Valentine's Double

This time last year, I wrote about Jesus reading from a scroll of the Prophet Isaiah in the synagogue. The text he read out included the following:

*The Lord has sent me to bring good news to the oppressed,
to bind up the broken-hearted,
to proclaim liberty to the captives,
and release to the prisoners;
to comfort all who mourn,
to provide the oil of gladness instead of sadness.*

The world today needs this message as much today as it did in 2025, in the time of Jesus and the time of Isaiah.

That ancient text still challenges us to show compassion to those with greater needs than our own. Sometimes a kind word is enough but let us allow ourselves to be stirred to further action according to our gifts and resources. On the global scale and in the smallest communities

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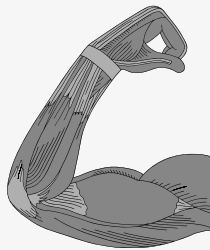
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the mediator, the problem-solver, the generous giver of time or money or warm clothing or a listening ear, and the practical person who fixes a broken gate or re-builds whole town. and the wise person who can help mend a broken heart or a rift between nations– all these people. and many others, play their parts when they step forward for a near neighbour or onto the world stage peace and gladness to others. These are not all other people – we can be counted among them.

In the Church calendar, the month of February opens with the Feast of the Presentation or ‘Candlemas’. We recall that the child, Jesus, who, at his birth, was manifested to the humble shepherds of the region and to the wise men from the east is now recognized by old, wise and faithful Simeon and Anna, when he comes to be presented in the Temple according to the Law of Israel. He is acknowledged as both ‘a light to lighten the Gentiles’ and ‘the glory of God’s people Israel’. But the salvation that he will bring must be won through suffering. His mother is told that her heart will be pierced. She will bear some of the price her Son will pay to redeem the world. His fulfilling of Isaiah’s words brought joy to the world, but it was costly to him.

Even the story of Valentine’s Day, celebrated in the middle of the month, has its roots in suffering. Confusingly, Valentine was not one but two separate people, who shared the same name and were both martyred in Rome. One was a bishop who was taken to Rome and martyred in 273. The other was a priest who was also martyred in the middle of the third century but under a different emperor. There has been much speculation and misunderstanding surrounding these martyrs.

Although few facts can be gleaned for either Valentine, it can be said that truth exists in both their stories. Both Valentines serve as a reminder of the difficulty of living as a Christian in an era of persecution. That is certainly, still true today at certain times and in certain places. And yet, for many people Valentine’s Day is a source of joy and a celebration of human love.

How did we get from martyrs in Rome to doves and love-hearts, elaborate greetings cards and chocolates? Perhaps, the change owes its existence to John Donne (poet and priest), who wrote a marriage song for Princess Elizabeth, the daughter of James I who married Frederick V, Elector Palatine, on St Valentine’s Day in 1632. His marriage song merged the religious commemoration of Valentine with fertility symbolism. Possibly a pre-Christian festival and the promise of chicks in nests and baby animals emerging later in Spring also contribute to the modern celebration of the day.

As our thoughts begin to turn from Christmas to Easter, from long dark winter nights to the early signs of spring, my February message remains one of us all doing what we can to bring hope and joy to others by liberally sharing ‘the oil of gladness’ wherever we find sadness or need.

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West Meon School start into Spring

A flurry of snow at the start of our term meant playtime was extended and children had a fun-tastic time. The joy of a small school setting is that we can respond to changes in the environment without too much fuss. Hoglets, our group of reception children, took a snow walk and found enough covering to create snow-angels. They also investigated the vegetation trapped in ice and brought in examples to see what happened as they warmed up inside.

Our school values of Respect, Courage and Creativity all come into play when we look at our science curriculum. Hedgehogs class have been exploring habitats; as part of this we show respect for the world around us, ensuring small mini-beasts are replaced from whence they are found. Courage is found in various forms as children work together, investigate wooded areas and encourage each other to present their ideas. Invention and creativity are encouraged as children plan their own questions and begin to explain causal effects. Our science curriculum recognises that to understand our world we need to experience it so it is not surprising that a number



of our tasks are caught on camera, rather than on paper. Owls are studying Space this term and this will include a visit to Winchester's Space Centre to view their amazing Planetarium and experience their workshop. We have also had a visit from 'The Hedgehog-man', who visits the school to share information about these shy creatures and give children a chance to observe them close up. Trips and visitors offer an enhanced experience for our learners and enable them to understand that 'learning' doesn't just happen in school.

Shortly after our February half term break, we will be taking part in World Book Day which takes place on Thursday 5th March. As a school, we will be organising a Book Week where we focus on reading and literature in the various forms it now presents itself. As we now have a school library, we will be setting up book challenges in this dedicated space. Our Extreme Reading Challenge will be in its second year and looking to become an annual event at West Meon Primary. Children capture an image of themselves reading in unusual places, or in the case of our budding gymnasts, in unusual positions. What a great way to celebrate the love of reading!

Friends of West Meon School (FOWMS) have been thinking about ways to raise money to support the school so keep a look out for events coming up in the next month or so; their aim is to include the local community when possible. They raised a staggering £93.83 with the very popular 'Make your own Rules Day' at the end of term.

As you read this, we will be hoping to have arranged a visit to Warnford to view the snowdrops – what a great start to Spring!

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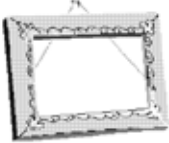
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The Upper Meon Benefice

You will, I am sure, recall many of the discussions about the legal formation of The Upper Meon Benefice covering the current parishes of Warnford, West Meon, East Meon and Langrish. Many of you in Langrish especially, and East Meon too, will recall the meetings, discussions and heart-searching, over quite some time now, about the closure of Langrish Church for worship and the merger of the parishes of East Meon and Langrish.

I can now report that the Church Commissioners considered our case at one of their committee meetings (5th November 2025) following a period during which representation could be made. At that meeting, the Commissioners agreed that the Scheme should proceed as drafted and period of time to allow for application for leave to appeal this decision followed.

By way of reminder, the draft Scheme provides for terminating the current interim arrangements (called a plurality) established for the three benefices of East Meon; St John the Evangelist, Langrish; and West Meon and Warnford. It provides for the formation of the Upper Meon Benefice out of the benefice of West Meon and Warnford (their constituent parishes to remain distinct) and the new single parish of East Meon and Langrish. It also covers the appointment of its first incumbent (Rector) and where that person shall live and who the patrons of the parishes will be. And finally, it states that the parish church of St John the Evangelist, Langrish is to be declared closed for regular public worship.

Although many of us will understand why Langrish Church has to close, it is still very sad. Our prayers should remain with the people of Langrish, some of whom have had connections with the church over many generations. We shall ensure that the final service there will be a joyous thanksgiving and that the Langrish community will be feel completely at home in the Church of All Saints. We have now had confirmation that the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council has received no application for leave to appeal against the Commissioners' decision to approve the scheme. Quite a lot of hard work remains to put everything in place for the merger of Langrish and East Meon, in particular, after which the Scheme will be made. This will be at such time as has been agreed by the Bishop, by me and by the officers of the PCCs representing the parishes. It is then and only then that its provisions come into effect.

So, we now know that the Upper Meon Benefice will come into being later in the year. Until then, Langrish Church will remain in use, but after that it will close for worship and responsibility for the building will fall to the diocese and the future use for the building will be determined. We all owe the officers of the PCCs a huge vote of thanks for their hard work and for the careful, thoughtful and sensitive manner in which they have gone about it. Any change can evoke strong emotions. Change, like ours, through unfamiliar and complex processes can be frustrating to say the least, and when that includes something held dear being lost, all these responses are heightened and tinged with sadness. We need to look out for and look after each other. Welcome and fellowship must our watchwords as encounter old friends and make new ones. Our ambition must be to be so welcoming that our new friends will include those who don't yet know that they want to join us. As we come together, let us do so in a spirit of Christian compassion and companionship, working together not only for our parish but shaping OUR new Benefice (designate). Let us renew our identity as God's people striving for the breaking in of his Kingdom among us all.

For your part, thus far, thank you all.

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Winter on the riverbank

Even in the heart of winter, rivers, streams, and ponds are teeming with life – including with one of our most endearing and much-loved mammals, the water vole.

Known affectionately to generations as “Ratty” from *The Wind in the Willows*, water voles are Britain’s largest vole, roughly the size of a guinea pig, with a rounded body, blunt nose, small ears, and a furry tail. Their thick, chocolate-brown fur often appears almost black when wet, and their whiskered faces give them a gentle, inquisitive expression. Unlike rats, which they are often mistaken for, water voles have shorter tails, smaller ears, and a much more compact shape. They are excellent swimmers and can often be seen paddling confidently through the water or perched on the bank nibbling vegetation.

Water voles were once a common sight along riverbanks and wetlands. Sadly, habitat loss and predation by invasive mink caused numbers to plummet. However, thanks to dedicated conservation work, these charismatic creatures are slowly returning to our waterways.

Hampshire and Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust is helping water voles through the Watercress & Winterbournes scheme. This partnership, funded by the National Lottery Heritage Fund, focuses on restoring chalk streams, improving water quality, and managing riverbank vegetation to create safe habitats for water voles and other wildlife. Volunteers play a vital role in maintaining these habitats, monitoring populations, and controlling non-native predators like mink. The scheme doesn’t just benefit water voles – it supports a wide range of species, including fish, invertebrates, amphibians, and birds that rely on healthy, well-managed rivers.

Winter can be a surprisingly good season to spot them – if you know where and how to look. Even though they are less active than in spring or summer, their presence is betrayed by clear

signs along the banks. Keep an eye out for neat, nibbled patches of grass with characteristic 45° angled cuts, small burrows tucked into riverbanks, and tiny droppings along the water's edge. It's essential to keep dogs away from the water so these sensitive mammals aren't disturbed.

With leafless trees and shorter vegetation, riverbanks and wetland edges are more visible in winter, making it easier to spot burrows, tracks, and signs of feeding. Quiet walks along streams, ponds, and winterbournes – particularly in early morning or late afternoon – offer the best chance of glimpsing these secretive mammals.

HCC tells Government: ‘Elections should go ahead this May’

Following a special meeting of Hampshire County Council on Monday, and then its Cabinet today (15th January), the Authority has now written to Government to tell them that the county’s 1.4 million residents should continue to have their say at the polls this year – particularly as central Government already postponed 2025 elections in areas like Hampshire to enable work to go ahead on delivering ‘fast-track’ devolution.

“Local Government Reorganisation will see strong, high-performing essential services broken up and redistributed across Hampshire and the Solent area - things like social care to protect children at risk of abuse or neglect, the complex care of our older residents, as well as the maintenance of our network of over 5,000 miles of roads. This is an inevitable consequence of reorganisation. But any extra capacity to deliver LGR should come from delaying reorganisation, and not at the cost of residents having their say at the ballot box.”

Central Government will make the final decision whether or not elections go ahead.
