#### FROM THE RECTOR OF THE EAST TRENT GROUP OF CHURCHES JUNE 2014 – David Yabbacome

Easter marked the first anniversary of my institution as Rector of the eleven churches and fifteen communities which make up the East Trent Group of Churches. And quite a year it's been! With so much to take in and learn I still struggle to put names to faces and faces to locations. Despite this challenge I continue to enjoy enormously the responsibility of being the Parish Priest to so many communities. I came to be Rector of the whole Group, and the learning process of becoming the East Trent Group continues to be a challenge to all our churches. Many people observe that my job is impossible, but in response I've taken to reminding such doom-sayers that the church started with only thirteen people, of whom one met death through crucifixion brought about by the betrayal of one of the others who then removed himself. Now see that the Church is a worldwide fellowship of millions. And East Trent is only a small part of that worldwide fellowship.

As the years pass and the life of the Church is organised in different ways so we need to move away from how things were "in the good old days" (and our view of that is too often through rose-tinted specs) to what fun we are having in the present age. Only yesterday I had a conversation in one of the East Trent churches about how good it must have been in times past to see the church full unlike the present age (the conversation was with someone who doesn't come to church). I had to point out that the churches have rarely been full, in that sense, but they are full of, and a visible sign, of God's love in our communities.

During the year I have been privileged to share in many things. The joy and wonder of Baptisms and Weddings, together with the joy, sadness and wonder of Funerals, and many other significant family and community events. Little wonder that my job is such fun, particularly as I look ahead to the continuing growth of our churches in warmth of fellowship and faith.

### HARBY HISTORY GROUP -Louise Herrick 703662

Our March meeting was titled "Meet the Ancestors". Each member took it in turn to tell the story of a past family member. Plenty of items were brought along to display, including photos, medals, passports, jewellery and a tea towel. We heard stories of hardship, sadness, bravery and fun but the constant theme was "I hardly know anything about this family member. I wish I'd asked more before they or others that knew them well had died."

In April, we visited the Bailgate area for the Lincoln Ghost walk. We started at the Castle and followed our guide as she took us to and told stories about Brown's Pie Shop, the Cathedral, Greestone Terrace, and the White Hart amongst others. The tales ranged from scary, gory and amusing to sometimes, just sad or tragic. We also spotted historic parts of the Cathedral Quarter that we had perhaps ignored in the past.

The response was that everyone thoroughly enjoyed the trip and that when our guide told us at the end of the tour that there was an alternate route with different stories, it was agreed that we should look at booking this for the History Group for next year.

Our next meeting is on 27 May at 7:30pm and is a talk by archaeologist Jane Young. Along with her helper Jo, she will bring along Saxon & Roman pottery from a Lincoln archive & allow a hands on approach that you wouldn't get in a museum.

On 24 June, Paul Croft will be returning to give an illustrated talk about his latest conservation projects, which in the past have included stately homes and Bletchley Park.

Meetings are on the last Tuesday of the month in the village hall lounge and unless specified start at 7:30 pm. £1 entry and everyone is welcome. Please phone me if you want more information or even just a bit of encouragement to attend. New members welcome on a regular or casual basis.

### ST HELEN'S CHURCH, THORNEY – Jenny Whittaker

Every morning for the last 35 years, I have opened our bedroom curtains and looked out over the familiar St Helen's church: a magnificent example of mid- 19<sup>th</sup> century architecture; the dream of an optimistic Victorian.

Imagine my surprise then, when after a few days away, I returned to find that in place of this parish gem stood a timber clad structure seemingly ready for demolition. They're turning into a bingo hall! I thought: the fate of so many Victorian churches in towns and cities, nowadays.

For St Helen's, though, demolition was not the order of the day, but restoration; some of it intensive and well overdue.

But why bother? Thorney doesn't have the largest congregation and there are two other churches on the doorstep?

Well, first of all: "You won't find any other churches in the country quite like St Helen's," says Steve Anstey, today's stonemason. As with many other English churches, St Helen's is grade 2 listed, but it is the architecture and the singular design of this church that makes it so special and a significant building worthy of preservation.

In 1567, George Nevile, a descendant of one of England's greatest families, purchased the Thorney Estate, which included a small Norman church. However, in 1849, confident that Thorney would develop and prosper, his Victorian heir dreamt of replacing the old Medieval building with one much larger and, for a tiny village in Nottinghamshire, more imposing, than before.

Not one to do things by halves, and perhaps with visions of grandeur, the ambitious Christopher Nevile commissioned Lewis Nockalls Cottingham to design his new church. Cottingham was an eminent figure of the first half of the 19<sup>th</sup> century, an architect and writer who had designed, remodeled and restored several significant buildings, including the cathedrals of Rochester and Hereford and the chapel of Magdalen College, Oxford.
