Chair's Update

Coming up to Christmas we had a spike of criminal activity and anti-social behaviour in the village. I attend regular meetings with the police and SDC. However, unless crimes are reported to 101 there is nothing that can be done. So rather than having a rant on social media about things that have happened please take the time



to ring 101. If you think you know who is responsible then contact 101 and ask to speak to our PCSOs and they will contact you directly.

If you are reluctant to phone 101 there are other ways of reporting crimes.



The easy way to report a crime, incident or noninjury collision in minutes. Go to www.kent.police.uk/reportYou will receive your confirmation email and reference number immediately. See page 31 for more details.

The Country Eye app is now available to download for free on iPhone and Android. A few simple steps can make a difference. Snap a photo of the suspicious behaviour, incidents or concerns. State where you are or use your phone's built in GPS location.





Crimestoppers are an CRIMESTOPPERS independent charity helping law 0800 555 111 enforcement to locate criminals and help solve crimes. You don't have to give them your name or any of your

personal details. They do not trace calls or track IP addresses. All information given to Crimestoppers remains completely anonymous.

The Parish Council has upgraded its CCTV system which now includes a vehicle number plate recognition camera. These have already been helpful in the arrest of some youngsters causing distress with antisocial behaviour.

Since the last newsletter there has been a large planning application under consideration to develop another 35 homes on the Ryewood estate. Like us all, I thought it would have been nice to have the promised medical centre but that was always out of the hands of the Parish Council or Berkeley Homes. If permission is granted for the new application, the Parish Council will be delighted that 40% of the new development will be affordable shared ownership housing which allows those who are priced out of the local property market to get a step onto the local property ladder.

As any of you who either live or visit the Ryewood estate will know, parking has been an issue. Cont...

....Chair's Update



Following some initial comments, including those from DGPC, there has been an amendment to the latest application to include an additional 6 parking spaces. Still too few when the whole estate is taken into consideration



and the Parish Council will continue to seek as much parking as possible with any new homes in the village, not just Ryewood.

The latest Council Tax bills will be arriving soon. The Parish Council precept is a tax charged on each property in the parish to fund all the activities that the council undertakes for the benefit of the community. It is part of the charges that make up your Council Tax bill. DGPC recently carried out a detailed analysis of our projected income and expenditure taking into account future projects and activities including an additional member of staff, continued financial support of



youth and older people's activities and improvements to storage available at the Pavilion. A draft budget for 2018/19 was prepared by the Clerk and a 3.0% increase in the Parish Council Precept, based upon the ONS inflation forecast, was suggested. The Parish Council agreed to this

increase for 2018/19 which equates to an increase in real terms of £2.93 per Band D household for the year.

The other charges included in your Council Tax are also proposed to increase. Kent County Council by 4.99%, Kent Police by 7.83%, Kent Fire and Rescue Service by 2.95% and Sevenoaks District Council by 2.97%.



Can you do the Digital Sunset Challenge?



Government Minister helps young people turn off their phones

Around 2,000 local school children took part in a challenge to turn off their phones and devices in the evening before they go to bed.

Government Minister, Sajid Javid MP, launched the Digital Sunset Challenge on 5 February at Sevenoaks Primary School with the help of Year 6 pupils a day before National Safer Internet Day. The scheme encourages young people to switch off their electronic devices before bedtime to help develop a lifetime of good digital habits.



We all know mobile phones and other devices offer great opportunities for learning, creativity and, above all, having fun. But there's huge pressure on young people to stay connected online at all times.

Using their devices before bed or having a smartphone in the bedroom has been shown to disrupt sleep, making it much harder to develop and learn.

The scheme invites school children and their families to put smart phones away early in the evening and, during the Challenge week, make a note of the time they stopped using their devices, when they went to bed and how they felt the next day.



The Community Safety Manager, PCSOs and Community Warden attended assemblies at 19 participating schools taking part in the Digital Sunset Challenge. The assemblies were fun and engaging and the schools rolled it out across the whole school. One school delivered in house. The primary schools that took part were:-


Tackling Burglary in the District

A number of people have been arrested for separate burglary offences in just over a month as officers in West Kent continue to disrupt and deter criminals in the area.

Since mid-December 2017, officers have made arrests in an effort to prevent residents becoming victims of burglaries, with examples of enforcement including **Freddie Webb** of Worthing, West Sussex, was arrested on **Friday 29 December 2017** and charged with a burglary in **Sevenoaks**. He was remanded in custody and will appear at Maidstone Crown Court on Monday 18 June.

Four men from Sidcup and Dartford were arrested after a car was stolen from an address in **Hextable** on **Monday 18 December**. All four were bailed to return to the police station on Thursday 15 February.

Chief Inspector Tony Dyer, District Commander for Sevenoaks and Swanley, said: 'Our officers have been alert to the activities of local burglars and travelling criminals and have been patrolling at all hours to counter the threat they pose.



'Where suspects have been charged, our investigators have sought to remand them to prison to await their court case, where the grounds exist. However, we are not complacent and are determined to protect our communities from offenders as best we can in forthcoming weeks. We would ask residents to assist us by keeping doors and windows secure, keeping car keys away from the front door of the house overnight and alerting us on 101 or 999 if they see anybody acting suspiciously.'





DĞPC Comment Only- Having deliberated, the Parish Council can neither support nor object to the application but wishes to make comments about concerns that it has in two key areas: the ratio of affordable housing across the full Ryewood development and parking across the development. This proposal does incorporate 40% affordable housing. Whilst this is commendable, the Parish Council would have liked to have seen a much higher proportion in this application to go some way to redressing the reduced allocation (20%) of affordable housing that was negotiated for the rest of the development on the grounds that it was uneconomic to provide 40% across the development. When the District is crying out for smaller, affordable homes this was an opportunity to make a more significant contribution towards affordable housing stock. With regard to parking, this new proposal does go beyond the unrealistically low parking allocations that must be met by the developer. However, there are already significant issues on the development in relation to the lack of parking provided and a scheme to provide more parking for the current development would have been welcomed.

AMENDED PARISH CONSULTATION Amended plans showing an increase in the

number of parking spaces and an updated ecology survey work.

DGPC-Object plus Comments: Whilst the Parish Council accepts that parking provision for this application has been increased (as a response, presumably, to the high volume of comments and concerns raised in relation to the original version of this application), there is still an acute shortage of parking provision across the development as a whole. The Parish Council would like to see further parking increases to help alleviate the constraints already affecting current residents of Ryewood.

Demolition of existing wall. Erection of a single storey rear extension, loft conversion to the side/middle. Erection of new wall and relocation of side gate. Alterations to fenestration. DGPC-Support

The condition regarding the garage and that it be kept for parking at all times was imposed for a good reason. Permission granted for a new crossover does not negate this parking need nor does it override the original concerns or reasons for this condition. SE/17/03947/HOUSE The Coach House London Road

DO YOU REALLY NEED TO GO TO A&E?

As well as living in Dunton Green, I work locally within the NHS. It will come as no surprise to readers that the winter is a particularly difficult time: resources are stretched, we have an ageing population, cold weather exacerbates various conditions and there are even more falls when it is icy outside.



During the period between Christmas and the

New Year, I went and worked alongside clinical colleagues within our A&E department. I wanted to learn more about what goes on, to lend a hand and to talk to members of staff about their experiences at this time of year.

It was a fascinating experience and I very much appreciated the chance to better understand the issues.



One thing that stood out immediately was just how busy members of staff were dealing with the sheer number of people in attendance. Most certainly, a considerable number were ill enough to need emergency treatment, but from my discussions with staff, a fair few simply did not need to be there.

There are various other avenues for situations that are not an emergency or the kind of accident that merits a visit to A&E. You can look up the alternatives, using your post-code: https://:www.nhs.uk/pages/home.aspx

Some useful tips are:

Talk to your local Pharmacist (you can find out which ones are open late on



the internet)

Book an appointment at your GP surgery which might be with a practice nurse, not necessarily a doctor.



When it's not an emergency and it's out-of-hours for your GP surgery but you need medical help more urgently, you can dial 111, rather than 999 - you will be assessed, given advice and directed straightaway to the local service that can help you best

There are Urgent Care Centres at:

- ⇒ Sevenoaks Hospital
- ⇒ Edenbridge War Memorial Hospital
- ⇒ Queen Mary's Hospital in Sidcup

A little further a-field, there is White Horse Surgery & Walk-in Centre, off Vale Road in Northfleet which may well be considerably less busy than A&E and a Minor Injuries Unit at Gravesend Hospital.

If each of us does what we can to use the different parts of the NHS system as appropriately and effectively as possible, I know first-hand just how grateful the staff, and patients with genuine emergencies who need to be seen in A&E, will all be.

ABANDONED VEHICLE?

If you believe a vehicle has been abandoned in Dunton Green please report it to Sevenoaks District Council in the first instance on 01732 227000.



They will then follow the procedures outlined below:

Sevenoaks District Council, as an enforcing authority, has powers to deal with abandoned vehicles as set out in various pieces of legislation.

The Council has responsibility for investigating any reported abandoned vehicles within its area - even those on private land. However, in certain circumstances SDC may not be able to remove them.

When SDC receives reports, the first thing they do is check with the DVLA to see if the vehicle is taxed or declared SORN (has a Statutory Off Road Notice). They also check with the police to see if they have any interest in the vehicle. An officer from Sevenoaks District Council may then inspect the vehicle to see if, in their opinion, it appears to be abandoned. They will take various things into consideration when reaching that decision including whether the vehicle is taxed or declared SORN, its condition (e.g. are the tyres flat, has it been





If the vehicle is not taxed, is on the Highway and the officer considers it appears to have been abandoned, they will affix a notice to it giving the keeper 7 days to tax or remove it. If there is no contact from the keeper and it is still there after 7 days and has not been taxed, the Council can have the vehicle removed. However, if a keeper comes forward and states that

the vehicle is not abandoned, then the Council has no legal powers to remove it. This then becomes an enforcement issue for the DVLA to deal with.

If the vehicle is not taxed and has not been declared SORN and is on private land without the landowner's permission and the officer considers it may have been abandoned, they will affix a notice giving the keeper 15 days to remove the vehicle. If there is no contact from the keeper and it is still there after 15 days, the Council can have the vehicle removed providing the landowner agrees to this. However, if the keeper comes forward and states the vehicle has not been abandoned, then the Council has no legal powers to remove it. This would then become a private matter for the owner of the land to deal with.

If the vehicle is taxed on the Highway or on private land in addition to putting a notice on the vehicle, the Council will formally write to the keeper on record.

If the vehicle has been declared SORN and is on private land, then the Council has no legal powers to remove it as abandoned.



Dunton Green Parish Council currently has a number of vacancies.

Councillors have three main components to their work:

1. Decision making


Through meetings and attending committees with other elected members, councillors decide which activities to support, where money should be spent, what services should be delivered and what policies should be implemented.

2. Monitoring

Councillors make sure that their decisions lead to efficient and effective services by keeping an eye on how well things are working.

3. Getting involved locally

As local representatives, councillors have responsibilities towards their constituents and local organisations. These responsibilities and duties often depend on what the councillor wants to achieve and how much time is available.



To be qualified to be co-opted to a parish council a person must be 21 years of age or

over, and a British subject or citizen of the Republic of Ireland, and either: Be a local government elector of the parish,

or have during the whole of the twelve months preceding the day on which s/he is nominated as a candidate occupied as owner or tenant any land or other premises in the parish;

or her/his principal or only place of work in the twelve months preceding the day on which s/he is nominated as a candidate have been in the area of the parish; or have resided either in the parish or within 3 miles thereof during the whole of the 12 months preceding the day on which s/he is nominated as a candidate.


- the date and time of the crime/incident

Currently it is not possible to upload attachments, this function will be introduced later. There are separate sections within the form for you to add the different information required at this stage.


Once submitted, you'll receive a reference number and a copy of your report (if selected). Please note this service is not to be used for emergencies—that is still 999.

IN CASE OF EMERGENCY: Did you know...

- ⇒ That if you call 112 from a MOBILE phone instead of 999 the emergency services will have a clearer picture of where you are if you need help?
- ⇒ That you can call 999 from ANY phone even mobiles without a SIM card and you will get through?
- ⇒ That we already have TWO Public Access Defibrillators in Dunton Green? One is located on the outside of the Pavilion building in the recreation ground and the other is outside The Bed Post on the shopping parade. DGPC also has plans to install a third later this year outside the Village Hall. ANYONE can use these in case of emergency and they will only work if they are needed - you can't electrocute yourself or anyone else!
