From the Vicar

Dear friends,

I hope that you are well and continuing to enjoy the Easter season? Easter is one of my favourite times of year, and I always try to celebrate the whole season, rather than just a few days. I expect, though, that for most of us, the Easter eggs and chocolates are now long gone, and our gaze and focus has turned away from Easter and towards the Coronation of King Charles III – and the even more important Cuddesdon Fete! May promises to be a merry month, with three Bank Holiday weekends, the Coronation and the fete; and in the church calendar, we also celebrate Ascension Day and Pentecost (Whit Sunday).

Recently, I've been thinking about the oil of Chrism, which has links with both Easter (or, more accurately, Holy Week); and the Coronation. You may have read, or seen on the news, a month or two ago, about the Chrism oil which was consecrated, in March, by the Patriarch of Jerusalem, and the Anglican Archbishop of Jerusalem, in the Church of the Holy Sepulchre - the church which is recognised as containing the site where Jesus was crucified, and also the empty tomb. The Chrism oil which will be used to anoint King Charles at his Coronation was created using olives from the Mount of Olives, where King Charles' grandmother, Alice, is buried. The olives were pressed just outside Bethlehem, and the oil has been perfumed with sesame, rose, jasmine, cinnamon, neroli, benzoin, amber and orange blossom. From ancient kings through to the present day, monarchs have been anointed with oil from the Holy Land, as a sign of God's grace and blessing. The oil of Chrism is a sign of participation in the communion of Jesus Christ, the Anointed One or Messiah; and is also associated with the blessings and gifts brought by the Holy Spirit.

On Maundy Thursday – the Thursday before Easter – I joined with many clergy and Licensed Lay Ministers across the Diocese in reaffirming our commitment to ministry, at the Chrism Mass in Christ Church Cathedral. At this annual service, oils for ministry are also blessed and distributed: the oil for anointing the sick and the dying; the oil for signing with the cross at baptism; and the oil of chrism (used after baptism, and at confirmation, ordination, coronation, and on other occasions linked to commissioning, calling and service).

The use of blessed oils, during baptisms, Home Communion, Wholeness and Healing Services, home visits, and on other occasions, is, for me, one of the immense joys and privileges of priestly ministry. I, and others, often experience a profound and lasting sense of God's peace and God's loving presence, through the act of anointing. And, this year, as the Coronation approaches, it's lovely to remind people that, just as King Charles will be anointed as a sign that he has been chosen and called by God for a special role and purpose, so they are special too: chosen, called and beloved children of the God who knows us by name, and loves us unconditionally.

As you watch the Coronation, I invite you to close your eyes for a moment and imagine (or recall) yourself being anointed with blessed oil, too – perhaps you were anointed at your baptism or confirmation, or on another more recent occasion – and ask God to send the Holy Spirit to inspire and to encourage you, and to fill you with peace, joy, hope and love.



Parish Council

Four people have stood to be councillors on the new Parish Council. They are Chris Luke, Arthur Smith-Fitchett, Paddy McGuinness and Stuart Flockton. This means that they are elected unopposed and there are three vacancies to be filled. This is done by co-option, where people put themselves forward to be councillors and the new Parish Council selects three of them.

If you are interested in being co-opted then please let me or one of the new councillors know. The Parish Council will probably make their selection of the three new councillors at May's meeting, which is the first of the new Council. And congratulations to Stuart Flockton on becoming a councillor.

Strong support was expressed at April's meeting for the Parish Council to register the pub as an Asset of Community Value (ACV). Not only would this give us the chance to buy it if it was for sale but it makes it less likely that a planning application would be granted to allow it to be redeveloped for housing if sold elsewhere.

Nicko King has kindly agreed to manage the registration process, so if you are prepared to help, please contact him.

It is disappointing to learn from CAMRA (the Campaign for Real Ale) that the District Council's recent record with approval of ACV nominations has not been good. Also, there may be problems with registering the pub as an ACV if its bed and breakfast rooms are included rather than just registering the pub alone.

The Parish Council has supported a planning application for a hobby/garden room at The Forge in Denton (P23/S0679/HH). The District Council has granted planning permission for a pergola at 1 Dove House Lane (P23/S0094/HH) and for the planning application for a rear extension at 10 Parkside (P23/S0341/HH).

Welcome to May and the unusual prospect of three Bank Holidays. It's a shame that 15th & 22nd are ordinary work days as we could all get used to this.

Sadly, I have set up my work schedule so poorly that I have to work two of them. It's the same planning skills that made me get the time of the Litter Pick wrong last month. Happily, despite my tardiness, the Wombles of Cuddesdon did a fine job and thank you to everyone who cleared rubbish from all corners of the Parish – from the Wheatley Road to Cuddesdon Mill, the top of Chippinghurst hill and as far as Garsington Rec – we managed an impressive pile on Cuddesdon Green.



Thank you also to all those who turned up for the April PC meeting and the Annual Parish meeting. With your support, we now have a sub-committee forming and plan to move forward with the protection of the Bat & Ball as an Asset of Community Value. As a great first step, Nicko King has invited David Cooper, the Pub Preservation Officer from CAMRA (the Campaign for Real Ale) to share CAMRA's experience and advice on registering a pub as an ACV to help us get going with registering the Bat and Ball.

Please join us at 7.30pm on Thursday 11 May in the Village Hall.

In the meantime, we'll be offering drinks at our Coronation Beacon Lighting on Saturday 6th May from 7pm. I hope to see many of you there.

The theme of the Fete the following weekend is also the Coronation and we'll have all the usual stalls, sideshows, Morris Dancers and the City of Oxford Silver Band. We're delighted that our very own Chippinghurst neighbour Lady Silvia Blank has agreed to be our opener. For more than three decades Silvia and Sir Victor have been raising money and awareness for Wellbeing of Women at their charity cricket match.

I have a feeling that the weather will be unpredictable this summer with rain threatening any event we organise but let's hope it's dry for the beacon and the fete.

John Howell MP writes

April 2023

I would like to begin this month with a personal note which some readers may already be aware of from media reports. After 15 years as the MP for the Henley Constituency I have decided that I will not be seeking to be a candidate in the next General Election. I have served this constituency since 2008 and by the time of the end of the next parliament I will be coming up towards my mid-70's. I do not want to be in parliament until that time as I would like to pursue other avenues. Until such time as the next General Election is called and Parliament dissolved I remain your MP and will continue represent concerns and assist constituents whilst also leading the UK Parliamentary Delegation to the Council of Europe on behalf of the Government.

Now let me turn to issues that I know to be of concern to constituents. Firstly this month I was pleased to see the publication of the Government's Plan for Water. This seeks to address concerns about the health of our rivers, lakes and seas and aims to deliver clean and plentiful supply of water for nature, people, and businesses. I am sure that constituents will be pleased to know that the Government is investing around £1.6 billion to reduce sewage discharges, reduce nutrient pollution, and increase the supply of water. The Plan will also strengthen powers, including those of regulators, to hold water companies and other responsible parties to account.

Another piece of good news on funding is the Spring Budget announcement of additional funding to repair our roads. I think most people agree that the state of our roads is unacceptable in many places, a view which the Government shares. As a result the Chancellor announced an additional £200 million for highways maintenance for the financial year 2023-2024. The amount apportioned to Oxfordshire is £3,706,000 which is passed to the County Council to decide how best to spend it. When I recently raised concerns over potholes with the Director responsible for this work I was advised that they are currently receiving unprecedented numbers of reports of potholes that have become deep in a very short timescale due to the usual weather patterns of heavy rain followed by freezing conditions. He added that they have limited resource

to investigate the level of enquiries received and to maintain roads, paths and cycle paths. I trust that the injection of this large sum of additional cash will help speed up this work.

I am delighted too that there is further investment of £1.2 million in the area through the Rural Prosperity Fund to support local businesses and create jobs to grow the rural economy. This will be administered via our District Councils, South Oxfordshire and Cherwell, which will received £733,241 and £526,831 respectively.



Coronation Quiche Recipe

A deep quiche with a crisp, light pastry case and delicate flavours of Spinach, Broad Beans and fresh Tarragon. Eat hot or cold with a green salad and boiled new potatoes

1 x 20cm Flan Tin. Serves 6

Ingredients

Method To make the pastry...

Sieve the flour and salt into a bowl; add the fats and rub the mixture together using finger tips until you get a sandy, bread crumb texture. Add the milk a little at a time and bring the ingredients together into a dough. Cover and allow to rest in the fridge for 30-45 minutes.

Lightly flour the work surface and roll out the pastry to a circle a little larger than the top of the tin and approximately 5mm thick.

Line the tin with the pastry, taking care not to have any holes or the mixture could leak. Cover and rest for a further 30 minutes in the fridge. Preheat the oven to 190°C.

Method To add the filling

Line the pastry case with greaseproof paper, add baking beans and bake blind for 15 mins, then remove the greaseproof and beans. Reduce the oven temperature to 160°C.

Beat together the milk, cream, eggs, herbs and seasoning.

Scatter 1/2 of the grated cheese in the blind-baked base, top with the chopped spinach and beans and herbs, then pour over the liquid mixture.

If required gently give the mixture a delicate stir to ensure the filling is evenly dispersed but be careful not to damage the pastry case.

Sprinkle over the remaining cheese. Place into the oven and bake for 20-25 minutes until set and lightly golden.
