

The Freighter cannot accept white goods, washing machines, dishwashers, fridges, freezers, cookers, cast iron bollers or baths, long metal poles, building materials, manure, large parts of engines or vehicles or hazardous waste.

Hazardous waste now includes items like fluorescent tubes, televisions & computer monitors, batteries, oil tins and filters, paint and paint tins and chemical containers. These items cannot be accepted on the Saturday Freighter service and must be taken to your nearest Household Waste Recycling Certrie.



Our parent's consultation was well attended and some very positive comments were received.


Our new reception children have settled in well to their new daily routines and it is lovely to see their enthusiasm.

Year 2 visited Lullingstone villa to discover how the Romans lived and to see first-hand the Roman ruins.





Year 6 visited Thorpe Park and engaged in STEM (science, technology, engineering and maths) activities from such well-known names as Mercedes F1, the RAF and The Royal Philharmonic. We were very proud of our pupils who were singled out for praise from the organisers for their good behaviour.

In school children have attended Dogs Trust workshops, Child pedestrian training and a NSPCC 'Speak Out Stay Safe' assembly.



Reverend Finn led the annual

harvest assembly – the very generous donations from our families to the harvest assembly are being donated to the local food bank.

Dunton Green is embarking as a whole school on a 2 year project on meta-cognition and self-regulation with the aim of becoming a 'Thinking School', having a common commitment to giving regular and careful thought to everything.

We will all, both pupils and staff, be learning how to think reflectively, creatively and critically and use these skills in our school life.

Finally we are delighted and proud that this year 6 of our pupils have passed the Kent test. We wish them every success in applying for the local grammar schools.

The Parish Council is keen that young people in the village should be able to try various sports and develop a love of being outdoors and enjoying exercise. With this in mind, and knowing that purse strings are tight, there will be a series of FREE sports sessions through 2023.

The ball got rolling after the October half term this year with a seven week programme of Kick Kent Football sessions at the MUGA (recreation ground) for our older young people (13-16 years).

In the New Year we will be launching Saturday morning sessions of Girls' Mini Kickers Football, hot on the heels of the success of the Women's England Football squad in 2022 and in response to a growing demand for girls only sessions. These sessions will be to introduce younger girls (4-6 yrs) to the 'glorious game', to have fun and make friends.

Later in the year we will have Kwik Cricket (Fridays) and the return of Basketball (Mondays). We will see Mini Tennis in the summer (Fridays) and we'll have another round of football sessions in the autumn.

As well as these FREE programmes of activities we will be trialling Fit & Fed holiday programmes. These will be multisport sessions held on one or two days each school holiday, where those young people who are signed up can also enjoy a packed lunch. Again, they will be free of charge!

Full details will be made available on our website and Facebook page ahead of each programme starting. You will need to sign your child up to take part (details of how to do this will be provided along with the dates for each programme when we advertise). Spaces will be limited.

We hope your children can take part and have a lot of fun!

PARISH COUNCIL News Highlights

◆ PLAN 2040 - Sevenoaks District Council consultation. SDC has drafted an important part of the new Local Plan and they want to hear your views. The new Local Plan covers the period up to 2040. As SDC is committed to protecting the Green






Belt (covering 93% of the

District), at this stage, they are not considering any Green Belt release. The new plan proposes most new developments should be constructed within existing built up areas. The plan includes

proposals for new homes, protecting business space and supporting high streets and new facilities such as schools, health centres and transport. It also aims to protect the District's

character and environment. The survey will be available until 11.59pm on Wednesday 11 January 2023. The Parish Council urges all residents with views on what the District Council should or should not be considering for inclusion in its plan to take a look at SDC's website (www.sevenoaks.gov.uk/plan2040) and comment.

♦ Please note that in this version of the Plan, SDC cannot cover the housing target that the Government has set. It seems very likely that there will be a second consultation in the autumn of 2023 that could include sites in the Green Belt.



◆ Please also be aware that where the Plan refers to the 4 town settlements (Swanley, Sevenoaks, Edenbridge, Westerham), when it refers to Sevenoaks it means SEVENOAKS URBAN, an area that SDC Planning identified some years back which encompasses a number of outlying villages, including Dunton Green.

◆ The Parish Council has been advised that there is likely to be some reorganisation within Kent Police which is likely to affect Neighbourhood Policing as we have known it. There are no more details at time of going to print but we will share any

updates as soon as we have them. Look out for information on our website and Facebook page.

Allotment Update by Cllr. Debbie Parker

This year was definitely a challenging year for gardeners and allotmenteers everywhere.

With a warm, dry Spring followed by successive heatwaves throughout Summer, the hot dry weather meant that incessant watering was needed for allotment plants to have any chance of surviving, and for most this meant more water was required than most of us could physically supply.

Any fresh young succulent green plants lovingly sown, tendered and planted out were soon gobbled up by thirsty and hungry slugs and snails. 30+°C heat and drought conditions made it tough for pollinators and plants alike. By early July, some Broad beans had formed but my second sowing of Runner beans were looking very sad with sparse flowers (the first sowing having been eaten) and the parched ground near the ready-to-harvest dried Garlic plants didn't show much promise for the second planting of small squash plants and the late sowing of Black French beans.

However, nature is very resilient and even though watering was sparse, I was delighted and amazed when a small but significant crop of courgettes and assorted squashes appeared seemingly from nowhere! Even a Pumpkin appeared! Truly amazing and I do wonder just where they got their sustenance from as squashes are very shallow rooted.

Following the late summer bursts of heavy rain and thunderstorms in August, the black French beans have been cropping well throughout September and October with the wet but still warm sunshine to help swell the pods.

The rain also helped the concrete ground to soften so that I could finally start to rescue my salad and red potatoes, something that I couldn't do without a pneumatic drill in July when the salad Charlottes should have been harvested. However, I can vouch that the Charlottes are still very good, a nice size, unblighted and very delicious, and both varieties will stay in the ground for a bit longer. Even though plants were netted, caterpillars decimated my kale, broccoli, Brussel sprouts and cabbage plants, but they have since recovered from the onslaught and are now also cropping well.



Finally harvesting!

It's always lovely to see other resident wildlife that inhabit the allotments. The scorched earth made cool, damp places a premium over the summer, so any shady spots were readily sought out and I was intrigued to spot a black slow worm resting under an empty water butt. Slow worms are normally a beautiful silvery brownygrey colour with young being more goldy coloured. I've learnt that black (or melanistic) slow worms are very uncommon, with the black colour being due to an increase of melanin pigment.

More recently, I spotted a large bug sunbathing in the October sunshine amongst the chard. Much too big for a grasshopper, I wasn't sure what it was and was delighted to find out that evening on Autumn Watch that it was a Cricket. In fact, I identified it as a Dark Bush-cricket and, because of the large vicious-looking curved spike on the abdomen, that it was a female cricket. This spike is actually an ovipositor, similar to a bee's 'sting', and is used for laying her eggs in damp soil or wood.

So that's it for now. A few successes and lots of failures this year due to the weather, but, hey! that's gardening, and I'll just try again next year!

The garlic and broad beans are already in the ground for overwintering and fingers crossed for a cooler Spring.




BOOK REQUEST
