

If you have a new computer, laptop or tablet for the New Year, then here are a few tips:

- **1.** Follow the manufacturer's set-up instructions, especially related to battery charging
- **2.** Tips on navigating Windows 8 can be found in back issues of this Magazine:
 - a. Customise your Start Screen November 2013
 - b. Personalise Windows 8 September 2013
 - c. What's new in Windows 8.1 January 2014
 - d. Connecting to Wi-Fi October 2013
 - e. Connecting IPads with no Wi-Fi August 2014

- **3.** You don't have to use the manufacturer's Anti-Virus software, especially if they charge you. At the Egerton Telecottage we recommend Microsoft Security Essentials, it's free and very efficient go to: http://windows.microsoft.com/en-GB/windows/security-essentials-download
- **4.** Use Malware and AntiSpyware applications to keep your computer clear of pop-ups and intrusive advertising, we recommend:

SuperAntiSpyware <u>http://www.superantispyware.com</u> MalwareBytes: <u>https://www.malwarebytes.org</u>

- **5.** Use **Strong** passwords, recommendations can be found on the internet, but here's a few tips:
 - a. Is at least eight characters long
 - b. Does not contain your user name or real name
 - c. Does not contain a complete word
 - d. Is significantly different from previous passwords
 - e. Contains characters from each of the following four categories:
 - i. Uppercase (A,B,C)
 - ii. Lowercase (a,b,c)
 - iii. Numbers (1, 2, 3)
 - iv. Special characters (eg: ! @ # \$ % ^ & *)
- **6.** When downloading any software from the internet, read the instructions carefully on every step of the download, and make sure you un-tick any additional software that is being offered. Also make sure you tick or un-tick

the boxes that ask about receiving marketing information etc. (beware of the wording in the question, it can be misleading).

7. When setting up your printer, make sure it is connected to your device (this could be a wireless connection) and switched on. In most cases your new device will recognise the printer and install the software automatically.

Grafty Gourmet

This is a great but simple recipe, ideal for these cold winter nights. You can use any vegetables you like for this recipe, you do not have to use what is suggested. Great served with crusty bread.

Easy Chicken Casserole

2 tablespoons olive oil	120ml white wine or chicken stock
4 chicken legs or breasts	1 (400g) tin chopped tomatoes or
1 large onion, peeled, halved and	punnet cherry tomatoes or 6 fresh
sliced	tomatoes, chopped
4 stalks celery, chopped	2 tablespoons tomato puree
2 carrots, peeled and thickly chopped	Pinch salt and freshly ground pepper,
2 cloves garlic, chopped or pressed	to taste

1. Heat oil in a heavy pan over high heat and fry chicken until lightly golden.

2. Add onion, celery, carrots and garlic. Move them around the pan before adding the wine.

3. Turn down the heat, add the tomatoes, tomato puree, salt and pepper. Cover and simmer on a low heat for 50 - 60 minutes (the longer the better). You could also bake it in the oven at 180 degrees C, if you prefer. Taste and season with salt and pepper before serving.

As I thought about this I recalled Bishop Trevor's words at a Deanery lunch in Lenham during the early months of his ministry in Canterbury. I asked him how he felt about leaving his work and his friends in Basingstoke.

His words were a reminder of Hebrews chapter 13, verse 14, "Here we do not have an enduring city, but we are looking for the city that is to come." God provides us with the wonderful opportunity of travelling through this life with his Son, Jesus, towards the city of which he is the architect and builder.

My prayer is that we may, in 2015, hear and heed the words of God, **"This is the way, walk in it."** (Isaiah chapter 30 verse 21)
