
# **OPEN GARDENS in** HASTINGLEIGH Saturday, 23rd June 2-5.30pm

#### MAY FOOTPATH WALK

The May walk, in glorious warm May sunshine, coincided with a walk organised by the Romney Marsh Walking Society from Evington Hall. Since five of our regular walkers are also members of the Romney Marsh group, it was decided to combine the two into one. The Romney Marsh group are twinned with a walking group from St. Sylvestre-Cappel in Northern France and it was the French walkers turn to visit England. Having walked 5 miles in the morning and enjoyed lunch in Evington Hall, 50 walkers, including 20 from France and 11 'locals', set off for a short but quite strenuous walk at 2 o'clock in the afternoon. Our route took us down Boundary Lane to the bottom of the hill, then back up past the old Baptist Chapel. On the way we were able to enjoy the splendour of the bluebells. We crossed the road and joined Pilgrims Lane, turned left and walked to the bottom. A short stretch of road and then up Glory Lane. Right at the top and along the valley, up to Kingsmill Down, then down to Hastingleigh Church, passing a group of cowslips and taking in a track covered in wild garlic. Up again to Tamley Lane and back to the Hall for tea and cakes. Then it was goodbye to the French and to the Romney Marsh walkers. We walked 3.5 miles and climbed a total of 517 ft. Many favourable comments were received from our visitors about our lovely countryside and I think I was forgiven in the end for making everyone walk up four hills!

#### PATIENT PARTICIPATION GROUP (PPG)

Have you considered being a member of Wye Surgery's Patient Participation Group? Would you like to join with other patients and Wye Surgery staff to ensure that services are as good as they can be, given current financial and administrative restrictions? Your views could be contributing to the achievement of these objectives. Currently we feel it would be helpful to hear from those people who are not represented, so that they too could be better served. Are there young people, young parents and people with particular social or medical needs who would be willing to join us? Our group has been in existence for approximately one year, and its discussions have resulted in:

- a) ensuring that the outer door of the surgery is opened early to allow patients to escape the weather outside
- b) it being possible for patients to obtain repeat-prescriptions on line
- c) the creation of questionnaires to help staff to assess their effectiveness
- d) encouraging the extension of in-surgery services.

How great it is to be able to avoid many of the difficulties posed getting to hospital and possibly long waits, often in far from ideal conditions, and instead to go to a much more accessible, comfortable and familiar place staffed by people we know, who have selected effective consultants. This does not deny our need for efficient hospitals when their services are necessary.

There is one important thing which we can all do, whether or not we join the PPG, and that is to inform the surgery if we no longer need, or cannot keep, appointments with medical staff. These appointments would then be available to other patients, which would shorten waiting times for all patients seeking appointments, and would ensure that precious staff time is not wasted. In March the cost of missed appointments to the Surgery totalled £2124.00. In April this has been slightly improved with 34 Doctors, 44 Nurses and 13 Physiotherapists appointments being missed.

Occasionally most of us forget an appointment, but there are those who often miss appointments, possibly because their health problems have become less acute, and these people may well be unaware of the effect of their behaviour on other patients in the practice.

We are fortunate to have a surgery which provides us with excellent care, but it recognises that there is always room for improvement, and you could contribute to that improvement.

#### **SPRING FAIR 2012**

The Evington Community Project held its eighth Spring Fair on 7<sup>th</sup> May at the Football Field, Hastingleigh. The weather was kinder than expected and we only had a light shower in the afternoon, with the weather quickly turning back to sunshine. Once again, the turnout was terrific.

We raised the fantastic sum of £905.70 after expenses, all of which will be spent on our joint communities of Bodsham, Elmsted and Hastingleigh.

The organizing committee would like to thank all of you who helped before, during and after the day and all who came along and supported the event.

We should also like to thank the Bodsham School Choir for entertaining us and the Art Group for organizing a splendid Art and Craft exhibition in the Evington Hall during the afternoon.

#### IN THE GARDEN

Despite the odd climate this year with drought and exceptional rain it has produced some good growing conditions for the garden. The cooler temperatures gave us a long spring show of flowers. It has also given us plenty of time to prepare planting and keep the weeds under control.

On the negative side the cool conditions kept the bees at home and we are beginning to wonder what the fruit crop is going to be this year.

Concerning fruit, each year we have used a hormone trap to catch the male plum moths in the early spring so as to avoid maggots in the plums. This year we were a little early putting the traps out, however, the few sunny days in March brought them out early and several hundred were caught in the trap in a matter of a week. Since that time we have only caught one. Sometimes the weather works in the gardener's favour.

The rain which came soon enough to give strong growth of the emerging summer plants was the "right sort" of rain doing little damage to the emerging shoots of the summer flowers. The main problem was the slugs but grit and bait seems to have kept them at bay.

On windy days emerging shoots can suffer badly. We learned a lesson too this year when a tree which we had planted between ourselves and our neighbour, (a veritable wind tunnel), began to come into leaf. A couple of days of strong wind shredded almost all the new growth. We had to move the tree to a quieter spot or lose it. We went through the books to find a suitable replacement. We eventually settled on a Berberis and a Wisteria. It will be interesting to see how they perform.

Over the last week we have been planting out some of the hardier summer plants. The Pentstemons seem to thrive in the cooler conditions. If we had left them in the pots most likely they would have become pot bound. The more tender Dahlias and Geraniums will be planted out in at the end of the month.

In the greenhouse the tomatoes are growing fast and are already up to truss number 3. The cucumbers however are still finding it a little cool. We have had the best crop ever of strawberries in the greenhouse grown in last years grow bags.

Finally the soft fruit will have to be covered with netting in the next week to keep the blackbirds off.

#### A Look at Local Restaurants.

Crundale. The Compasses Inn. Always famous for hearty well fried fare. the pub changed hands nine months ago, Phil and Angela now in command with a change of direction. The menu is claimed to be homecooked and the food locally sourced. The building remains as it always was and has not been smartened up. We tried fried black pudding with a poached egg and salad and duck and orange pate with onion marmalade and toast. The black pudding was crisply cut into cubes with a perfect egg; the rest of the first course was first-rate, everything as claimed, freshly prepared. Their own beef and ale pie with mash and dish of freshly prepared vegetables followed. Always suspicious of pies, we were surprised at the amount and quality of beef used. The mash and vegetables were first-rate. Finely prepared poached salmon on a crayfish risotto was also ordered and that too was exceptional. A good choice of desserts is on offer including lemon tart, also very good. They are enthusiastic and proud of their restaurant as they have a right to be with Will Daws as the chef. The service was perfect. The menus change frequently and a local rump steak is £14.95 with all the trimmings. Sunday lunch is usually beef and pork with freshly cooked Yorkshire pudding at £10.50 though there are alternatives of fish, chicken or vegetarian and a choice of four starters and eight or so desserts. The restaurant is open from 6pm to 9pm and closed on Mondays. It is a welcome addition to our gastronomic scene and they deserve to do well.



Canterbury Choral Society will be bringing a magical event to The Cathedral when they perform Rachmaninov Vespers (All-Night Vigil) in Russian. A thousand years ago music consisted of single melodic lines which took the form of Gregorian Chant and in Eastern Europe variants of Byzantine chants. This style of music depended upon its survival on the creation of musical notation and this fell to the Monks who were the scholarly class of the age. A simple notation was used with arrows pointing up and down whilst in Western Europe a variety of symbols appeared. One particular influence on the growth of Russian music was that the Orthodox Church forbade the use of instruments in the liturgy with the exception of bells. This discouraged the development of more complex forms and as a result the monks used a simpler style in which voices sang the same words in the same rhythms to differing notes.

During the seventeenth and eighteenth century music spread to Russia from the West but real change did not come until the nineteenth century with the arrival of Glinka, Borodin, Rimsky-Korsakov and Mussorgsky. Rachmaninov was very much in the main stream of western classical music and a great admirer of Tchaikovsky. He composed his *Liturgy of St John of Chrysostom* in 1910 but felt he had not sufficiently absorbed the style and spirit of the ancient chants, and it was not until five years later that he composed his *All Night-Vigil*. He achieved a traditional atmosphere by using only unaccompanied voices, making contrasting use of varying sections of the choir and introducing later techniques such as polyphony, the interaction between voices, as well as the use of two solo voices. This was Rachmaninov's favourite work.

Camilla Pay, the local harpist will play music by Russian composers including Glinka, the first Russian composer to gain wide recognition within his own country and regarded as the father of Russian classical music.


