This year the theme of the **Summer Reading Challenge** for primary age children is **Animal Agents**. The free challenge runs through the school holidays and a couple of special events are planned for Broseley Library.

On **Thursday**, **17**th **August** there will be a visit from the Dogs Trust (with sniffer dog) between 10.30am and 11.30am. Broseley Pipe Works Needs You...

Broseley was once one of the largest pipe-making regions in the world. Broseley Pipeworks Museum is an evocative time capsule of the cottage factory which exported clay tobacco pipes throughout the world from the 1880s until the workforce seemingly walked out in 1957.

The Museum offers guided tours at 1.30pm and 3.00pm daily from May half term to the end of September and is looking for enthusiastic Volunteers to share this fascinating history with visitors.
