From the Rectory

I have been here for over seven years as the Rector, and I admit to having been cautious about being drawn into debate about the marriage of people of the same sex.

Some of you will be aware that the Bishops of the Church of England have finally recommended that there should be prayers of blessing for same sex couples following a civil marriage. The proposal was accepted by the February General Synod meeting of the Church of England after a long debate.

I am aware in our churches of a range of opinions. There are those who really don't see this as an issue at all, who are increasingly frustrated by the church's position which they view as unjust and out of step with society. There are others though, who are troubled by this as something dear to them, the traditional view of marriage, is being tampered with. Locally, I have heard both views expressed.

I have tried to understand both sides. For all Christians, the Bible must be a serious and central part of the debate, and I have heard Christians of differing persuasions use the Bible to justify their own positions! There is no doubt that overall, the Church

has much to reflect upon. Unquestionably, same sex couples have felt excluded and hurt. On the other hand, I do not believe it is right to automatically brand everyone who continues to hold to a traditional view of marriage as homophobic, and that has certainly happened. This debate has resulted in painful polarities.

I have really wrestled with this. A recent conversation with a clergy friend helped me, as we both realised that we wanted to emphasise the grace of God, open to all, rather than persist with increasing discomfort in a view that continues to perpetuate what will only be seen as a cruel judgement.

This has taken me a long time, but I now believe the way forward should be along the lines of what happened with the marriage of divorced people. It must be to be left to the individual clergy concerned, whether he or she, with integrity and in good conscience, can take a full and proper marriage ceremony. The present solution is simply kicking the can down the road, leaving just about everyone upset. It is too far for some, while for others, it legitimises a first and second-class status of marriage in the Church. I believe that it is inevitable that a ceremony celebrating the marriage of people of the same sex will eventually be offered. It is complicated, and people will have to decide what their relationship with the Church will be when that happens, but trying to find a halfway solution, with the offering of prayers of blessing is simply prolonging the pain. If I were a member of the General Synod of the Church of England, I now know that I would vote for change.

Old Field Footpath Improvements

A team of volunteers carried out work at Old Field in February to improve the footpath which has been regularly waterlogged over the past few winters. Funds to enable us to start this work were raised at a recent Quiz evening - thanks to our village quizmaster Alan Pickett.



View from Views

Spring is well and truly on it's way, in fact from about the middle of January the birds were making themselves heard, presumably starting to find a mate. What it is to be young! These birds by the middle of February are frantically getting their nests ready for their forthcoming activities/nuptials. A few days ago a



small flock of "Peewits" or to be correct "Lapwings" were seen foraging on a neighbours Wheat, a sight not seen for many years. Seen them fly over on occasion but, never on the ground. I believe they frequent some of the wetlands further up stream from here. These are one of species that are noticeably depleted due of course to modern farming. In mitigation to that fact I remember at a tender age when first allowed to drive a tractor on my own, one of the first jobs I was allowed to do was Harrow a field of corn for weed control, no sprays then. I was instructed to lookout for "Peewit's" nests some of which my father will have marked. I think this indicates that we were concerned about nature in those days, I guess it was the mid 40's. I noticed a month or so ago a few birds I could not identify, possibly Golden Plover, Stone Curlew. More recently I saw a pair in the same place. This is very interesting, as we have not seen either for some time.

I don't know if it is me or not – perhaps someone else has the same opinion that the second bout of frosty weather seems to have had more affect on plants then the first.

Anyone travelling along our road, (known as Windmill Hill) may have noticed a dead deer on the road verge, presumably hit by a vehicle. We speculated as to its type. We are reliably informed that it was a Chinese Water Deer. A similar deer had been seen on the farm some days earlier. These deer are not that common around here although, as another has been seen since the demise of this one, obviously there were two. Add to this a lonesome Buck was resident on the farm for several months a few years ago. Strange what some of these wild animals do.

The president of the NFU was recently invited to no 10 by the PM who, she reports, seems to understand the importance of food security, a very reassuring fact. It would now be good to see how this affects future discussions but I won't hold my breath. It seems also he understands the problems within the food chain; in other words the power of the large supermarket chains who actually dictate future direction of agriculture. This to us is a big issue, so it is important that it is well understood within Government.

Since I last wrote we learn of more land being turned over to nature reserve with the release of Beavers amongst, no doubt, other species. This release is not a million

miles from here which, if they can be kept under control, will not present a problem. I find this difficult to comprehend, as they are an animal that thrives on chewing wood so, how on earth do we think they can be properly restricted to their designated area? Their supposed benefit is to hold back water. Great, in the right places. Here we we have, for some time now, suffered from fallen trees just downstream where our neighbouring landowner needs to agree to remove them. This causes extra flooding on our flood meadows which now are not even suitable for grazing animals.

There are moves within parliament to open up the countryside to give more public access. This is fine except it potentially will create real problems for us. Whereas most of us welcome the public on our land, we are lucky in this area as those that use our footpaths etc, do not in any way cause us a problem but, in some areas, this is not the case, as we learn of real concerns. These are the increase of livestock worrying from dogs, due to greater dog ownership, litter, gates left open. Add to this, where paths cross land that is wet walkers, understandably, taking alternative routes, destroying even more crop than the designated width of a footpath. This also applies to Wild Camping where visitors have been known to leave equipment, with areas desecrated by fires, and other misuse that may seem innocuous. All these issues are extra pressure on nature (wildlife) from not only agriculture but development of all kinds which seems to abound whatever. I make these points so that people can perhaps understand where farmers are coming from when they object to this sort of legislation and perhaps the whole population of this small under pressure island, this "Emerald Isle" of ours.

As we enter another year the prospects appear challenging as our nation is facing real problems in eastern Europe, where indirectly we are fighting a war for democracy and freedom that we simply must win. This of course means we must continue the supply of military funding, depleting our financial resources even further after the effects of Covid. Perhaps we need to adopt a bit of Dunkirk spirit and tighten our belts for the good of our way of life.

John Howell MP writes...

As readers may know I lead the UK Parliamentary Delegation to the Council of Europe on behalf of the Government. Whilst this does take me away some of the time it also enables me to steer a positive contribution for the UK as well as all other Member countries. For example at the January meeting of the international delegation I put forward a paper for the introduction of a new International Convention or Treaty on the protection of the environment in times of armed conflict. Whilst this could seem remote what would mean is that we would have something with which to prosecute a crime such as deliberately exposing a community to chemical weapons. I have been working too with the UN on this. Something long needed.

Whilst on the subject of Europe there has been talk of the UK leaving the European Court of Human Rights. I am a firm believer that we should stay a member of the Court and of the Convention on Human Rights. The Court is not a foreign court but is an international body in which we share responsibility with the other countries who are members. I believe that leaving the Court would be disastrous for the UK. I am sure we will hear more on this in the coming months.

Much more locally I have been pursuing issues relating to our GPs. I fully appreciate that some constituents have been frustrated at issues around access and face to face appointments. At the same time many of our GPs are feeling under huge pressure. Towards the end of last year I met with some of our GPs to listen to their

concerns and this month I called together a meeting with other Oxfordshire MPs and the Chief Executive of the local Integrated Care Board (ICB) which oversees primary care provision. Among the issues raised was that of some GP practices closing their books to new patients. My view is that this is an unfair move for other Practices and for residents who cannot register locally. Further it does not solve the problem. The senior ICB team agreed to meet with local GP teams and pursue the this and other issues with them. I will be following up on this in due course.

Also working with other Oxfordshire MPs, I have been looking into the issue raised with me by a number of parents of the decision by the County Council to withdraw its 'spare seat scheme' for school transport on some services. This is essentially a scheme where any unallocated seats on school buses could be offered to parents of children not eligible for free school transport for a fee. Removal of this scheme inevitably leads to a negative impact for working parents, but it also puts many more cars on the road. The latter flies in the face of the County Councils own environmental ambitions where they have promised to reduce car journeys by 1-4. There are also safety implications for those children who would have to walk along busy roads not served by footpaths to get to school. The County Council said that as it did not have a statutory duty to deliver such a scheme it did not need to involve parents in the decision making. We have urged them to reconsider this decision as a matter of urgency as it is causing huge stress to many families.

I have long supported the part that apprenticeships play in the transition from full time education to work as a robust alternative to a university or college course for some people. I am therefore delighted to see that for young people seeking apprenticeships as an alternative to university there is good news. Plans have been launched to allow young people to use the Universities and Colleges Admissions Service, more commonly referred to as UCAS, to search and apply for apprenticeships alongside degrees. This will give them a better understanding of all the options available to them so they can get the best possible start in life. This will take time to get up and running and will be available from next year.

There are, of course, many big issues which affect us all which are will rehearsed in the national media and which the government is already working to address. If there is a particular issue that concerns you, please do share your thoughts. All walks start at 10am unless otherwise stated.


