This is a great Greek kebab recipe and as usual so simple to make. You can even cheat and buy a packet of freshly made Greek Salad if you don't want to prepare your own.

Pork Souvlaki with Feta Salad

4 pork shoulder steaks, trimmed of excess fat and cut into 3cm chunks 1 red onion, quartered and cut into 3cm chunks 1 red pepper, cut into 3cm chunks 20g pack Bart Smokehouse Barbecue Mediterranean Rub 2 tablespoons of olive oil 2 garlic cloves, crushed 4 tomatoes, chopped ½ cucumber, chopped 250g of cooked beetroot, chopped 2 little gem lettuce, chopped 2 salad onions, finely chopped 1/2 tablespoon of lemon juice 50g of feta cheese, roughly crumbled

1. Soak 8 wooden skewers in cold water for 30 minutes. Place the chunks of pork, onion and pepper in the marinade bag from the pack of Mediterranean rub. Sprinkle over and the rub the mixture into the pork, onion and peppers, add 1 tablespoon of olive oil and the garlic, then season. Shake the bag to coat everything, then marinate in the fridge for 30 minutes, or up to 3-4 hours. Discard the marinade and bag after removing the meat for cooking.

- **2.** Preheat the oven to 200°C. Evenly thread the meat, onion and peppers onto the skewers. Cook on a hot griddle pan or barbecue for 10-12 minutes, turning every 2-3 minutes, until charred all over, then transfer to a foil-lined oven tray and roast for another 10-15 minutes, ensuring the pork is cooked thoroughly until there is no pink meat and the juices run clear.
- **3.** Meanwhile, toss the tomatoes, cucumber, beetroot, lettuce, salad onions, lemon juice and remaining 1 tablespoon of olive oil in a large bowl. Season, then scatter with the feta. Serve the souvlaki and salad with warmed pitta bread.

Tip of the Month - Top up water for wildlife - Regularly top up any containers left out for the birds to ensure they have a steady supply of water. Deadhead roses to a bud in a leaf axial lower down the stem to continue the display into Autumn. Trim conifer hedges if necessary. Remove unwanted growth from trees where necessary to prevent them sapping all the strength of the plant. Divide irises and separate the younger pieces with a sharp knife, throw away the older ones. Plant Autumn flowering bulbs.

News from Helen Whately MP

Being an MP means keeping a lot of plates spinning. One minute you're grappling with Brexit and the Customs Union, threats from Russia, or NHS funding, the next it will be primary school places, train delays, or Operation Stack. So here's an update on how I'm staying on top of my campaigns.

Children in this area desperately need more schools to go to. It's predicted that as many as 82 secondary school children may not have a place at a local school next year. With more housing on the way, the problem is only going to get worse.

Funding for a new Primary school in Bearsted was granted in 2017 and work on getting it open was pressing ahead. But a few weeks ago the whole plan was thrown up in the air. A mental health unit is currently being built on an adjacent site and the alarm was raised that a school and a mental health unit couldn't be side by side.

That's why I met with the Chief Executive of the company which will run the unit. He assured me that there really shouldn't be a problem having a school next to their mental health unit. Clearly the concerns raised about having the two side by side need to be investigated, but it may be the school can be built there after all.

A new Maidstone School of Science and Technology was also due to open last year but has been held up by planning wrangles and worries about increases in traffic. I recently wrote to the Planning Inspector explaining that, unless we get this school open as soon as possible, pupils face being bussed long distance across the county to get to school, potentially being late and missing out on after-school activities.

I'm working with Maidstone Council, KCC and the Government to try to get this all sorted out and make sure new schools don't add to the traffic problems, because the fact is, Maidstone's children need more schools and we need them soon.

One thing we need to fix traffic problems in this area is an end to 'Operation Stack'. New plans were announced last week that will allow traffic to travel in both directions between junctions 8 and 9 on the M20 while lorries are being queued for the Port of Dover and Eurotunnel.

This means people will be able to get on with their lives and businesses will continue to operate using the motorway, rather than being diverted onto smaller local roads. It should avoid a repeat of the nightmare of summer of 2015, where the M20 was closed for 32 days, costing the Kent economy £250 million.

Work will begin soon on reinforcing the northbound hard shoulder so that this can be used for ordinary traffic while lorries are parked on the other side. This interim solution is expected to be ready by 2019. I hope these contingency plans never have to be used – but I'm glad Highways England are getting grip.

While the Government is getting on with preparing our roads for Brexit, commuters are facing a rough ride on the trains – with delays, long journey times, and out-of-date carriages. That's why I was dismayed when I saw the new timetables. The proposed new timetable would see the loss of a service arriving in London before 9am along the Maidstone East line serving Lenham, Harrietsham, Hollingbourne and Bearsted. I recently convened a meeting with fellow Kent MPs and the Rail Ministers to voice our concerns. We made it clear that it's unacceptable for our constituents to face longer, less convenient journeys. Please let me know if your journey has been negatively affected by the timetable changes.

A **smart speaker** is a type of wireless speaker and voice command device with an integrated virtual assistant (artificial intelligence) that offers interactive actions and hands free activation with the help of one "hot word" (or several "hot words").

Some smart speakers can also act as a smart device that utilizes Bluetooth and Wi-Fi, other wireless protocol standards to extend usage beyond audio playback, such as to control home automation devices.

Each can have its own designated interface and features in-house, usually launched or controlled via application or home automation software. Some smart speakers also include a screen to show the user a visual response.

Christian Message July 2018

People are people and happily come in all sorts of shapes and sizes — in their characters as well as appearances. That's wonderful. Wouldn't it be boring if we were all like ourselves? But 'people are people' also means that they have made a fortune out of various ways of analysing what kind of person we are — Myers-Briggs is an example that industry uses a lot.

What kind of person are you and how do you react to summer? Do you like having a moan? A day after the floods up the hill in Doddington, I heard somebody complain how hot it was. Do you like putting your feet up? Some people will be longing to get away for a time of semi-sleep on a sun-baked beach somewhere. Or do you (like me), really like to get on with things? The summer brings an opportunity to explore places not yet visited and do those projects that I can't do in the winter.

Whichever you are, I have a challenge for you. Look at life — especially the 'little' things — and be <code>grateful_(e.g.</code> to God?). Be grateful for the people who smile, for the coffee that you drink, for the garden that flowers (however overgrown), for the sunlight that lifts our spirits, and so on. The Bible talks about the value of 'stopping', particularly in the creation poem at the start of Genesis, when God rests on the seventh day. Actually, he more pauses than stops, because his creative Spirit continues all around us all the time, not least in nature. We need to train ourselves to <code>pause</code>, <code>and notice</code> — or all those things which are worthwhile flash past and we fail to sense the beauty and goodness of this amazing world that we live in.

Pausing and noticing has other advantages. It lifts us out of ourselves towards others. It help us to recognise needs in others that we can meet, sometimes very simply, and so is the root practice behind active love. So for yourself and those around you: let's all *pause and notice* this summer.
