Patients aged 75 or over (or will turn 75 by 30 June 2024) are being invited for a COVID booster vaccination. Also, appointments can be booked online at <https://www.nhs.uk/get-vaccination> or on the NHS App. You can find your nearest COVID-19 vaccination walk-in site at <https://www.nhs.uk/covid-walk-in>. **30 June 2024** is last date to get a booster vaccination .

The NHS launched the **Pharmacy First Service (PFS)** on 31st January (see NHS Pharmacy First Service (PFS) | NHSBSA) Appointments can be booked directly with participating pharmacies for the treatment of 7 common health conditions namely sinusitis, sore throat, earache, infected insect bite, impetigo, shingles, uncomplicated urinary tract infections in women.

Pharmacists can offer advice to patients and supply NHS medicines where clinically appropriate. This will help reduce the pressure on Morland House Surgery. Group Consultation Clinics – We are excited to offer group clinics for certain health conditions, currently menopause and diabetes. The benefits are many including a more thorough examination of your condition, having your questions answered, sharing issues with others going through the same issues, and spending longer with a GP.

These 16 trees are just the beginning. We're now starting to fund raise to pay for the remaining trees, tables and benches for the autumn. In the meantime, feel free to wander down and enjoy the trees as they spring back into life.

PARISH COUNCIL

We have had the goals on the recreation ground for nearly 20 years and they are becoming rusty near the ground. The most recent RoSPA play equipment inspection stated that they should be replaced, so we have bought some new goals and by the time you read this they should have been installed.

The passing places on the road to Cuddesdon Mill are becoming increasingly dangerous again because of the potholes which are appearing in them. The County Council's view is that this is a road without passing places so maintenance of the areas where traffic does pass is not their responsibility. This is why the passing places are not in a very good condition, and we are investigating filling in the potholes ourselves.

Also, the muddy laybys which have appeared near Coombe Wood on the road to Wheatley are getting bigger and more unsightly and we are seeing if we can fill these in. Their removal might also reduce the amount of fly tipping in the area.

Natta, the contractors at Dove House, had some success in reducing the amount of water flowing across the road from their site, but unfortunately it has now returned. We have asked the County Council to channel the water to the drain immediately below where it is coming out of the bank.

Natta volunteered to install a drain on the inside of the corner opposite Dove House Lane so at least the water is not flowing any further down the road.

The County Council had proposed planting seven trees on the High Street verge and at The Green. They were due to plant the first two on the verge opposite the village hall but there was a local objection so this is not going to be done. I am not sure what the status is of the other five trees.

Denton Hill is going to be closed for eight days from 13th May for fibre optic cable installation.

NO SERVICE ON BANK HOLIDAYS



The quality of our water courses is something that I know concerns many constituents. It concerns me too. This is why I recently joined with my local colleagues to write to the Chief Executive of Thames Water to seek more action to tackle the sewage pollution in our waterways across Oxfordshire. We appreciate that Thames Water have confirmed an additional investment of at least £815 million to help tackle sewage pollution and cut sewage overflows by 84% by 2050. However we feel that this time frame is too long, and we would like to see more investment and thus quicker results. We have asked to meet to discuss this further. Alongside this I am pleased at the recent Government announcement of a tough new inspections and enforcement regime, increasing their oversight of water companies with the Environment Agency carrying out inspections.

On a completely different subject, anyone who has ever got caught up in expensive legal proceedings may appreciate that Alternative Dispute Resolutions can be helpful. This area of resolving disputes is something with which I have been involved and is a growing area. In 2021 I introduced a Private Members Bill to Parliament to allow an apology to be given that is genuinely and sincerely meant without creating a legal liability. This bill did not complete its passage through Parliament before the end of the 2019-21 session, but the Lord Chancellor confirmed the Government would consult on the issue when Parliamentary time allowed. I was therefore delighted to receive a recent letter from the Lord Chancellor to let me know that he was launching a consultation that could see the essence of my Bill become law.

Another area that has generate contact from constituents of late is around the increase in the use of vapes by young people. I have been advised that the number of children using vapes has tripled in the past three years, with 20.5% of children having tried vaping in 2023. While the use of vapes is not risk-free, they have been useful as a means to help adults stop smoking. However the increase in use by young people is worrying. The Government is seeking to address this through the Tobacco and Vapes Bill which would prohibit the sale of vapes to young people. The Bill is currently going through parliamentary process. I do appreciate that some adults who are smokers are content to be so but there are many who seek to quit especially given the known health risks. The Government's Swap to Stop Scheme is helping people give up and the Bill seeks to ensure that this is not an issue for younger generations.




