## PARISH COUNCIL MEETING NOTES - 26TH JUNE 2014 AT 7.30PM IN THE VILLAGE HALL

**Present:** Simon Bust, Andrew Paris, Sarah Godfrey, Glenys Herbert, Janet Simmonds **Apologies:** Chris Bevans **Severn Trent – water pipeline to Southwell** There were no representatives present from Laing O'Rourk or Severn Trent. Work is well underway now. There was an accident involving a car and a Severn Trent lorry; the Severn Trent vehicle drove away and the incident has been reported to the police. It is not known at this stage whether the lorry was involved in the pipeline construction

Village Hall: Lettings have increased and now cover running costs. The projector screen is still to be mounted. The Lancaster Bomber memorial picture is to be put up in the corridor

**Roads and Hedges:** Pot hole patching has been completed out on Holme Lane. The problems with water at the top (Oxton Road) end of Radley Road are ongoing but Highways are well aware of the issue and it should be sorted. The Turnpike is still experiencing flooding problems. The new drain put in a year ago does not seem to be doing the job as planned – Highways are aware that more work needs to be done. Hedges need cutting back: beech hedge on The Turnpike, and hedge at St Michaels Close – Clerk to sort. Hedge along School Lane is now reaching power lines – Mrs Godfrey has reported this to the power company

Halam website: Chris Bevans and Andrew Paris – ongoing

**Phone box & Bus Shelter:** Thanks to Finlay Strathern & Alex Podmore -- the bus shelter, phone box and the area by the crossroad's bench are looking clean and tidy. Andrew Paris contacted BT about the state of the paintwork of the phonebox - will be painted as part of their maintenance schedule

Southwell Neighbourhood Planning: Mrs Simmonds attended a meeting in Southwell to find out about any proposed developments affecting Halam. Mrs Herbert is on the Southwell planning sub-committee. They will monitor the situation Correspondence: 1) Nottinghamshire Minerals Plan 2) NALC – new President & Vice-President 3) Consultation on Underground Drilling 4) Community Commemorative Fund – poster to be put up on the village notice board 5) Rural Housing Policy Review – village has already completed an affordable housing survey 6) The Beat 7) Local Audit consultation 8) Electoral Boundaries – Halam will come under Southwell ward with three District Councillors

**Planning:** 1) Waggon & Horses, The Turnpike – erection of new external signage and lighting – agreed unanimously to support this application 2) Field ref no: 8297, Wolfeleyhill Lane, Edingley – erection of a single wind turbine with a maximum blade tip height of up to 77m and associated infrastructure buildings including: upgraded and repairs to existing access track of approx. 1850m length; new access track extension of approximately 205m length; a crane pad (measuring approx 16m x 20m); and substation

After a lengthy discussion and contributions from members of the public, it was unanimously agreed to register the parish council's objection to this proposal on the following grounds:

 impact on the landscape – damage to an area of natural beauty 2) loss of amenity of neighbouring properties 3) amount of widening and damage to local lanes for access 4) precedent – it was agreed that this proposal could lead to more turbines being erected at this site

**Planning Decisions:** The following applications have been approved by N&S District Council:

1) <u>New Holbeck Farm, Radley Road</u> – steel portal framed building for the housing of livestock and straw – agreed unanimously to support this application 2) <u>Ashcroft House, Gray Lane</u> – householder application for construction of two-storey and single-storey extension to form improved kitchen and bedroom accommodation and inclusion of new ground floor WC **Finance:** The cheque purchase of the projector for the village hall was approved and signed The End of Year Accounts were signed

## WESTMINSTER ABBEY ORGAN RECITAL



#### PARISH COUNCIL MEETING NOTES - 14TH AUGUST 2014 AT 8.00PM IN THE VILLAGE HALL

Present: Simon Bust, Andrew Paris, Chris Bevans, Sarah Godfrey, Glenys Herbert, Janet Simmonds Severn Trent - water pipeline to Southwell

There were no representatives present from Laing O'Rourk or Severn Trent – Mrs Godfrey will contact them to try to ensure they attend the next meeting in September. **Road Closures** 

Newhall Lane - 22 Sept to 31 Oct Radley Road - 26 Aug - 25 Sept (maybe longer)

Access will be maintained to Brockley Farm. Mrs Godfrey to write to Severn Trent requesting pedestrian access at all times to the Hoggards' Farms on Radley Road

**Village Hall:** The projector screen to be mounted is a position so as not to obscure the Millennium Map. Special brackets made be needed; Mrs Godfrey & Mrs Herbert to investigate. There is £70 remaining in the "projector budget" and it was agreed that this could be spent on brackets/mounting. The projector can be hired along with the hall (but not to be taken out of the hall) – an extra charge will be made, suggested £20. This is to be compared with charges made by other local village halls.

The weeds at the front of the hall need removing/treating - Simon Bust to sort

<u>Harvest Supper</u> Chris Bevans showed the meeting a draft poster and ticket\_Harvest Supper & Games Night to be held Friday 10<sup>th</sup> October - Donations of homemade apple pies for the supper would be appreciated

**Roads and Hedges:** Most hedges have now been cut back. the hedge under the power-cable on School Lane will be cut back in September (when the power will be turned off for a day) Warning signs at the bottom of Cultersforth Lane – discussed with County Cllr Jackson, but due to budgetary constraints it is unlikely that these would be put in place Highways have been out again to look at the drains on Radley Road – more work still needed; Cllr Jackson to discuss further with Highways

Sewage from drains in St Michael's Close – the Clerk to talk to District Cllr Bruce Laughton to get Severn Trent to sort this. Pot hole patching has been completed out on Holme Lane. The problems with water at the top (Oxton Road) end of Radley Road are ongoing but Highways are well aware of the issue and it should be sorted. The Turnpike is still experiencing flooding problems. The new drain put in a year ago does not seem to be doing the job as planned – Highways are aware that more work needs to be done. Hedges need cutting back: beech hedge on The Turnpike, and hedge at St Michaels Close – Clerk to sort.





## PARISH COUNCIL MEETING NOTES - SEPTEMBER 2014 MEETING

<u>Present:</u> Simon Bust, Andrew Paris, Chris Bevans, Sarah Godfrey, Glenys Herbert, Janet Simmonds <u>Matters Arising – drains at St Michael's Close:</u> Severn Trent have visited but could offer no solution to the sewage spills other than routine annual maintenance; the fall from the close to the main drain is very shallow. The Radley Road drains are to be inspected with a camera for any blockages. County Councillor Bruce Laughton will have further discussions with Severn Trent as this problem needs sorting properly.

**Severn Trent – water pipeline to Southwell:** Mr Brent Eastell, representative from Laing O'Rourke, outlined the progress with the water pipeline. Radley Road should be open again after 22<sup>nd</sup> September, but some temporary restrictions will be necessary in the future for final connection to be made. Newhall lane will be closed from 22<sup>nd</sup> September for a month – access will be maintained for Brockley Farm. Mrs Godfrey will contact Severn Trent to find out if some funding will be made for village hall improvements as discussed at the start of the project.

<u>Village Hall:</u> The projector screen has been mounted and used for a film show by Halam W.I. Speakers (and amplifier?) are required for the hall – Chris Bevans to look into

<u>Harvest Supper</u> Harvest Supper & Games Night to be held Friday 10<sup>th</sup> October\_Ticket sales are underway – please buy your tickets early so that we know the number to cater for. PLEASE NOTE: there will only be very limited tickets available at the door – get your tickets now from Chris Bevans to avoid disappointment

**Roads and Hedges:** The hedge under the power-cable on School Lane will be cut back next week (when the power will be turned off for a day)' Highways have now agreed that remedial work is needed to the drains on the Turnpike and will put this on the list as a "priority" before the winter weather causes this to become a road safety risk. The problems with water at the top (Oxton Road) end of Radley Road are ongoing and Highways are working with local landowners to try to sort this.

<u>Halam website:</u> Chris Bevans is investigating the costs of having this hosted externally with updating/content being accessed by individuals in the village.

**Phone box & Bus Shelter:** Andrew Paris reported that the phone equipment will be removed and the light left in working order. The parish council signed the contract to adopt the phone box. BT has stated that they will remain responsible for the electricity supply costs.

The phone box and bus shelter are being cleaned by Alex Podmore and Findlay Strathern. Many villages have found different uses for their phone boxes, for example local information centres, or book exchange libraries. The parish council would be very interested in suggested uses for our phone box here in Halam.

Angela was a Derbyshire lass, born in Heanor, on the 9th March 1948 a second daughter for Bill and Olive Meakin, the 7 year gap between the two sisters caused by their father's war time service. Angie was born prematurely and spent the first month of her life wrapped in tin foil, in an incubator at Derby Hospital.

Bill Meakin was an Electrical Engineer and Surveyor, and they moved several times during Angie's early years until they settled in Southwell in 1959. She was a pupil at the Edward Cludd school and following that attended Newark College where she trained as a shorthand typist. Her first job was quite local, at Boots Research Centre, Thurgarton, but she furthered her career by moving to work in the offices at Brackenhurst College – this was where she worked until she moved to the farm. Angie met Vic Shaw through mutual friends (Phil and Shelia Handley) at a dance at Trebeck Hall, in

1965 when she was 17. 6 years later Angie and Vic were married on a very wet Saturday, 15 May 1971, in Southwell Minster. In 1972 the newly wed couple moved to the farm in Halam where they were to spend the rest of their lives, and started a family. Sally was born in November 1973 and Richard came along 3 years later in November 1976.

A love of the countryside pervaded all of Angie's life, particularly wildlife and plants, and there was always a house full of pets when the children were growing up. Autumn was her favourite time of year - she loved to see all the different colours and hues as she went on her many walks in the area.

In February 2001 Angie suffered a stroke, but with the support of family and friends, and lots of fresh country air, worked hard on her recovery – very successfully. When Richard Shaw took on the Waggon & Horses she was part of the team behind the scenes, helping with the food and the general upkeep, but she would often pop out to chat to villagers at the bar.

She was a very sociable person and loved being out and about, attending Tea @ 2.30, or Edingley Horticultural Society – she would much rather drop in to see someone than call them on the phone. Her keen participation in the (surprisingly successful!) Waggon Ladies Darts team brought her an expanded group of friends in the village – the team will miss her in future matches. Her family received a card following her untimely passing in which was written; "Angela was such a lovely person, always there with a smile, and ready for a chat and a laugh". One couldn't hope for a better epitaph.

Severn Trent – water pipeline to Southwell: Work is progressing and Radley Road is now open, but there are still some cuts in the road surface. These may be to do with the final connection when the road will be closed again for a day – Laing O'Rourk will be contacted to rectify if the cuts are still there after this final connection. There is a large gap in the hedge opposite Manor Stable and the Radley Road verges have been made flatter which could potentially cause water run-off problems – Clerk to contact Severn Trent/Laing O'Rourk. Severn Trent have offered £1,000 towards works on the village hall in view of the disruption caused to the village during the works. Mr Eastell, from Laing O'Rourke, will be invited to attend the next meeting. Village Hall: Speakers to work with the village hall projector – Chris Bevans is prepared to hire his speaker for use in the village hall instead of the parish council having to purchase its own. If demand increases then this situation will be reviewed. Key from the key box has gone missing - any information please to the Clerk or Chris Bevans. There is a hire charge fee outstanding from June – it was resolved to take further action if this debt is not settled in the next two weeks.

Harvest Supper – 35 tickets sold at present. The sausages have been kindly donated by Stoppards Butchers, Farnsfield Roads and Hedges: The hedge under the power-cable on School Lane has been cut back by Western Power.

Halam website: A parish council Facebook page is being trialled. This would be easier to keep up to date and would be more interactive. Situation to be reviewed at next meeting. Please like the <u>Halam Parish Council</u> Facebook page. Phone box & Bus Shelter: Clerk to add the phone box to the parish council insurance.
