Application to remove the "age-restricted" condition for purchasers for the 16 houses being built. Original planning permission was given in 2016 and 2017. The original building contractor employed by the developer went out of business and the site is re-starting this year.

20/01704/HOU Old Smithy, 16 North Street

Replacement of two greenhouses by a log cabin 19/0290/LBC **Hamdon Youth Centre, West Street** Various internal alterations to create new service facilities and spaces for activities.

- Once connected you will be prompted to type in the meeting ID plus #, then #, then the password plus #. You will be placed in a 'Waiting Room' until invited to join.



All microphones will be automatically muted from the start of the meeting. If you wish to participate in the public session your microphone will be unmuted when you are invited to speak.
