Heavy Goods Report

OCC has now made it very easy to report overweight lorries making their way through the village. You simply access the OCC website as follows:

Any suspected breaches of highway weight restrictions can be reported by logging the following information:

- Date, time and location of incident
- Direction of travel
- Registration No, Company name or other distinguishing marks, colours etc
- Any comments
- Photos can be uploaded

If you express willingness to provide a statement if the matter goes to court, action can be taken by OCC; if not, no action can be taken against the lorry driver.

Although expressing a willingness is important often if sufficient details are provided you will not need to join in with court. And many successful prosecutions have been achieved.

Applications for admissions to primary and secondary schools for next year

The following information comes from Oxfordshire Schools Admissions Team who deal with all applications to Oxfordshire County Council or Academy Primary and Secondary Schools in our area.

We are actively encouraging parents to make online applications. There are benefits of doing this, they know that the application has been received and not lost in the post, they can make any changes they wish up to the closing date and this is the only way that they can find out the outcome of their application on National Allocation Day as an automatic email will be sent. They are also able to respond to their offer by signing into their account rather than having to post a response form to us.

The booklets 'Moving On' and 'Starting School' will not be distributed to schools as a paper booklet but they are available on the public website for parents to look through or to print off.

The online portal is now open for secondary applications and the closing date is 31 October 2016. National Offer Day is 1 March 2017. Emails and letters (second class post) will be sent that day.

The online portal is not yet open for primary, this will open at the beginning of October and the closing date is 15 January 2017. The National Offer Day is 18 April 2017 and email and letters, again by second class post, will be sent this day.

The primary offer day is in the middle of the Easter holidays.

COMMUNITY SPEEDWATCH

The Parish Council have received complaints concerning speeding through Stanton Harcourt and Sutton and as a result will, if there is sufficient support, set up a Community Speed Watch Group.



To set up a local group there needs to be a minimum of 6 people and depending on the type of role they wish to undertake they may need to go through a vetting process and specialist training.

SpeedWatch can only operate in areas of up to 40 MPH speed limit. Community volunteers work alongside Thames Valley Police officers to identify vehicles which break the speed limit.

Have you noticed.....

The village Notice Boards are currently in a sorry state – the notice board which was located near the Green has recently undergone major surgery and will be reinstalled very shortly (if not already by the time you read this!). The board will be located in a slightly different place; by the parking places on The Green. The board at the top of Steadys Lane will be refurbished in the very near future, as will the board outside the Village Hall.

Parish Council Meeting Agenda and Minutes

New waste and recycling calendars now online

West Oxfordshire's new waste and recycling collection dates are now published for the next 12 months and can be viewed and downloaded online at www.westoxon.gov.uk.

As well as accessing online bin collection calendars, residents can register for handy weekly email alerts about waste collection dates, including a reminder the day before about which bins to put out and helpful information about changes to collection days over the Christmas period and bank holidays.

Over 8,000 householders are registered for email alerts and receive weekly email reminders of their next collection.

Paper copies of the waste calendars are available for those that do not have web access. These can be picked up from:

- The District Council's Town Centre Shop and Elmfield offices in Witney.
- The Guildhall, Chipping Norton.
- Burford Visitor Information Centre.
- Carterton Town Council
- Woodstock Town Council.

As well as bin collection information, residents can use the alerts service to receive information about planning applications registered near to their homes.

The Eynsham Link

The recent loss of the 18 bus service has left many people in the five villages between Standlake and Eynsham without the means of getting to work, school, college, etc. at regular and predictable times every day.

A group of local residents has implemented a car and lift-share scheme that aims to provide the five villages with a new kind of transport service. **The Eynsham Link!**

The scheme is based on a card system: Circular windscreen discs for drivers, and rectangular ID cards

for lift-seekers. These discs and cards are individually numbered, and colour coded according to home village (red for Standlake, Green for Northmoor, Blue for Bablockhythe, and orange for Stanton Harcourt and Sutton). The individual numbering and colour-coding ensures, firstly, that members of the scheme can identify each other, but it also tells drivers where a lift-seeker wants to go, and tells lift-seekers whether a driver is going as far as their destination.

The end and beginning point of all journeys is Eynsham Church Square. Lift-seekers wait on one of the benches in the square. Drivers who subscribe to the scheme are asked to always detour past this point on their way home, to see if there is a "Linker" waiting.

So far we have nearly 200 members; 40 are non-drivers who have been the worst affected by the loss of the 18 bus. The majority are drivers, though some members have discs and ID cards, as drivers who would occasionally like a lift. We hope that in time many car-share arrangements will develop alongside the lift-giving. There is a master list of all Linkers, with addresses, telephone numbers, and/or email addresses. Eynsham Link has its own email address and a Facebook page, for members to comment, criticize or make suggestions of how the scheme can be improved. We have recently established a WhatsApp group, which is proving very useful in enabling better communication between members who are "en route".

The scheme started on July 21st, and early signs are encouraging. But we need many more members.
