The 'Bounce Back Loan Scheme' is available for all types of business (sole trader, LtdCo etc). Borrow 25% of your 2019 turnover for 6 years. No repayments in Year 1. No collateral & no personal guarantee required. No credit check. Just 2.5% pa interest. Details can be found here: -
