous years where solar light have been taken, they are usually just stuck in the ground with a spike and easy to remove, consider cementing them into the ground.

The list has to be submitted two weeks beforehand. ID **MUST** be taken (Passport or Photo driving licence) and we meet at 6.30pm at the venue.

#### **The June Night Sky**

At the start of June the Sun is in the constellation of Taurus, and moves into Gemini on the 21<sup>st</sup>. New Moon occurs on Saturday 12<sup>th</sup> June, and will be visible in the north-western sky at sunset. Full Moon occurs on Saturday 26<sup>th</sup> June, in the southern constellation of Sagittarius.

It will not be possible to see Mercury this month, as it is at superior conjunction (almost directly behind the Sun) on 28<sup>th</sup> June. Again this month Venus is visible in the western sky as soon as it starts to get dark, and sets in the northwest in late evening. The "Evening Star" is so brilliant, it can even be seen in the twilight sky.

Mars is high in the western sky at dusk and sets in the northwest after midnight. This month the "Red Planet" appears about the same brightness as Regulus, but shines with a steadier more orange light.

Jupiter rises in the east around midnight, and should be visible low in the southeast at dawn. The giant planet is less brilliant than Venus, but can still be seen even against a brightening sky. Saturn is high in the south-western sky at dusk and does not set until well after midnight. The three planets, Saturn, Mars and Venus make a line from left to right across the evening sky. The famous rings can only be seen through a telescope.

Some of you may have read that Japan has successfully launched the world's first spacecraft drawing its energy from a huge solar-powered sail. The spacecraft, named 'Ikaros', which stands for Interplanetary Kite-Craft Accelerated by Radiation of the Sun, works on the same principle as a yacht. Once in space the 66ft ultra-thin sail will be unfurled, and solar particles from the Sun will hit this sail and propel the spacecraft towards Venus. As the force acts continuously in a resistance-free environment, the craft will eventually be able to reach speeds 10 times greater than any conventional rocket. The spacecraft will also have solar powered engines, which will be used primarily for steering. Scientists believe that Ikaros will take six months to reach Venus.

The technology is widely considered to be crucial for space travel in the future, with laser light replacing sunlight as the ultimate aim.

#### **Christian Message June 2010**

"Greater love has no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you.....This I command you, to love one another." (John 15:13-14, 17)

This quotation from John's gospel came to mind as I heard of the deaths of yet more British soldiers in Afghanistan. Coincidentally this news came on the day when we remembered, in our daily prayer, those men and women who died for their faith as martyrs in the  $15^{th}$ . and  $16^{th}$ . centuries. These two events cause me to ask, what am I prepared to die for? Could I, would I, be prepared to die for my Christian beliefs?

In England, thank God, we are none of us likely to be called on to give up our life for our faith. Sadly this is not true for Christians in other parts of the world. In Iraq, India and some parts of Africa, amongst other places, although seldom mentioned in newspapers or on television or radio, Christians are subject to persecution and murder by their neighbours. Churches and homes alike are destroyed by those who would see Christianity destroyed in their particular part of the world.

Whilst death and destruction are not being used in this country against Christians yet there still seems to be an attempt, by some, to bring about its demise. We have seen attempts to force faith schools to teach sex education in a way incompatible with their churches' teachings, so called 'equality legislation' appears to be geared to prevent Christians from exercising their right to protest against things they believe to be wrong and any story, however incorrect, that appears to show a church leader in a bad light is seized upon and given banner headlines.

Whilst it is sadly true that we, as Christians, do not always live up to the standards we profess to believe in, it is equally true that many of us strive to fulfil the demands of our faith and are deeply hurt when others fail and bring religion into disrepute.

These musings bring me to the inescapable question, what as a Christian am I prepared to do to defend the faith? What can I do? Which brings me back to the quotation at the head of the article "......love one another". That is the central command of Our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ; that is what we are called to do. To love the other when the other does not love you, to love our enemies and not just our friends, this is how we show the worth of our belief and, in so doing, how we may overcome the current antipathy to Christianity.

Prove the value of Christianity by living out Christ's command day by day; love one another.

#### **The Dover Road**

(An extract from a late 1920's edition of the "Newnes motorists touring guide")

"We are, in tracing the Dover Road, on the ancient Watling Street, that road which, in common with many another Roman Highway, was based upon an already-existing trackway. It is a superstition that Roman roads are always and inevitably straight. They are straight within limits, but are generally re-aligned, according to the needs of the case, upon certain points, in varying lengths. Between Dartford and Strood the Roman road, in order to avoid the low-lying lands beside the Thames, which were on the straight line, was taken over the hill of Swanscombe. At some remote period this stretch of ancient road, which branches off to the right on the common of Dartford Brent, was deserted. The climb over the steep hill was too much for mediaeval travellers, and as in the meanwhile the Thames-side lowlands would appear to have become less water-logged, the Dover road was deviated that way, through John's Hole, Horns Cross, Greenhithe, Northfleet, Gravesend and Milton.

The long-deserted Roman road has in recent years been again adopted, and, after the completion of great engineering works, involving deep road-cuttings, was reopened by the Prince of Wales in 1924. The chief object of this reconstruction was to provide a direct – and still more – a clear route; for the riverside way through Gravesend is alike narrow and congested."
