

Clerks Report for the Uffington Parish Council Annual Meeting Monday 9th June 2025.

I am pleased to be able to report the following;

Residents Correspondence:

The council was notified of several successful and attempted break-ins to vehicles and premises. Notices were made requesting any residents affected should contact the police and provide all relevant details.

Burial Ground:

The burial plan and list have now been updated and placed on display in the Burial Ground notice board.

Defibrillators:

None of the units have required use and are all available for use.

Fix My Street:

There were no new reports made via the 'Fix My Street' platform during the month of May.

S Jenkins has completed the initial stage of training as a 'Super User' and is expected to complete the process during June 2025.

General:

Following the Uffington Parish Council Annual Meeting all relevant documentation has been completed and lodged with the relevant District Council departments. All new councillors have been provided with uffington.net email addresses and access to the Scribe accounting system.

Dates for Uffington Parish Council meetings have been booked at the Thomas Hughes Memorial Hall.

The planned Vale of White Horse District Council IT project is now underway and access to district data services is currently limited until completion of the project.

The agreed amendments to the TSB mandate are currently in process.

Following receipt of the insurance renewal quotation from Clear Councils, as agreed at the Uffington Parish Council Annual Meeting this policy has been renewed.

All documents required for the Annual Governance and Accountability Report (AGAR) have been submitted to the external auditor and the Notice of Public Rights has been published.

The domain name request of uffingtonpc.oxon.gov.uk has been made and the clerk has been advised that the approval process can take between 6-8 weeks. Development of the new website has started with the supplier (Hugo Fox) making no charges until the site is published.

Correspondence has been completed for OCC Highways to consider expediting repairs to the public footpath linking Broad Street and Chapel Lane.

Invoicing for the 2025/6 Courier publications has commenced.

Following a test of the batteries for the older model SID's it was found to be necessary that a replacement was needed. A more 'user friendly' updated model battery has been replaced which will have a longer life expectancy.
