PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

The Parish Council had some difficult budget decisions this year due to rising prices, increasing demand for services and Somerset Council's financial challenges. However, mindful of the impact of rising costs on all of our purses, the Parish Council has kept the increase as low as possible.

Priority areas agreed by councillors are investment in public spaces and facilities for young people. The budget this year includes \pounds 6,000 to pay for minor works to roadsides and footpaths, such as clearing debris and removing excessive foliage, a \pounds 10,000 contribution to the new Skate Park (which will be added to the fantastic \pounds 168,000 raised by volunteers), and further investments for young people in Stoke, including over £11,000 for the purchase loan and maintenance of the building used by HYFC, and a further £2,196 for Youth Service provision (comparable with Norton). Stoke Parish Council also invests in young people through the maintenance and upkeep of three play areas and two recreation grounds and an outdoor gym at an annual cost of £13,000.

In 2024/5, a band D property will see £1 month, or £12 per annum added to the Parish Council share of the overall council tax bill. The full budget is available on the Council website at www.stokesubhamdoncouncil.com

Following extensive liaison, Avon and Somerset Police have given the go-ahead to the Community Speedwatch Scheme. So far two sites have been approved at the Stanchester end of the village. We are now working to enhance the scheme with additional sites at West Street and North Street. We are now actively seeking additional volunteers - Without you the scheme can't work. Please contact Cllr Mike Foley or Cllr Graham Middleton, or visit www.avonandsomerset.police.uk/apply/communityspeedwatch/ . Thanks also to Mrs Lyn Foley and the "20 is plenty" campaign.

Those of you dismayed that the Fleur remains vacant may take comfort that the Parish Council has applied to register it as an Asset of Community Value (ACV). The ACV scheme is designed to help communities protect their local assets, and Cllr Moira Hulett has further details.

Your Parish Council is here to represent the whole village. Please do get in touch with any of your councillors if you would like to know more about our role in the village.
