SCAMS AND WARNINGS

2 ALERTS THIS MONTH

We have received reports of a criminal claiming to be a police officer in order to gain personal de-tails from residents. The criminal claims a fraudulent transaction has happened on the resident's bank account and asks for their personal details. In some cases, the resident has been asked to go to their bank to withdraw money from their account to stop further transactions. They are then advised to wait for a further telephone call and a plain clothed police officer will come and collect the money.

Remember: The Police will NEVER ask for cash or personal details.

If you receive a call you are not expecting, be wary. Never disclose any personal information such as bank details to anyone over the telephone, no matter who the caller claims to be.

We have received reports of a man knocking on doors in the Tunbridge Wells area selling house-hold cleaning products.

The man claims to be an ex-convict and is using a laminated ID card with a British flag on it. When residents refused to buy the goods, the man has become intimidating and rude. Purchasing goods from a doorstep caller can lead to you being overcharged for poor quality products.

Never pay cash to someone you have just met on your doorstep.

If you feel afraid or threatened by a doorstep caller phone 999. For non-urgent calls phone Kent Police on 101.
