### A41 – Road Safety initiative

It has been agreed that smart cameras will now be installed on the A41. Whilst this is good news, it is not yet known where they are likely to be installed. There is some speed testing to be completed before the decision on where they are to be sited is taken. We continue to be optimistic that the Four Crosses area will be included in siting zone.

Despite these difficulties, we also have an opportunity to reset the council to ensure that it can provide the best services for Shropshire now and into the future. On a positive note, I am very pleased that we ended 2025 by finally securing the finances and engineering plans for the A41 Average Speed Camera project that many of us have been working on for many years. Working with Telford & Wrekin Council, Shropshire has also started a separate investigation into highway improvements along the A41 which we hope to see secured over the next few years.
