like to have a go at singing? No auditions or previous experience. Just an enthusiasm to have a go!!



B4449 Improvement

Cllr Charles Mathew has managed to get the OCC to confirm their schedule for implementing B4449 improvement through the village. OCC have confirmed they will be progressing some of the items discussed such as the footway siding out, drainage, and patching on Sutton Lane over the next 3 - 4 weeks. Whilst in Sutton Lane over the next 3 - 4 weeks. Whilst in Sutton Lane overhanging willows will be cut back. In addition to these works OCC will be looking at a structural patching scheme to be undertaken through the village they will require a road closure for it to be undertaken so is a little bit longer away. When we have further information, we will let you know.

B4449 Road Closer

We have been notified that the B4449 will be closed from the Hardwick junction of the A415 and B4449 to the roundabout at Friars Farm to facilitate carriageway surface dressing on June 24th /25^{th.}

A34/M4 Junction 13 Chieveley (West Berkshire): Bridge Refurbishment and Surface Reconstruction -Kier Highways, on behalf of Highways England, will be carrying out maintenance work at the Chieveley Interchange over the spring and summer 2019 Litter Pick

Steve Good, WODC District Councillor and Cabinet Member for Environment and Housing Management, attended our last Parish Council meeting to personally thanks all those who took part in the Litter Picking. in March. He was very pleased with the results

A successful Litter Pick took place in April collecting a total of 21 black sacks full. These were disposed of at the tip, along with some larger items, wheel caps, bin lids, tyres etc. We hope that by removing the rubbish regularly we are discouraging others from leaving their rubbish in or near our village

Airfield Development

Despite meeting with the developers, Hayfield, we are still having issues with HGVs travelling through the village. We will continue to address this with the Developers. If you see a lorry travelling through the village either to or from the airfield development, please note the time and registration and let Trudi know. We will follow up on each and every occurrence. The developers have applied for a foot path extension closure on the grounds of safety, up to 'when the development is complete' or December 2021, whichever is the soonest, they have committed to reinstatement of the footpath through the site as soon as it is safe to do so. The developer have dug a trench through the parade ground to enable them to provide main water and electricity to the Stanton Harcourt cricket club, they have committed to making good as part of the development. The roads within the development will be named after aircrafts that flew from the site Halifax Way, Wellington Crescent, Lancaster Drive, Liberator Close and Whitley Lane.

Newbridge

The Oxfordshire County Council continue to prosecute HGV owners who breach the weight limit over Newbridge. The purpose of this weight limit is to protect this old and relatively weak bridge.

So far this calendar year 32 vehicle owners have been prosecuted, with total fines and costs of over £11,000 (OCC only retains the costs awarded). New Thames Valley Police Initiative

From the 1 May 2019 Thames Valley Police (TVP) will be launching a text survey process. If you receive a text message from TVP after the 1st of May it will be because their records show that your mobile number contacted them to report an incident or crime. TVP would like you to complete their two question survey by responding to the text you received (your usual charges will apply). They are aware of the sensitivities around certain crimes and incidents e.g. cases of domestic abuse. Due to these sensitivities' texts will not be sent to victims involved in these cases.

The aim of the survey process is to help TVP to shape their service by learning from your experience. Taking part in the survey is entirely voluntarily, and whether you choose to participate or not will have no impact on your case. TVP want you to be confident that the text you have received is genuine. The number that they will send the text from will be 07860020479 (this may also show as +447860020479).
