Update on the Traffic Calming Scheme in Grafty Green Village

Boughton Malherbe Parish Council, has been extensively lobbied by local residents to introduce measures aimed at reducing the speed of vehicles and discouraging lorries through Grafty Green village centre.

The perception is that there are a number of vehicles exceeding the 30mph speed limits.

There is concern regarding safety, and also the impact on the tranquility of our small rural village. There have been a number of requests for chicanes through the village, or a scheme similar to the one in Doddington village near Faversham/Sittingbourne.

Please find below a summary of the proposed BMPC planned Traffic Calming Scheme in Grafty Green Village.

The first part of this process was to demonstrate need to Kent County Council (KCC) Highways as we require their agreement for any measures we wished to introduce.

Following initial discussions with KCC Highways (Jenny Watson, Schemes Project Manager) we were advised to conduct a traffic/speed survey as the first step.

This was completed through Grafty Green village from Monday 2nd July for one week last year, 2018. The cabling ran across the road by the Kings Head Pub garden. Cost of installation and data production \pounds 295.00 + KCC Licence fee £92.50 excluding VAT

We received traffic/speed survey results at the end of July which was not the easiest to interpret and therefore a meeting was arranged with KCC in September 2018 to review results & discuss next steps. The following is a brief summary of this survey compiled by KCC.

At this meeting with KCC we were informed that the survey did not show that the location was a "hot spot", therefore, would not qualify for KCC funded traffic calming

measures - including chicanes. KCC, however, said they would support us with a series of other measures which we would have to fund ourselves.

These proposed measures were set out in a draft Highways Improvement Plan (HIMP) which was approved by the Parish Council.

The next stage was KCC required a feasibility study to outline our proposal with costings.

This was to include:-

- New Village Plate gateways to include white gates, new village nameplates, plus 'please drive carefully through our village', red tarmac and 30mph roundels (which means painted in black on the red part of the road) - located at each end of the village
 - (i) Northern end adjacent to Stream Farm;
 - (ii) Southern end either beside "Hillside" or opposite "Barnside"
- 2) Cobblestone chicanes or painted chicanes (as in Doddington Village) in the village centre adjacent to the village green, pub and post office and ,in addition, as you enter the village centre from the South alongside the "Homestead" and "Quince Cottage"
- 3) Mobile radar signs (SID Scheme)

Following discussions with KCC Highways, and a survey of the village which was undertaken in October 2018, a number of issues were raised. We subsequently took the following action as set out by KCC Highways.

- 1) A working party began clearing vegetation from all roadside signs and cleaned the signs with soap and water.
- 2) We further surveyed either side of the village centre to identify more appropriate potential sites for Gateways as stipulated by KCC. All measuring more than 1.5 metres.

Further, we formally requested that KCC refresh all white lines throughout the village and on either side of the carriageway on the hill (Liverton Hill) leaving the village towards Liverton Street to emphasise it is single track.

In December 2018 following further consultation with KCC, the mobile radar signs had to be abandoned as we failed to meet their criteria.

However, BMPC agreed to appoint a consultantancy firm to carry out a feasibility study with the production of an outline costed design so KCC Highways could check and approve that our plan met all their required standards.

We initially invited bids from 5 Consultancy firms and eventually choose MLM, Road & Traffic Consultancy. They came recommended by another Parish and their quote included obtaining KCC and Technical approvals.

Cost Site Visit £ 550.00 Design. £ 4,400.00 Stage 1&2 RSA £ 1,200.00

Total £ 6,150.00 excluding VAT.

BMPC agreed to this next step in January 2019.

MLM drew up initial draft plans and these were approved by BMPC at meeting on 12th March 2019

We had a further approval meeting with KCC Highways (Jenny Watson and Paul Leary, Schemes Project Managers) on the 11th April when they agreed to the proposed plan with a few minor agreed stipulations

- 1) Omit centre line by Stream Farm
- 2) Use Glasdon Signage
- 3) Remove existing roundals
- 4) Remove 'dragon tooth' road markings at the start of 'Gateways'.
- 5) There will not be any future maintenance by KCC of the red tarmac, so we need to ensure the initial installation is done correctly, (e.g. take out top 40 mm and resurface SMA, then top with High Friction Red Tarmac)
- 6) The work will not include raised kerbs to the cobbled chicanes hence 'virtual calming' although KCC are content with Timber Bollards with reflectors at the start and finish of all 4 chicanes.

We have since confirmed that KCC now have a specialist team to do these types of road works, which would include a two year warranty, and organising appropriate road closures and inspecting the works on completion. We have therefore, pencilled in for the work to be completed by KCC through the school summer holidays starting the end of July 2019 when traffic is significantly reduced.

Final drawings with minor adjustments were prepared for and agreed at the Parish Council Meeting on the 13th May. Cllr Annie Allum will visit all residents in adjacent properties to fully explain the planned works and answer any concerns or queries.

All proposed plans will be displayed on BMPC Noticeboard and website.

Finally, costings will be done along with Road Safety Audit and BMPC to agree final funding.

Our Aim - KCC to be employed to commence work as provisionally booked, in July 2019.

Kent Household Waste Recycling Centres

Following the public consultation undertaken last year, it can be confirmed that the Kent County Council Cabinet Member for Planning, Highways, Transport and Waste, has now endorsed the recommendation for the 'charging for the disposal of non-household waste materials (soil, rubble, hardcore and plasterboard) at KCC Household Waste Recycling Centres'.

The charging policy starts on Monday 3rd June 2019 at all 18 Kent Household Waste Recycling Centres, with details as follows:

Soil, Rubble & Hardcore:

£4 per bag*/item. Limited to 5 bags/items per day

Plasterboard:

£6 per bag*/sheet.

*Any bag up to the size of a standard black sack.

Payment will be by card only and there will be a dedicated member of staff to assist customers when they arrive at site with chargeable waste items.

Make this version of a takeaway favourite, complete with chilli and garlic sauces. Serve with pitta bread, shredded cabbage, sliced onion and chopped tomatoes.

Doner Kebab:-

500 g of lamb mince
1 small onion
4 cloves of garlic, minced or finely grated
100g of fresh breadcrumbs
2 teaspoons of ground cumin
2 teaspoons of ground corriander
1 teaspoon of dried oregano
1/4 teaspoon of smoked paprika
Sunflower oil for oiling

Yogurt and Garlic Sauce:-

3 cloves of garlic, minced to a paste 150ml pot of plain yogurt 1 lemon – juiced 1 teaspoon of dried mint (optional)

Chilli Sauce:-

400g tin of chopped tomatoes
2 tablespoons of tomato ketchup
1 small onion, grated
2 cloves of garlic, finely chopped or grated
1 to 4 chopped red chillis (depending on how hot you want it).
Pinch of sugar
1 tablespoon of white wine vinegar

- 1. To make the kebab, heat the oven to 200C/180C fan. Tip all the kebab ingredients except the oil into a food processor with a large pinch of salt and lots of ground pepper. Pulse until everything is combined and chopped together. If you have not got a food processor, you can just squish everything together in a bowl but this will give you a looser finish.
- 2. Oil a large sheet of foil. Tip the meat mix in the middle and mould to a very thick sausage. Roll up the foil tightly, twisting up the ends to create a Christmas cracker shape.
- 3. Lay on a shallow roasting tin and roast in the oven for 35-40 mins, turning occasionally.

Whilst the kebab is cooking make the sauces as follows:-

- 4. For the Yogurt Garlic sauce, simply mix all the ingredients together and season with salt and pepper add a splash of water if you want to make it a drizzly consistency. The mint is optional but goes nicely with lamb. This sauce can be made the day before.
- 5. For the Chilli sauce, simply tip all the ingredients into a food processor with a pinch of salt and blitz to make a sauce.
- 6. When the kebab is cooked, remove from the oven and leave it to cool a little. Then unwrap the foil. Place back on the tray and brown under the grill.
- 7. Place on a board and carve into thin slices. Serve with warm pitta bread, shredded white or red cabbage, sliced onions and chopped tomatoes. Choose your sauce, chilli sauce or garlic yogurt sauce.

- 5. Change the Vibrate and Popup options and also change the colour of the light.
- 6. To stop receiving notifications for a specific group, Select the group, then go to menu, select Settings then select Mute notifications.
- 7. Tap and Hold down any message in any chat to Star it. You can then find it easily later in the Starred messages main menu.

Councillor's Report for Newsletter, May 2019 Results of Maidstone Borough Council Elections

As many of you probably know, Maidstone Borough Council holds elections in three out of four years. This is because the term of a Borough Councillor lasts for four years, and a third of seats are up for election each year. This year, they were held on 2nd May.

The results meant that the hung Council remained, with the seats allocated as follows: - Conservatives 24 seats, LibDem 20 seats, Labour 4 seats, Independent Maidstone 2 seats, and various Independents 5 seats. At the first formal Council Meeting, on Saturday 18th May, Martin Cox (LibDem) was re-elected as Leader of the Council, and a new Mayor was appointed, Marion Ring. In Maidstone, the Mayor is a non-political position, and you may meet the Mayor at many different events and ceremonies across the Borough.

After the Council Meeting on 18th May, a civic parade was held, led by the Mayor, and including the 36 Engineer Regiment and the Queen's Gurkha Engineers exercising their Freedom of the Borough and the right to march through the town with fixed bayonets, ex-servicemen, the Police Cadets and the Sea Cadet and the Councillors, followed by a service at All Saints Church, Maidstone.

Your Councillors for Headcorn, Ulcombe, Grafty Green, East Sutton, Hawkenbury and Boughton Malherbe are Karen **Chappell-Tay and Martin Round**. If you have any issues which you have raised with the Council, which you feel have not been sorted, then please contact one of us and we will do our best to help.



Our Bishop, the Rt Rev Trevor Willmott retired in May. During the 9 years of his ministry in Canterbury he has become fairly well known in the Len Valley and has confirmed many of our church members.

In his farewell Faster letter to the Diocese Bp Trevor wrote that the story of Easter is not a fairy story but a story of It is the hope from hope. which all others take their meaning. In his words, 'it is not wishy-washy а phenomenon but the assurance concrete of a victory already won.' 'Vain optimism,' he went on ,'will not solve the divisions of our age nor will the temptation to give in to despair'. Quoting the epistle to the Hebrews, the Bp wrote 'Faith is the

assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen.'

He maintained that the Church is called to be a beacon of hope in our parishes and communities. Hope is hard and it is always costly to those who seek the way of reconciliation, justice and truth. 'Faith is the gift of God to his people, ' continued the Bp and the church is called to live and embody the kind of hope made real by faith – life changing concrete hope. Though we, the Diocese may be small in number and financially challenged we must not give in to despair. **We are people of hope.'**

Bp Trevor commented on the stories he has heard of those engaged in church-run food banks, night shelters and debt advice centres. 'I hear', he wrote, 'of people coming to faith through simple and honest human contact and compassion.'

As we in the Len Valley look back with gratitude to the ministry of Bp Trevor and Mrs Willmott let's pray for his retirement and heed his call to be a beacon of hope.
