News From Ulcombe Village School

On Your Marks, ... Get Set, ... Go!

It was wonderful to welcome everyone to the new school year at the start of September after our awesome Olympic summer. In particular we extended a very warm welcome to the children starting in Reception this September. We look forward to helping all children, from Reception to Year 6, be the best that they can be as they face many challenges this year.

Much goes on during the summer behind the scenes. The teachers spent a considerable amount of time preparing the learning environment for the children. We have reviewed some of the school's policies and procedures as a staff, to make sure that what we do in school helps the children academically, socially and emotionally. We have also been arranging dates and key events for the year, including educational visits, consultation evenings and Christmas (yes, already!) activities.

We will shortly be launching our new walk-to-school initiative and we have also been able to arrange a variety of extra-curricular activities. This will help us continue to encourage children to be active and healthy. As well as all of this the governors and I have tried to keep ourselves up-to-date with progress towards our library and FUS have already had their first meeting of the year.

The Library Project - Still Moving Forward

During the summer progress has continued with our plans to improve the school by providing improved access to the school and a library. The latest news is that KCC have chosen a preferred buyer for the disused adventure trail to the north of the school site. This was following a tendering process with RPC New Land and Homes as agents. KCC's solicitors are now working to bring about the completion of the sale of the land as quickly as possible. Once the sale is completed the proceeds will be made available to the school and we will begin building! I hope, as ever, to have more news very soon.

The Wheels on the Bus go to Legoland

Wednesday 19th September saw all of the children in Years 1-6 go on a fantastic trip to Legoland Windsor as part of our topic on Cogs and Wheels. This trip is extremely important to their work this term, with children taking on different challenges whilst on the trip and completing follow-up work back in school. We were informed that by coincidence, the day of our visit was a pirate themed day at Legoland. All of the children were given an eye patch and be taught to speak like pirates. I am know this has helped to make the day even more memorable!

Parish Council Funding

Last month I informed you impending changes MBC intend to impose on parishes, by removing the Concurrent Functions Grant and replacing it with a Parish Services Scheme. (To remind you - the aim of the Concurrent Functions grant was to recognise that Parishes directly provide certain services that the Borough provides in non-parished (generally urban) areas and therefore parishes should be recompensed so that they do not pay twice for the same service – that is, "double-taxation" through Council Tax and, separately, through local Precept for the same service. In Boughton Malherbe this funding contributes towards our Village Hall, Entertainment, Village Green maintenance, Grass Cutting, etc.)

On Monday 24^{th} September, Robert and Ron and I met with John Littlemore, Head of Housing and Community Services (whose team will hold responsibility for the scheme once finalised) to see just exactly what was on offer. The answer was - very little. Under the proposed Parish Services scheme, each Parish Council would have to engage in individual negotiation with MBC for access to funds held by the various MBC line-managers; there would be no fund dedicated to Parishes. In its budget estimates, MBC has made no allowance for the 2013/14 impact of parishes bidding against non-parishes areas (and, indeed, against each other) for funding from those line-managers. MBC intends to save all of the remaining Concurrent Functions Grant (a total in the region of £303K) and just let Parishes and non-parished areas compete between themselves, within an overall services budget reduced by that £303K. Boughton Malherbe Parish Council is a member of Kent Association of Local Councils (KALC) which, over the past two years, sought to find reasonable accommodation with the Cabinet Member on this matter, but has been continually rebuffed; the Cabinet Member is not for turning.

Differential Rating: A radically different approach would be to establish a separate rating system for parishes, recognising that parishes fund, through Precept, some local services that the Borough provides in non-parished areas. That would mean that Council Tax for parishes would be at a reduced level, taking account of the fact that parishes only absorb certain elements of Borough services, but recognising that parishes must play their part in keeping the overall standards and central services of the overall Borough at an acceptable level. That reduced Council Tax would probably be balanced by an increase in Parish Precept so that locally provided services would be maintained without any support from the Borough.

To establish the level of support for such an approach, the 1972 Local Government Act defines a mechanism that would require MBC to hold a referendum within a Parish, if requested by that Parish Council. That mechanism could be used in a coordinated manner by all Parish Councils within the Borough to assess the level of local support for differential rating.

Petition: Maidstone KALC have advised and requested its member Parish Councils each to initiate a petition that would then be collated and presented to MBC's full

Council at the earliest opportunity. That would call upon MBC either to turn away from abolition of the Concurrent Functions Grant scheme or, alternatively, to establish a new, lower rating system for Parishes to reflect their lesser absorption of MBC's services.

Boughton Malherbe Parish Council strongly supports the approach outlined above and will soon be circulating a Petition for you to sign and show your support. Grafty Gourmet

For all of you chocolate lovers out there, this is an amazing version of the classic chocolate brownie. You will notice, that there is no flour used! Another very simple recipe for you to try. Once you have made this, you will make it over and over again.

Chocolate Brownie with Hot Chocolate Sauce

For the brownie

- 1. Preheat the oven to 170°C. Melt the chocolate and butter gently over a low heat in a heavy-based saucepan.
- 2. Take the pan off the heat, mix in the vanilla and sugar, and let it cool a little.
- 3. Beat the eggs into the pan along with the ground almonds and chopped walnuts. Turn into a 24cm square baking tin or, use a foil one as its easier to turn out when cooked.
- 4. Bake in the oven for 25-30 minutes, by which time the top will have set but the mixture will still be gooey and runny. Do not cook for longer, even if it appears that it is not cooked. Once cooled, cut carefully, four down, four across, into 16 squares.

For the sauce

75g dark chocolate (minimum 70% cocoa solids)
125ml double cream
2 teaspoons espresso coffee (or 2 tablespoons camp coffee)
2 tablespoons water
1 tablespoons Golden syrup

- 1. Break up the chocolate and put into a heavy-based saucepan. Add the remaining ingredients, then place the pan over a gentle heat and let everything melt together.
- 2. Once everything has melted, stir well, take off the heat and pour into a jug to serve with the brownie. Add a little ice cream for an extra treat.

What's the difference between Download and View?

When receiving attachments in email

A question asked frequently and it is important to know the difference, especially if you want to find the document in the future.

Note: The images are created when using Internet Explorer® with Btinternet®, so other browsers like Google® and other applications like Hotmail®, may have different images, but the questions and responses will be the same or very similar.

We all do it, when we receive an email with an attachment we click on the paperclip or attachment. Then we are then asked to Continue or Cancel, so we Continue



Then another message appears asking us to Open or Save.



<u>View</u> - If you select <u>Open</u> this will open the document into the application that the document was created in, like Word, so you can see it. You can also print it and edit it if you need to. This does not add the document to your computer and any changes you make will be lost. If you close the document it will still be available in the email, unless you delete your emails, BUT it will **not be saved** on your computer to be found again in the future.

So Open is Viewing what you have been sent.

<u>Download</u> – If you select Save, it will save the document onto your computer, in some versions of windows it will be saved in the My Documents or My Pictures folder, depending on the type of attachment received. In Windows 7® it will save in the Downloads folder, so you could move this to a folder more relevant to you or just leave it there.



So **Save** is **Downloading** the document on to your computer so it can be found later for re-printing and editing etc.

You will notice that Save has two more options available in the dropdown list:

<u>Save As:</u> Which will take you directly to the folders to save the document where you would like to find it in the future, so by-passing the My Documents and Download folder stage above.

<u>Save and Open</u>: Saves the document to Download, My Documents or My Pictures (like Save) and Opens the document for you to view it all in one action.



The October Night Sky

The **Sun** is in the constellation of Virgo throughout October. **British Summer Time** ends on 28th October, when clocks should be put back one hour.

New Moon occurs on Monday 15th October, and **Full Moon** is on Monday 29th October.

Mercury is at its greatest elongation east of the Sun on 26th October, so we will not be able to see this elusive little planet this month.

Venus is rising in the northeast in the early hours, and by dawn the brilliant "Morning Star" will be well up in the south-eastern sky. Relative to the stars, it is moving rapidly south-eastwards out of Leo and into the constellation of Virgo. Again very little detail can be seen through a telescope apart from a rather featureless white disc.

Mars is very low in the western sky at dusk, and throughout October sets only a little over an hour after sunset. Again it will be difficult to see in the twilight.

Jupiter rises in the northeast in the early evening, and is high in the south-western sky at dawn. Only **Venus**, which is lower and to the left, outshines **Jupiter**. Relative to the stars it is almost stationary in the constellation of Taurus. Through a telescope you may be able to see the dark and light bands, and some of Jupiter's four major moons.

Saturn is in superior conjunction (almost directly behind the Sun) on 13th October, and therefore will not be visible this month.

This month there are two meteor showers; the better known one is called the **Orionid.** This will be active during the second half of the month and will peak on 21st October, and appear to radiate from the constellation of Orion. The second one is called the **Draconids**, which will appear to radiate from the constellation of Draco, and will be visible for a few days earlier in the month.

Last month I reported on Nasa's Curiosity Rover, which successfully landed on Mars. I will endeavour to keep you up to date as it roams over the planet.

This month, however, I thought I must briefly mention Voyager 1. This is a space craft launched by Nasa 35 years ago. Voyager 1 is about to move beyond the confines of our solar system and into interstellar space, followed by its sister craft, Voyager 2. During its journey it took spectacular images of the planets, and it is now about 11 billion miles from Earth, hurtling away at a rate of eight miles per second. This is an important milestone in human history as it is the first time an ambassador for mankind moves outside our solar system.


