Summary of additional notes made by parishioners in their responses

Services and assets over which the PC have direct control or influence.

1. Planning (Housing & Commercial)

- Open countryside is too restricting. A small amount of development is needed to keep the Village alive.
- The planning policy is outdated, Withington needs to accept that the population is growing at an alarming rate. I do not support large developments,
- But I do support one off and infill applications.
- No building in Withington
- Some infill should be allowed for first time buyers
- No major development
- I would have an interest in the Council's plans for the field adjacent to Penates, Caernarvon Lane
- Would not want any substantial development
- Only consider small single developments & building conversions
- The PC has done an outstanding job regarding OTT planning application rejection. Keep up the good work!
- "Single-house" developments by private individuals could enhance the village.
- Beware of large developers. They are only after profit. The villlage is not suitable for large developments
- A few small (2/1) bed properties could bring some younger people. A village needs a mix of housing & people
- The planning authorities seem to have little regard for the wishes of the Parish Council
- As long it is suitable for everyone in the village
- I didn't think Uffington had a school
- Would like to see some small scale i.e. small plot housing development
- We should fight to remain in our existing category. If we accept more development the charms of Withington will be lost. Furthermore, traffic will become a major problem on our narrow lanes
- No more "holiday" developments
- For nearly 20 years, we have had a horrible eye sore in the village the static caravan in the Old Barns. Visible most of the year to all village green users and it should have only legally been present for 5 years following start of the property renovation 2001. The Parish needs to formally demand its removal

- Speed limit needed on road from Walcot to Rodington Heath, traffic will get worse with development at Allscott & Rodington.
- Walcot lane floods due to drains being blocked & dip in road requiring repair
- I've always pushed for speed bumps along the straight section at front of H&H. This has been a constant problem with speeding vehicles.
- Large vehicles churning up the road edges
- Keep asking for improvement work on Caernarvon Lane
- Lack of road markings at crossroads
- This is an area of working farmland so one should expect mud on the road/verges and not complain about it!

- Withington approach roads need more cautionary traffic signage eg warnings of bends in road which might show speeding vehicles down and make for safer driving
- Drain clearing by pumping station not ideal often flooded
- Occasional application of weed killer on footpath in Woodlands Close as weeds fracture the tarmac leading to potential future problems
- No, carry on as you are
- Pursue the road names for those without!
- Tractors driving too fast
- Very concerned with speed. Cyclists. Big increase in traffic with U.M. development and Cycle route.
- Large vehicles inappropriate usage.
- Unnecessarily heavy weight traffic seems not to concern the Local Authority and erhaps the local M.P. could be asked to address what is perhaps a national problem
- Road surfaces need attention in lots of places due to poor tarmac condition
- The HGV's and large agricultural vehicles need to be restricted
- 30mph speed limit through village too high needs reduction. Large agricultural vehicles far too many travelling too quickly accident waiting to happen
- I think the 30mph should be extended to include all our parishioners to protect them
- Continued dialogue with agricultural contractors not to use the village as a "through route"
- The only problem we have is that too many large vehicles do considerable damage to our roads and verges.
- We suffer for the road (Walcot Lane) flooding everytime we have rain due to non-clearance of drains.
 Also directly outisde of our property the road has a dip which fills with water and vehicles splash through this at speed causing water damage to the fencings as well as soaking us if we are in the garden 5m from road.
- Speed signs as you come into village by Brian Smiths, not just right in village but all entrance roads
- We need a 20mph speed limit through the bends in the village

- Would be good if sign posted showing stiles got large dog. No routes on SC map for Withington
- Meeting dogs off leads which then jump up. Dogs must be on leads to be under proper control.
- Not clearly marked & not maintained correctly
- They are an asset that should continue to be maintained
- No happy to help on maintenance

- Only if the service allowed a sensible amount of time (2-3 hrs) at destination Longer in Shrewsbury, shorter in Wellington
- Not often enough. Restricts time spent in towns. Need a more frequent service.
- May use it on a Monday to and from Shrewsbury, & Friday
- Too irregular
- What service! There would be no need for a daily service but say Wed & Sat with 2 buses into town and 2 return per day (Sat & Wed)
- Timings do not suit older population
- No timetables seen
- I would as I become older
- It gets slow early evenings and weekend mornings
- Very low service, dipping to zero occasionally
- Should explore with BT getting fibre to house's over existing poles to improve speed.
- Explore alternative technologies to improve service/speed
- Very low
- Very "hit and miss". Not particularly reliable
- Internet speed is still quite slow. When watching tv programmes through BT, eg BBC I player. We sometimes get the service frozen and have to exit and re-enter the programme
- Faster would be better
- As ever greater speeds are required to access many services, why not exploit an ultra-speed free to air mast to us?
- An ad hoc training programme could be very helpful for people who have limited mobility. Just need a list of volunteers prepared to help
- Can be slow at times but generally acceptable
- I am IT illiterate
- Speed generally ok But could always be better

We use the Shrewsbury Library and do not use the mobile, which we see as unsustainable in the current financial climate The time/day doesn't suit me/us Thursday was so much better Difficult to use on Fridays - since change from Thursdays I think they provide an adequate service GP Surgery Acceptance: I have not given my current address, as if I do, I was told I can't stay as a patient there beyond next year. I don't want to be forced to leave this surgery GP + NHS. The NHS is struggling nationally. Locally we cannot book GP appointments on line. I was advised that I couldn't book a routine appointment in the surgery either. Presumably, this is so

A restored canal will bring economic boost to the village, provide a safe cycle/walking route into Shrewsbury and a flood alleviation mechanism in times of high rainfall The canal would enhance the village. However, I cannot see a viable economic case for it.
