1. Report and update from the attending GP Partner: Dr Bassett reported that Dr Railton will remain as a Partner until end of March 2024. Dr Jones will work until 2026 as a salaried Doctor but also carry out some Partnership roles. Dr Bassett will continue until Summer 2028. The new temporary clinical rooms have been installed and just need fitting out and equipping, they will enable Dietician, Physiotherapist, Mental Health Worker and possible students to be accommodated. An advertisement has been placed for a new GP, and a video made. Dr Bassett is cautiously optimistic about being able to recruit a newly qualified GP. The advertisement and video will be available on the new Practice website and a copy of the advert will be available so that it can be forwarded to contacts.

Dr Bassett is also in the process of purchasing some additional land to increase parking space at the Ditton practice, and wants to complete some internal redecoration of the building.

2. Matters Arising from the last meeting:

- a) The publicity was very successful especially the TV filming in Ditton area. Radio Shropshire, Midlands Today lunchtime and evening, Shropshire Star, Bridgnorth Journal, BBC website all featured the Practice, and there was a very good article in Pulse Magazine, which is distributed free to all GPs in the country.
- b) Care and Share pantry Neither Sam nor Kerry were able to be at the meeting, but they reported that usage still remains low, with the most popular items being toilet rolls and toiletries. The donation box in the Surgery is reinstated and working well. A cash donation from the Bowls Club will be used to buy an additional storage box for books, games and toys which will be available in time for the school holidays. The organisers would like everyone to use the Pantry and make it more of a 'community swap' in order to take away stigma.
- c) Message from Claire Parker. Claire is planning to come back to talk to us again, she assures us that Brown Clee is very much on the radar of the Integrated Care Board. Celia Motley also confirms that key individuals from ICB and Council are talking to each other and are very supportive of the initiative that the Practice is taking.
- d) Patient group mailing list most email addresses are working now, and 6 patients are linked with 6 volunteers to hand deliver documents to them. Bob Lee offered to help to move the email lists from Outlook to Mailchimp, and John Pickup offered to help with how to use Mailchimp. Caroline John has already offered help on the communications side as well.
- 3. <u>Brown Clee Community Choir</u> A cheque for £300 was kindly donated to the Patient Group by Ruth Jones who had organised a Choir Concert in June. It was agreed that it would be appropriate to use some of that donation to purchase the sound system used in meetings. A further donation of £20 was

received from a patient who could not attend the Concert. The PPG account is managed by Will Ranson and Bill Lewis.

4. <u>BCMP Committee</u> – David Bleser is the Chair of the group which is looking into how the Community can purchase the Surgery buildings. He introduced the Committee members, who are all patients of the Practice, and gave a presentation on the research and preparatory work that the Committee has undertaken and the recommended way forward. He said that there would be further meetings in Ditton Priors, Diddlebury and Chorley Village Halls when patients would have the opportunity for a more in-depth discussion and to ask questions, and give their views on the proposals. 5.
