

BEXHILL-ON-SEA TOWN COUNCIL Lone Working Method Statement Town Crier

I. Introduction

- 1.1 Town Criers, due to the nature of their work, will spend a certain amount of time working alone
- 1.2 This may or may not be on Bexhill-on Sea Town Council's business.
- 1.3 This method statement (in conjunction with the Risk Assessment) is a set of guidance for the occasions when the Town Crier finds themselves on their own.
- I.4 It is worth noting however that though Town Criers may work alone, they are rarely in isolation, as by definition their task requires an audience of listeners.

2. Hazards

2.1 Hazards are as listed in the risk assessment but include attacks by people and animals.

3. Supervision and Monitoring

- 3.1 The Town Criers are supervised, when on council duties, by the Town Clerk or the Assistant Town Clerk.
- 3.2 The Town Council keeps a diary of events to which the Town Crier has been requested.
- 3.3 The Town Crier has a responsibility in highlighting any incidents or accidents whilst on official business. These will be collated and monitored by the Town Council.
- 3.4 The Town Council will, on occasion, watch the Town Criers in their work location to monitor their working practices and safety.

4. Safe Working Arrangements

- 4.1 The appointments of the Town Crier will be known from the diary.
- 4.2 The Town Crier will have contact details for the relevant officer at the Town Council
- 4.2 The Town Crier should confirm with the Town Council (by text, phone call or other medium) their arrival at the 'Cry' location.
- 4.3 The Town Crier should confirm their safety with the Town Council at the end of the 'Cry' (by text, phone call or other medium)
- 4.4 Any incidents or accidents whilst on a 'Cry' should be reported to the Town Council at the earliest opportunity.
- 4.5 These instructions apply fully to the Junior Town Crier but will be dealt with by his chaperone.
- 4.6 It is advised that the Town Crier applies these rules to any private 'Crys' they may undertake.

5. General Safety Advice

- 5.1 The Town Crier has responsibility for their own and others safety under legislation.
- 5.2 In all instances it is better to avoid dangerous situations altogether if necessary, the Town Crier should cancel a scheduled 'Cry' rather than taking a chance. The Town Council welcomes any advice from the Town Crier on how we can keep them safe.
