Dear Rob,

I acknowledge your e-mail of 20th October 2019. I can confirm that the three items you have raised will be dealt with as follows: -

1. DADS ARMY

The date provisionally booked for next year is Saturday 25th July – as you are aware, this event was one of many trying to increase the footfall to the Saturday Market, which predominantly it achieved. However, nothing is set in stone, the Market, Events and Tourism Committee next meet on Monday 18th November, so your suggestions can be discussed by the Committee on that evening.

2. HOWARD CARTER/TUTANKHAMUN STATUE

You state you have started 'a petition for the Council to back a proposal to have a statue of Carter as soon as possible to be in town at least before the tuts centenary'. It would be useful to have a copy of the wording at the top of the petition prior to the Full Council meeting on 13th November, which is when your proposal will feature on the agenda. Swaffham Heritage will also be making a presentation to the November meeting, mainly about a proposed exhibition in 2022, they are also asking for an in principle decision on a permanent recognition of Howard Carter, which could be a plaque or sculpture.

3. TREES IN THE TOWN CENTRE



I believe that if agreed this process must be started as soon as possible so as to meet the dead line in a few years time.


I know that most clirs as well as the public are fully behind this and I would like this to be raised as urgent matter to be started asap.

<u>Howard Carter</u> (9 May 1874 – 2 March 1939) was a British archaeologist and Egyptologist who became world-famous after discovering the intact tomb (designated KV62) of the 18th Dynasty Pharaoh, Tutankhamen (colloquially known as "King Tut" and "the boy king"), in November 1922.

Howard Carter was born in Kensington on 9 May 1874, the son of Samuel John Carter, an artist, and Martha Joyce Carter (née Sands). His father trained and developed Howard's artistic talents.

Carter spent much of his childhood with relatives in the Norfolk market town of Swaffham, the birthplace of both his parents.

As its nearing the centenary of this historical find Swaffham needs and wants to recognize the carter connection and to bring this to attention of the world.

We would like to have a statue which would not only highlight the carter connection but also his connection with king tut, and letting the public interact with the statue by having a photo and information as well. In order to do this we must petition the local council to proceed with this idea and make sure its completed before the 100 year anniversary.

So please share and add your name to this and lets make some local history ourselves.
