

FATAL ACCIDENT—CALDERBRIDGE.—Mr. Henry Jackson, of Calderscow, near Calderbridge, left home on the afternoon of Saturday week, on horseback, for the purpose of looking after his sheep depasturing upon Stockdale Moor, but whilst upon the moor, it would appear, he had fallen from his horse, and one of his feet being fast in the stirrup he had been dragged about for some time, in the course of which he sustained many severe bruises on his head, had several ribs broken, and was otherwise very seriously injured. He lingered in great agony until Tuesday last, when death put an end to his sufferings, leaving a widow and six young children to deplore their irreparable loss.—On Thursday last, an inquest was held upon view of the body of the deceased, before W. Bragg, Esq., coroner, and after hearing such testimony as could be brought to bear upon the unforunate event, the Jury returned a verdict of Accidental death.
